



August Bucket List


FOR PEOPLE IN THE BREEDING and racing industries, but especially for New York stakeholders, August is very special. The Saratoga race meet—unpredictable, dramatic, and thrilling from end to end—is starting to swing into full gear, the Fasig-Tipton yearling sales are right around the corner, and industry leaders and others are taking advantage of multiple opportunities to meet face-to-face to discuss and plan strategies that will sustain positive trends and address challenges ahead.

- In the spirit of boundless possibilities and feeling of infectious optimism that belongs to this time of year, I have compiled a "list" of things I would most like to see come to pass on the New York breeding and racing scene in the near and far term.
- New York taking a further leadership role in aftercare. Industry stakeholders have been meeting for some time to address the all-important issue of taking care of our equine athletes after their racing careers. Nothing would make me happier than to have NYTB be a partner in helping the New York breeding and racing program set an industry-wide standard for strategies of placing our horses in new careers, new homes, and new lives.
- A New York-bred yearling market that stays strong and steady. I don't know if we can continue to expect the dramatic year-overyear gains we've seen for four years now, but it seems highly unlikely that we will lose any significant ground in the near term. In fact, with current demand and a slightly smaller catalog for the 2015 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale, I'd like to see progress on the clearance rate. I also think the market still has room for growth at the very top end.

Wouldn't it be nice to get a seven-figure yearling at the New York-bred sale?

- The outlines of NYRA's long-term future following the era of the state-controlled "Reorganization Board" needs resolution. For breeders and owners to continue to feel confident investing in New York-breds, we need definition to the "new" new NYRA, and the sooner this is resolved the better. Pressing issues include race days, workers' compensation, winter racing, redevelopment of Aqueduct and/or Belmont Park, long-term capital plans for Saratoga Race Course, NYRA's role in New York City OTB ventures, expanding a NYRA-owned or -partnered national ADW platform, and a look at the role of big "Event Days" in the context of a year-round racing program.
- A resolution of the Lago casino issue in western New York that will protect Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack in the long term. It is essential that the Farmington racetrack purse account and contributions to the Breeding Fund be held "harmless," no matter the outcome of the location controversy.
- By the same token, I want to see decisive steps taken toward addressing the long-term problems of declining attendance, field size, and, subsequently, handle at Finger Lakes. Additionally, the most strategic element would be the installation of a turf course, which would increase field size and make the racing product more attractive to horsemen and horseplayers. This would raise the profile of the racetrack immeasurably.

I look forward to seeing many of you in the days and weeks ahead at the track, the sales, and elsewhere and, as always, I welcome your input with *your* "list." A

NY-Bred Yearlings Hot Items at July Sale

New York-breds got a warm reception at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July selected yearling sale July 9 at the company's Newtown Paddock site near Lexington.

All nine New York-bred yearlings offered at the sale were reported as sold, topped by a colt from the first crop of New York-based sire Mission Impazible that fetched \$155,000, and the group as a whole outperformed the average and median of the sale overall.

The seven colts and two fillies aver-

aged a heady \$99,000, with a \$92,000 median, bettering the overall sale that posted a \$97,585 average and \$77,000 median.

Bred by Twin Creeks Farm & Sequel Thoroughbreds and consigned by Sequel Stallions New York, agent, the Mission Impazible colt (Hip 289) is a gray/roan youngster foaled March 25, 2014. Out of Deputy Reality, an unplaced daughter of Deputy Minister purchased by Twin Creeks Farm for \$225,000 at the 2012

Keeneland November sale, the colt is a half brother to Dwyer Stakes (gr. II) winner Teeth of the Dog (by Bluegrass Cat). The colt's second dam is graded stakes performer and stakes winner Halo Reality. Empire Racing was the winning bidder.

Mission Impazible, who stands at Sequel, is a multiple grade II-winning millionaire by Unbridled's Song who was campaigned by Twin Creeks Racing Stables.

Oaks-Winning Temper Mint Patty Sells for \$350,000

Temper Mint Patty, recent runaway winner of the New York Oaks at Finger Lakes Gaming & Raceway, topped Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's summer selected horses of racing age sale July 9, which was conducted after its July select yearling sale. The 3-year-old daughter of Congrats sold for \$350,000.

A late addition to the horses of racing age sale and the final horse to go through the auction ring (Hip 524), Temper Mint Patty sold when hammered down to Mike Repole. The 3-year-old filly recorded her second stakes victory July 3 for owner Mark Stanley (see page 29). Last year Temper Mint Patty won Belmont Park's Joseph A. Gimma Stakes and has a 3-1-2 record from nine starts and has earned \$274,050.

Jacob West, acting as Repole's agent, said: "She's heading up to Saratoga and going to Todd (Pletcher). Mike was locked on her ever since they entered her in the sale. She's a New York-bred filly that he knows can go and compete in some New York-bred stakes."

Bred by Gallagher's Stud near Ghent, Temper Mint Patty is one of two winners out of stakes-winning turf router His Beauty, a Gallagher's Stud homebred, who is a daughter of graded stakes winner and \$435,597-earner Adcat, also a

product of Gallagher's breeding. Purchased by Becky Thomas at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton preferred New York yearling sale, Temper Mint Patty was acquired by Stanley last year as a Fasig-Tipton Florida March 2-year-old in training for \$95,000.

First Winners for Here Comes Ben, D' Funnybone, and Dublin

Three New York-based first-crop sires got their first winners recently:

Here Comes Ben's first winner came in the form of Bill Stivers' Here Comes Gwen, who won a \$20,000 maiden claiming event at Prairie Meadows July 2 for trainer Brian Stivers. The chestnut filly was bred in Kentucky by Charles Lo-Presti (the trainer of two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan). Here Comes Gwen was a \$6,500 Keeneland September sale yearling.

Here Comes Ben stands at McMahon

of Saratoga Thoroughbreds near Saratoga Springs. The 9-year-old son of Street Cry—Chasetheragingwind, by Dayjur, stood the 2015 breeding season for \$7,500.

Uno Emayo, winner of a \$60,000 maiden special weight July 11 at Belmont Park, was the first winner for **D' Funnybone**. Bred in New York by Glasscock Financial Services, Uno Emayo was a \$30,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. August sale yearling, and he races for Carl Lizza Racing Stables and trainer Rudy Rodriguez.

By D'wildcat—Elbow, by Woodman, D' Funnybone stood the 2015 season for \$2,500 at Rockridge Stud near Hudson.

Dr Blarney won his July 12 debut, a \$30,000 maiden claiming race, to become the first winner for **Dublin**. Dr Blarney was bred in Massachusetts by Joseph Di-Rico and races for Alfred DiRico. He is trained by Thomas S. McCooev Jr.

Dublin, by Afleet Alex out of the Storm Bird mare Classy Mirage, is at Keane Stud Operations near Amenia. His 2015 fee was \$6,500.

CONGAREE TO LANE'S END TEXAS

Multiple grade I winner Congaree will stand the 2016 breeding season at William S. Farish's Lane's End Texas near Hempstead.

Congaree is a son of champion Arazi out of the grade I-placed Mari's Book mare Mari's Sheba. Congaree's half brother, Sangaree, is a grade I-placed stakes winner who stands in Indiana.

Congaree has stood in New York since 2010 when he was moved from Kentucky to Highcliff Stallions. The last two seasons he stood at Saratoga Stud.

He was bred and campaigned by Texans Bob and Janice McNair's Stonerside Stable and is still owned by the couple.

Trained by Bob Baffert, Congaree earned \$3,267,490 and won five grade I races. He finished third in both the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I) during his 3-year-old season.

Congaree has sired the earners of more than \$15.5 million, with 16 stakes winners. Among his progeny are grade I-winning millionaires Jeranimo and Don't Tell Sophia. The latter is out of a daughter of Valid Expectations, Texas' all-time leading stallion who stood at Lane's End Texas until being retired from stud duty in 2013.

Henry Lindh Dies at 84

Henry Colwell Beadleston Lindh, breeder and owner of multiple graded stakes-winning New York-bred millionaire Grecian Flight, died in New York City July 3.

Lindh was a graduate of Yale College, receiving a degree in economics in 1952. He also received an MBA from Columbia Business School. After service with the United States Army Audit Agency during the Korean War, Lindh joined Price Waterhouse, becoming a certified public accountant. This was followed by a 35-year career on Wall Street, including being a member of the New York Stock Exchange.


Grecian Flight, a daughter of Cormorant foaled in 1984 out of multiple black-type producer Green Greek, was the most successful product of Lindh's breeding program. Grecian Flight won 21 of 40 starts, including 14 stakes races. At 3 she took the 1987 Acorn Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont Park and the Black-Eyed Susan Stakes (gr. II) at Pimlico. She retired with \$1,320,215 in earnings. Her half sister Grecian Comedy, also bred and campaigned by Lindh, was a 12-time stakes winner.

Lindh was a member of the Thoroughbred Club of America, the Turf & Field Club, and the National Steeplechase Association and served as treasurer of the National Horse Show and a trustee of its foundation.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Powers Lindh; son, Andrew Seton Post Lindh; daughter, Jennifer Davis Lindh, and four grand-children. Contributions may be made to The Huguenot Society of America, 20 West 44 St., New York, NY 10036.

Effinex Takes Grade II Suburban

New York-bred Effinex put in a star-spangled effort July 4 in the \$490,000 Suburban Handicap (gr. II), topping classic winner Tonalist by a head going 11/4 miles. Bred and raced by Dr. Russell Cohen's Tri Bone Stables, the son of Mineshaft out of the stakes-winning E Dubai mare What a Pear, got the trip in 2:01.55 under Junior Alvarado.

The win was a major turnaround from his last start in the June 6 Brooklyn Invitational (gr. II) when he bolted to the outside rail on the far turn and was eased.

Trainer Jimmy Jerkens added a different

Courageous Cat **Gets First SW**

School Board Prez, a dark bay or brown 2-year-old filly by Courageous Cat, jumpstarted her sire's stud career July 25 by giving him both his first progeny winner and first stakes winner after defeating 10 rivals in the \$75,000 Miss Ohio Stakes at Thistledown Racetrack in her debut.

Trained by Doug Matthews, ridden by Jerome Lermyte, School Board Prez, was sent off at 5-2 and justified the support with a professional and determined performance in the 51/2-furlong tilt.

Grade I winner and millionaire Courageous Cat, a 9-year-old son of Storm Cat, is out of multiple grade I winner Tranquility Lake and a full brother to multiple grade I winner and sire After Market. Courageous Cat entered stud at Lane's End in 2012. He relocated in 2013 to Questroyal North near Stillwater. By Sarah Mace bit for the Suburban and the 4-year-old colt responded with a game victory over last year's Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner.

Earlier in the year Effinex showed his mettle against open company in winning the Excelsior Stakes (gr. III). The winner of last year's Empire Classic now has six wins from 16 starts and has earned \$782,250.





Smaller book, demand fuel positive expectations for New York-bred preferred sale



THE MARKET FOR NEW YORK-BRED racing prospects has continued on its steady rise through the early stages of 2015 with strong showings during the 2-year-old selling season and the initial yearling sale July 9 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale in Lexington. There's little reason to believe the market will do anything but advance during its main event, Fasig-Tipton Saratoga's sale of preferred New York-breds Aug. 15-16 at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs.

Touching base with consignors in the region, and some from Kentucky who will have yearlings on offer, the mood is certainly upbeat. It's hard to imagine the results not progressing from last year's figures that produced a record average, \$80,108, and median, \$65,000, while selling 176 horses.

"This year will be interesting to see how our momentum is carried," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Throughbred Breeders. "It's gone on for several years in a row. Last year the sale's average was up 11% from the year before. The median rose as well. When your average is \$80,000 and your median is \$65,000, it's a very, very good market."

Joe McMahon's McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds has 16 yearlings consigned to this year's sale. The man whose family has been selling yearlings in New York for as long as anyone can remember sums up the situation preceding the 2015 sale pretty well:

"We've had a very active breeding season, and we drew interest from breeders from all over the country, and I think the other farms saw the same thing, so that was a good sign," he said. "The 2-year-old sales were good, especially for New York-breds, so that was a pretty good sign. The yearling sale in Kentucky (Fasig-Tipton July) was good for New York-breds—they held up pretty well—so looking at those things I'd say the sale should be a good yearling sale."


For last year's sale 316 yearlings were cataloged, which was a rise of 5% over the 2013 sale. The numbers have been scaled back for this year's sale with 284 making the catalog—a drop of 10.1%.

The smaller catalog is just fine with Craig Bandoroff of Denali Stud, who has 25 yearlings consigned to the two-night sale. The Kentucky horseman has been selling New York-breds for some time and has a solid roster of New York clients such as Berkshire Stud, Edition Farm, Gallagher's Stud, and Stepwise Farm.

"They tightened it down," said Bandoroff. "The criteria is stiffer this year; it raises the bar for everybody. This year I think they (Fasig-Tipton) said we're only taking as many horses as we have stalls for. That's a good decision to put just the horses that belong in a select sale in front of the people.

"I think the bar used to be a little lower for the New York-breds, but that's not the case now. We have several statebreds that didn't meet the bar, and we'll have to take them somewhere else."

One would assume consignors would not be in favor of having fewer horses

in a sale, but across the board they all agree that a smaller book with stringent demands on the physical and the catalog page is a benefit to buyer, seller, and sale company.

"I think last year it was hard finding a buyer for every horse," said Derek MacKenzie of Vinery Sales, which has 22 yearlings in the catalog. "Our consignment is pretty close to what we had last year, but this year, with a reduction of numbers, I think New York will go well."

Vinery sells for a wide array of clients and has three this year for Patty Lovelle's Windhorse Thoroughbreds, a growing operation near Middleburg.

McMahon believes this year's offerings is the right number.

"To me, to sell more than what they have this year during a two-day is tough on people," he said. "The sales area is crowded. It is a beautiful sales area but there is not a lot of space to show horses, so that enters into it a little bit.

"Fasig has been very hard on the selection process, perhaps harder than ever," he continued. "They've taken the best horse regardless of where they've come from."

And the buyers are demanding the best horses. As the New York-bred breeding program continues to prosper and purses continue to swell, the demand for a well-bred, well-conformed horse escalates.


"The program is, if not the top, certainly one of the best state-bred programs in the country," said Boyd Browning, president and CEO of Fasig-Tipton. "But what we've seen in recent years is that the quality of horses that are being offered in this sale and being bred in the state can compete anywhere in the world. It's no longer a restricted racing program sale; it offers quality horses that appeal to buyers throughout the United States. Each year we've seen the quality of horses improve, and I think we have a really strong group again in 2015."

Cannizzo is quick to point to the val-

ue of New York-breds on the racetrack on the New York Racing Association circuit.

"In 2014 New York-breds accounted for 54% of all the starts in New York and accounted for 34% of the starts at Saratoga alone and earned 26% of the available purse money," he said. "It's evident that if you are racing in New York, you have to have a few New York-breds. At Saratoga alone, New York-breds earned \$8.3 million in restricted earnings and an additional \$2.4 million in open company totaling \$10.7 million in purses."

There is plenty of sire power in this year's catalog. Over the last few years the Kentucky-based stallions have domi"There are more this year and it has to do with the fact there have been better stallions brought into the state in the last five years and some of them are doing pretty good," he said. "There is more interest in them. Those horses have a lot more value in terms of stallion stakes races; they're worth more; they're worth more in open company races with the owners' award."

McMahon stands Here Comes Ben at his farm and there are seven yearlings by him in the sale.

"His 2-year-olds sold well," McMahon said. "He's got two winners so far so he's doing what we thought he would do."

nated the selling, but this year there appears to be more presence by the top, proven New York sires such as Freud, Frost Giant, and Posse, and exciting upand-coming first-crop yearling sires that are based in New York such as Boys At Tosconova, Mission Impazible, Soaring Empire, and Smart Bid.

"A lot of people we sell for take advantage of what really is the best part of the program and that is the breed-back rule," said Bandoroff. "They let you go to other places and breed and come back to fulfill the residency rule. That separates New York from some of these other programs."

But McMahon is quick to point to there being a better representation of the New York-based sires in this sale. 14 yearlings in the sale. The first-year stallion had one yearling in the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale, and it sold for \$155,000—well above the \$97,585 average for the sale and the \$99,000 average for the nine New York-breds sold at that auction. That's an impressive figure off a \$7,500 initial stud fee.

"He's stamping his foals pretty good; they're good-bodied horses," said Molly Lightner of Sequel Stallions New York where Mission Impazible stands.

The son of Unbridled's Song—La Paz, by Hold Your Peace, was raced by Randy Gullatt and Steve Davison's Twin Creeks Racing Stables, and they've maintained a major position in the stallion. For his first breeding season Twin Creeks supported him with 21 Kentucky-based mares.

"You couldn't have a better support group than the Twin Creeks guys," Lightner said. "They are dead set on making him the leading first-crop sire, and they've put their money where their mouth is."

While Twin Creeks will send many homebreds to trainer Todd Pletcher, they are "showing him off" at the select sale.

Vinery will offer a pair of yearlings from first-crop sire Smart Bid (Smart Strike—Recording, by Danzig), who stands at Saratoga Stud near Stillwater.

"What we're seeing is an improvement of horses by New York stallions and outside-the-state stallions," Browning said. "There are more good reasons to stand a quality stallion in New York."

If there is any catch to the sale—and this has been pointed out at just about every open sale over the last few years—it is that there seems to be "more gravitation toward the very top of the market," according to McMahon. "It may be a little weaker for the fillies, which is a trend that seems to be prevalent in the last couple of years."

Regardless of that, all of the economic indicators for the sale seem to be pointing up, which is excellent for breeders and consignors and will have buyers checking and re-checking their valuations. Nary a consignor sees "exuberance" on the horizon, but hopefully a slow, steady advance in pricing.

"There's every reason to be optimistic," Bandoroff said. "We have a feel-good situation with (Triple Crown winner) American Pharoah. There's a little buzz in the game, and everybody who has been through the tough times is ready for a healthy market."

Browning agrees.

"Hopefully, we'll have a very prolonged effect as people have gotten enthusiastic and interested in the game. Hopefully, we're going to create some new fans and new participants as owners, as gamblers, as fans as a result of 'Pharoah phenomenon' but it would be shortsighted to think we're going to get a big bump in 2015. I don't think that it is realistic, but I do think it's been a very positive development for the Thoroughbred industry as a whole."

Seth Gregory's multifaceted participation in the Thoroughbred world has prepared him for his role as breeder **GROWING UP IN NEW YORK'S OTSEGO COUNTY**, in a small town called Garrattsville not far from Cooperstown, Seth Gregory took an unusual interest for a child in his mother's grocery shopping at the local Grand Union.

"They had this thing," he recently recalled, "where depending on how much money you spent, you got what was basically a tote ticket for the Sunday night races from Hialeah. My mother would go shopping and bring home these tickets for the television broadcast and you could actually win money off them."

Gregory didn't say whether he ever won any money off those tickets, but while any winnings would have been long gone by now, the interest in horse racing sparked from that promotion turned out to be far more lucrative, taking him from his parents' farm to his own, recently purchased in Galway, N.Y., not far from Saratoga, where he keeps his small broodmare band.

Now 43, Gregory didn't inherit his horse racing bug from his parents; they were dairy farmers, as was his grandfather, and while there were always horses on the farm, the family wasn't involved in racing or breeding.

"The first recollection I really have of watching racing was Pleasant Colony's run



at the Triple Crown" in 1981, he said, en route home to upstate New York from Lexington with a van of mares. "I was 8- or 9-years-old and the TV coverage wasn't that great. My first real look at racing was ABC's Wide World of Sports. You'd get the classics and the Arlington Million, and watching John Henry was always a big deal."

When it was time for college, Gregory headed first to the State University of New York at Oneonta, then detoured to Kentucky to work at Taylor Made Farm and Brookside Farm. After completing his studies in animal science at Cornell University, he took his newly minted

Ivy League degree straight to the backstretch to be a hotwalker, which was another detour of a sort.

"My goal wasn't to spend a lot of time at the track," Gregory admitted. "It was to go to Kentucky and become a farm manager."

But Gregory's stint at Allen Paulson's Brookside Farm coincided with Paulson's success with Cigar, which Gregory characterized in something of an understatement as "a fun introduction."

"So I stayed around a little while," he said, working in trainer Bill Mott's barn and heading to Dubai in 1996 for Cigar's Dubai World Cup victory, the horse's 14th win in a then-record-tying string of 16 in a row.

"My parents had been good enough to accept the path that I was taking," Gregory recalled with a laugh. "They said, 'Hopefully, it will work out.'

"And when the stakes check came from the Dubai World Cup, I paid off my student loans six months later—probably a lot faster than most kids."

By this time Gregory had already begun getting involved in other areas of the industry, buying what he called "cheap horses" and re-selling them. After working for Mott, Gregory moved to the barn

of Mark Hennig, which is where he got his first opportunity to get involved in breeding.

Working as Hennig's assistant, he "fell in love" with a filly named Won Perfect Rose, who ran twice for the barn before being transferred to another trainer.

"She was so much fun to be around," Gregory reminisced. "She was tiny, and her heart was bigger than she was."

When her short racing career came to an end in 1998, her owner gave the filly to Gregory, who brought his first broodmare home to his parents' dairy farm. Three years later, with the help of trainer Mike Hushion, he secured a stallion season with Barry Schwartz' graded stakes-placed Gold Token, breeding a horse whose racing career, along with his name, exemplified the opulence in his sire's name.

Running in the name of Gregory's father, Henry, Gold and Roses earned \$877,966 in a 45-race career that saw him win 10 races, among them multiple stakes, and finish second or third in 18 others.

Gregory used the gelding's purse earnings to purchase his second mare, Road to Mandalay, for \$25,000 at the 2005 Keeneland November sale of breeding

stock. The winner of the Remington Park Oaks in her final start in November 2004, she produced three six-figure winners, including Groupthink (by Majestic Warrior), a session-topper at \$220,000 at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton preferred New York-bred yearling sale.

A 2006 half sister to Groupthink, La Concerto, by Aptitude, sold for \$50,000 as a yearling and went on to earn nearly \$250,000; a stakes-placed 2007 half brother, Game Token, earned more than \$300,000.

Gregory, whose broodmare band numbers only a handful, breeds primarily to sell, though he will occasionally keep a horse to race. He has a 2-year-old Proud Citizen half brother to Gold and Roses in training and expects to sell two horses later this year.

A yearling colt by Algorithms out of Won Token, a full sister to Gold and Roses, will be sold at Fasig-Tipton's October sale while a colt by Hold Me Back out of the Thunder Gulch mare It'stimetotalk will head for the Fasig-Tipton Mid-Atlantic sale in October.

"Both are very late foals," Gregory explained. "One of them did get selected (for the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred sale), but I decided to wait until October to give him time to grow up. There's so much competition at

the Saratoga sale that late foals can get overlooked; you can get beat up pretty good if you have a foal that's a little behind the others."

In his almost 20 years as a breeder in the state, Gregory has seen the highs and lows of the New York-bred market, but he never, he said, considered getting out of it.

"I always had another job," he said. "I was an assistant trainer, and I could keep the mares at home with my father, so I had only feed and vet bills. But it's nice to see the business come back and continue to grow.

"Plus," he continued, "my operation

is so small that the lean years weren't that lean."

Though he was on track to establish his own training operation, Gregory left the backstretch after working for Hennig.

"I got tired of living out of a suitcase," he said. "And the business had changed so much—it had become basically two or three 'training corporations' that had 250 head of horses and assistants spread throughout the country. (Small trainers) likely have a handful of horses, and they don't get the best stock.

"Even if a young or even an established trainer gets a good horse, the owners think that the guy who developed the horse isn't good enough anymore, and the horse gets given to one of the 'corporations.'"

"I didn't want to be an assistant for the rest of my life," he continued, "so I made a career change."

A sales representative for Manhattanbased Skurnik Wines, Gregory spends most of his time upstate, heading to the city occasionally for meetings and tastings of the wines that he'll sell in his northern New York territory.

Gold and Roses, now 13, lives on Gregory's parents' farm, hanging out, said his owner, "with a bunch of Angus cows." He's been re-trained but is seldom ridden these days. He remains the star of Gregory's small breeding operation, though Gregory has watched as horses that he's bred and sold have gone on to make money for other people, through pinhooking or racing.

"An old farm manager in Kentucky, Henry White, who managed Plum Lane Farm," Gregory said, "used to say, 'Never be afraid to sell someone a good horse because they'll keep coming back looking.'"

"When mine go in the ring," Gregory continued, "I know what I've got into them, and I know what I'm willing to take, and I hope that someone wants to pay it."

And he has no regrets about the horses he's let go.

"There's nothing better," he said, "than seeing them make money."

A.P. Indy grandchildren sweep the New York Derby and Oaks **FORCE AND TEMPER MINT PATTY** took home the major spoils at Finger Lakes July 3 when they won the New York Derby and New York Oaks, respectively, but it was the legacy of A.P. Indy that also shared in the glory of the state-bred races. Both winners are by full brothers—Force is by Flatter, and Temper Mint Patty is by Congrats—by the 1992 Horse of the Year and two-time leading sire out of Praise, by Mr. Prospector.

Force, who races for John Oxley and trainer Mark Casse, was making his first foray against New York-breds in the \$160,750 Derby. The dark bay or brown colt made his first six starts while in Casse's West Coast string in Southern California and shipped to Finger Lakes off a third-place effort behind last year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) runner-up Commanding Curve in an allowance race May 30 at Churchill Downs.



Charging from just off the pace in the 1½6-mile Derby, Force topped Battle of Evermore by two lengths after getting the trip in 1:45.49.

The win, at 13-1 under jockey John Davila Jr., came at the expense of 3-5 favorite Ostrolenka, winner of the Mike Lee Stakes during the Showcase program at Belmont Park May 25, the first leg of the Big Apple Triple. After getting to the front after a half-mile in :47.36 and taking the field to the

sixteenth pole, he faded to finish fifth, beaten 10¼ lengths. Good Luck Gus, the Mike Lee runner-up and winner of last fall's New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes, finished fourth behind 63-1 shot Intelligence.

Force is the second stakes horse out of Forever Valentine. Her second foal, the Kentucky-bred Beau's Valentine, by Alphabet Soup, was third in the 2008 Adena Stallions' Miss Preakness Stakes (gr. III) for Sonia Chapman and trainer James Chapman. Forever Valentine's dam, Diamond Ruckus, is a full sister to grade III winner Katahaula County and to stakes winner Noise Enough, the dam of \$502,600-earner Miss Seffens, the dam of Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IIT) winner More Than Real.

Force was bred by Sequel Thoroughbreds and JMJ Racing Stables. Becky Thomas, principal owner of Sequel, purchased Forever Valentine (in foal with the Derby winner) for \$30,000 at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February mixed sale. Forever Valentine has a filly by Emcee at her side and has been bred to Alpha for 2016.

Casse signed the \$130,000 ticket for Force at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale last April. He had been consigned by Sequel Bloodstock, agent.

Force now has a 2-0-2 slate from eight starts and has earned \$147,850.

Temper Time

While the odds-on favorite in the Derby faded in the lane, Temper Mint Patty, the 1-10 choice in the \$75,000 New York Oaks, roared to a 9¼-length victory over Jc's Shooting Star. Out of the Adcat mare His Beauty, Temper Mint Patty covered the 1¼6 miles in 1:46.12.

Owned by Mark Stanley, a Lexington, Ky., businessman who has had many top runners such as grade I winner Ecton Park and many other runners with "temper" in the name such as graded winners Pleasant Temper and Swift Temper, Temper Mint Patty was bred by Gallagher's Stud near Ghent.

Temper Mint Patty is the result of three generations of New York breeding by Jerry and Marlene Brody at Gallagher's Stud. They also bred and raced her broodmare sire, Adcat.

"Her mother (His Beauty) was a really nice horse for us," said Gallagher's Stud farm manager Mallory Mort. "She could really run."

His Beauty won three of 15 starts under the care of Howie Tesher and won the 11/16-mile Jena Jena Stakes on the turf at Belmont in 2005.

"Mrs. Brody (Jerry died in 2001) kept two daughters of Adcat, and both of them were really good racehorses for us; the other mare was stakes-placed.

"When we retired His Beauty, she was down in Florida and Congrats was standing his first season (at Vinery Florida)," Mort said. "We had seen him and really liked him and tried to get a season to him, but he was booked up. Once he moved to Kentucky (in 2011), we considered it again. We really liked the A.P. Indy on top of the Storm Cat line."

Consigned to the 2013 Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds at Saratoga by Denali Stud, agent, Temper Mint Patty was purchased by Becky Thomas for \$30,000. Her Sequel Blood-



stock sold her to Stanley for \$95,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale of 2-yearolds in training in 2014.

The Oaks win, worth \$45,000, boosted her career earnings to \$274,050 and adds to her score in last year's Joseph A. Gimma Stakes for state-breds at Belmont Park. She's been pitched in three graded stakes without success but did place in the open Herecomesthebride Stakes in February for trainer Jeremiah Englehart.

Stanley offered Temper Mint Patty for sale July 9 at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky in the horses of racing age sale that followed its July yearling auction. Prominent New York owner Mike Repole purchased her for \$350,000, and she'll find a spot in trainer Todd Pletcher's shedrow.



Saratoga Snacks scores an appetizing victory in the Saginaw Stakes **ON THE FINAL WEEKEND** of Belmont Park's spring/summer meeting, the New York Racing Association staged a trio of six-figure stakes races for New York-breds.

Sometimes it's not age showing on an older horse. It's experience. That was the case with Saratoga Snacks, a 6-year-old ridgling by Tale of the Cat, making his 21st career start in the initial running of the \$98,000 Saginaw Stakes on July 18.

"He's gotten easier to train because he knows the game," said owner/trainer Gary Sciacca. "He's a veteran now and knows what to expect."

That on-track knowledge, along with a resurgence to top form since being reunited with Sciacca this past February, produced an eye-catching win as Saratoga Snacks powered away from a serious upper-stretch threat to register a three-quarters-length victory beneath Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez.

Turning into the lane, after racing with the pace through a dawdling opening half-mile of :48.73, Saratoga Snacks was confronted by the wide, sweeping move of West Point Thoroughbreds' Empire Dreams (by Patriot Act), who had defeated him in the May 25 Commentator Stakes. Empire Dreams briefly assumed the lead in the Saginaw. Velazquez, however, remained confident, knowing that he had yet to ask Saratoga Snacks for his best run.

"I said to him, 'Don't tell me you've been lying to me. It's time to go,' " recounted Velazquez in the winner's circle, with his hands moving forward to simulate the cue given to his equine partner.

There was absolutely no hint of dishonesty in Saratoga Snacks' response, as he gamely reclaimed the lead, rebuffing the tenacious Empire Dreams, who never stopped trying to the wire.

The winner halted the timer in 1:43.98 for the 11/16-mile distance, over a track labeled "good," which had been producing less than glib clockings.

"He did everything right," said Sciacca. "He had an easy first quarter and picked it up a little bit for the next quarter...I was just hoping he had something left. (Empire



Dreams) came to him. But (my horse) took off again. I'm so proud of him."

Bred by Mrs. Gerald A. Nielsen, Saratoga Snacks, who is out of Near and Dear (by Red Ransom), notched his ninth win (21-9-4-4), increasing his earnings to \$652,000.

Empire Dreams, from the barn of trainer Tom Albertrani, was the game runner-up in the Saginaw. Gridley Here, owned in partnership by Harold Lerner, Susan McPeek, and Nehoc Stables, finished third among the field of five older runners.

The Saginaw honors the remarkable Thoroughbred of the same name. He was a former claimer who flourished as an older runner for Drawing Away Stable and David Jacobson, winning 14 of 18 races for them. His gritty, determined style of racing made the 7-year-old gelded son of Peruvian a fan favorite. In the summer of 2013, Saginaw strung together a five-race win streak that included victories in the John Morrissey Stakes, Affirmed Success Handicap, Compelling Word Stakes, and Hollie Hughes Stakes.

"He showed great heart and always fought hard," said Sandy Levine, one of the managing partners of Drawing Away Stable, who remembered their runner on this day by hanging his many winning saddle clothes on the branches of a backyard tree at Belmont Park. "He was the most human horse I'd ever met. When they put those blinkers on in the paddock, suddenly his game face went on."

Owner/breeders Chester and Mary Broman have bred many horses in the Empire State over the past several decades, including Friends Lake, winner of the 2004 grade I Florida Derby. But the Bromans don't feel the need to overthink their success.

"It's a numbers game really," said Chester Broman, who proudly stood in the winner's circle alongside his wife after their homebred, first-time starter Manipulated easily captured the \$125,000 Rockville Centre Stakes for freshmen runners on July 18. "As long as the mare is good, you can sit back and see what happens."

In this case, the mare was Silver Knockers (by Silver Deputy), who was victorious in four of 16 starts and earned nearly a quarter of a million dollars on the racetrack. The Bromans sent her to Malibu Moon, and her offspring, Manipulated, was placed in the care of trainer Jimmy Jerkens.

"It's not often you run in a stakes race with a first-time starter," said Jerkens. "He'd been training well in the morning, and there was a lot of money hanging out there. So why not take a shot?"

Running without Lasix, the 2-yearold colt overcame a pair of obstacles at the start, as one runner veered into his path and another veered out. But beneath jockey Luis Saez, Manipulated produced a professional effort, rallying wide on the turn before assuming command through the final furlong, despite drifting out from left-handed encouragement.

The final time for the six furlongs was 1:12.67, with Manipulated, who was four lengths clear of his seven rivals, earning \$75,000.

Alan Brodsky's Lucky Lurie, haltered by Mark Hennig, finished second in the Rockville Centre. Dutchess Views Farm's Dr. Shane, from the barn of Nick Esler, checked in third.

In the heat of a 95-degree day, Wonderment, a daughter of Cosmonaut, out

of A Wonder She Is (by Three Wonders), scorched her five rivals in route to an easy 6¾-length victory in the \$125,000 Lynbrook Stakes for freshmen fillies on July 19.

Bred by Michael Landers and owned in partnership by Magdalena Racing (Sherri McPeek) and Chris Sterbenz, Wonderment returned to the races just 10 days after overcoming a troubled traffic-trip to break her maiden at firstasking.

The Kenneth McPeek-trainee tracked the early speed in the Lynbrook before asserting her dominance in the stretch beneath jockey Javier Castellano. The pair clocked the six-furlong distance in 1:11.47.

Undefeated in two starts, both sans Lasix, Wonderment has now bankrolled \$111,000.

"She won this for fun," said Jeff Odintz, assistant to McPeek. "She actually did it a lot easier than I thought she would. She's a nice filly. She can run."

Joseph Besecker's Young Anna Lee (by Posse) finished second in the Lynbrook, while the Bromans' homebred entry of Bag of Tricks (by Bernardini) and Praying Mantis (by Medaglia d'Oro) finished third and fourth, respectively.


