



Saratoga: "The New York-Bred Place to Be"

I'VE BEEN SPENDING A LOT OF TIME crunching numbers lately, which might not sound like a very exciting or inspiring way to spend precious summer days. Quite the contrary: The data I've been working on supply real numbers to support a point we have all known for a long time by intuition—New York-breds are integral to the success of the New York Racing Association's racing program. The upshot, I think you will agree, is illuminating and inspiring.

For obvious reasons I am going to focus here on Saratoga. Saratoga is the premier race meet in the country, the crown jewel of the NYRA circuit, and at the top of our minds (along with the sales) in the month of August.

The two most important ingredients in a racing program's recipe for success are field size and handle. In short, field size drives handle and handle is the element on which hinges the success or failure of the enterprise. As it happens, New York-bred races outperform their open counterparts virtually across the board.

For the 408 races run at Saratoga in 2016, the average field size for open races was 7.91 horses. On the other hand, the average field size for New York-bred races was 8.79, or 0.88 more horses per race. Although less than one entire racehorse might not sound like much, in reality it is substantial. In terms of percentage it means that New York-bred fields are 10.6% larger than open races. Most importantly this larger field size correlates directly with han-

dle. The average handle for open races at Saratoga in 2016 was \$1,441,480. The average handle for New York-bred races was 9.9% more, or \$1,591,602.

When you break down the numbers by surface, New York-bred average field size in dirt races alone outperforms the opens even more dramatically. Open dirt races at Saratoga in 2016 averaged 7.16 horses while New York-bred dirt races averaged 8.23 horses per race—1.07 more horses, or a 13.9% larger field size. The handle difference is not quite as dramatic but still significant: New York-bred dirt races at Saratoga were worth 5.3% more in handle last year than open races (\$1,426,853 for opens vs. \$1,504,660 for New York-breds). For turf races New York-bred fields were 4.2% larger (0.37 horses), while the handle was two ticks below the opens.



FOURSTAR CROOK'S PENNY ADDS SHINE TO STATE-BRED TOTAL

Michael Dubb, Gary Aisquith, and Michael Caruso's Bethlehem Stables' state-bred Fourstar Crook took her win streak to a different level July 4, winning the grade 3 Dr. James Penny Memorial Stakes at Parx. The victory, her eighth consecutive win, is one of 11 graded stakes scores for New York-breds in 2017...and it's only the end of July.

Fourstar Crook was bred by Kathleen Feron and foaled at Akindale Farm near Pawling. By perennial leading sire Freud, Fourstar Crook is out of the unplaced D'Accord mare Avril a Portugal. Avril a Portugal is also the dam of Coaltown Legend (by Jump Start), who earned more than \$325,000. The mare's yearling filly, also by Freud, will be offered at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds Aug. 13. She delivered a full brother April 19.

Purchased by Allied Bloodstock at the preferred yearling sale for \$55,000. Fourstar Crook was picked up by Dubb the following year at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic spring sale of 2-year-olds for \$110,000. A three-time stakes winner against state-breds prior to the Penny, she's won eight of 11 starts and has earned \$544,050.

On July 8 Mind Your Biscuits made his first outing since his win in the Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1). After a freshening at Taylor Made Farm near Nicholasville, Ky., the 4-year-old returned to New York and trainer Chad Summers, and was a decisive winner of his comeback race in the Belmont Sprint Championship Stakes (G2) during the Stars and Stripes program at Belmont. The son of Posse, bred by Samantha Will's Jumping Jack Racing and foaled at Sue and Gary Lundy's Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, is considered to be the top sprinter in the nation and currently is ranked sixth on the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's Top Thoroughbred poll. The win at Belmont, a 'Win and

You're In' race, puts Mind Your Biscuits in the driver's seat for the Nov. 4 Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) at Del Mar. He was elevated to second (from third, via DQ) in last year's Sprint at Santa Anita Park. Mind Your Biscuits races for J Stables, Head of Plains Partners, Dan and Scott Summers, and Michael Kisber.

Improving on the good form he showed winning the Jaipur Invitational Stakes (G3T) June 10, Frank and Patricia Generazio's Disco Partner was a commanding winner July 15 of Belmont's \$150,000 Forbidden Apple Stakes. Fellow New Yorkbred Get Jets was second in the mile race that went in 1:33.49, and state-bred King Kreesa was fourth.


Buster and Teri Brown to manage Sequel New York

Trainer, NYTB Executive Corbellini Dies at Age 84

Bill Corbellini, who piled up wins in New York and Florida as a successful trainer from the late 1960s through the early 1980s and later served as executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, died July 12 at the age of 84 in Dallas.

Corbellini registered the biggest win of his career in 1973 when he won a division of the Diana Handicap (then G2T) at Saratoga Race Course with Mereworth Farm's Cathy Baby, who conceded three to 10 pounds to rivals. (The other division of the Diana that year was won by Lightning Lucy.) The 90th edition of the Diana (G1T) was contested July 22 at Saratoga.

Corbellini ranked third in New York wins in 1967 with 55 victories. Future Racing Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel worked as a hot walker for Corbellini.

Corbellini relocated to Dallas in recent vears to be closer to family members.

"He enjoyed all aspects of the industry," said son Bill Corbellini. "He liked physically working with the horses and the business side."







Strength to Strength

New York-bred yearling sale has hit its stride


A HEAVY THUNDERSTORM a year ago couldn't keep buyers away from the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of New York-bred preferred yearlings and there were several lightning strikes inside the Humphrey S. Finney sale pavilion once the sale got underway. The two-session sale was topped by an Uncle Mo colt that brought \$450,000. In all, six other yearlings sold for at least \$250,000.

The average price of last year's sale came in at \$77,246, a figure on par with the previous three years and light years ahead of the \$39,106 average from 2010. The power of the state-bred program speaks for itself these days.

"One of the important things to note about the New York program is it has demonstrated its staying power," said Boyd Browning, president and CEO of Fasig-Tipton. "There are no questions; there's no fluctuations. It's established. It's the premier state-bred program in the United States, and it has the support and confidence of the entire industry, the New York Racing Association, the breeders, Fasig-Tipton, buyers, and sellers. There's no 'what if' questions you have to answer."

And beyond the program, the sale brings together the best of the crop, at the best time of the year: mid-August during Saratoga.

"It's the definition of 'preferred,' " said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "The sale has 292 of the most well-bred New York-bred foals in it,

which is 18% of our 1,628 foals from 2016...so the sale is offering the cream of the crop. It's gotten more and more difficult for breeders to enter this sale, and the reason is quite simple: the bar keeps being raised by the people entering New York. This year's catalog must be the most commercially appealing book to date."

Expectations are running high for this year's sale, slated for Aug. 12-13. Each session will get underway at 6:30 p.m. Competition for the best lots figures to be fierce in a segment of the business that is thriving. Cannizzo points out that New Yorkbreds accounted for 46% of the starts made at NYRA tracks in 2016 and they earned 33%, or \$53 million, of the available purse money.

Sire power ranges from the top stallions in Kentucky to the top stallions in New York. Perennial leading sire Freud has 10 yearlings cataloged to the sale.

There is strong representation from two first-year state-bred sires in Central Banker and Honorable Dillon. Central Banker (by Speightstown) has 17 yearlings consigned to the sale and Honorable Dillon (by three-time leading sire Tapit) has 10. Flashback, another son of Tapit, has nine entries.

"It's encouraging to see some new stallions come to New York that have some promise, and they are certainly producing nice-looking horses," Browning said. "Overall the sire power is very strong and the female families continue to improve. The depth of the families and the qualities of the pedigrees notch up every year. New York breeders continue to reinvest and recognize the market trends that quality is important. They have embraced that concept and are breeding and producing better horses."

Cannizzo concurs.

"To me, the female families are what appear most impressive," he said. "The quality of the broodmares that have been having foals in New York is unparalleled in other regional programs."

Dan and Kathy Barraclough

Dan and Kathy Barraclough's Saratoga Glen Farm offers a full spectrum of opportunities

THE THOROUGHBRED INDUSTRY TURNS its gaze toward Saratoga for topclass racing every summer, but for Dan and Kathy Barraclough the area is better known simply as home.

Not far from the track, their 77-acre Saratoga Glen Farm has a resident population of around 35 active broodmares and about 20 yearlings. Additionally, the couple is working to expand their breaking and training operation.

Dan, a former high school teacher, and Kathy, an Australian native who used to be a three-day eventer, have turned a passion into a profession as they offer clients a full spectrum of possibilities.

"It's almost scary how many different aspects we are in," said Dan Barraclough. "We own shares or breeding rights in about 15 different stallions in New York and Kentucky. We breed commercial horses, we breed racehorses, we pinhook, we buy for clients, we sell for clients, and we have our training/rehab division. There are a lot of different parts of the industry that I think we are better than average at that we can help our clients with. If someone asks, we are happy to help."

The Barracloughs started Saratoga Glen in 2002, but they credit the McMahons of Saratoga Thoroughbreds for helping turn a weekend project into a full-time operation.

"We had bought some property and we were building on it, but it was slow going," said Barraclough. "I was a high school teacher at the time, and we were working

on it on the weekends and holidays. The McMahons asked us to take over some of their seasonal overflow. They allowed us to lease a facility they were leasing in the area and got us started with a dozen or so broodmares to foal out and breed back for seasonal clients, and it grew from there. We owe a big thanks to Saratoga Thoroughbreds for sure. I am still dealing with naughty children, just the four-legged variety now."

Going All In

Although Saratoga Glen itself is a relatively young 15 years old, the Barracloughs have been breeding their own horses and selling at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New Yorkbred yearlings for the last 20 years.

"We were dabbling a little bit," Dan Barraclough said. "I had started breeding warmblood jumpers in the mid-1990s. We were buying off-the-track Thoroughbred mares and crossing them with predominately Dutch warmblood stallions. We were selling green broke warmbloods, and one thing led to another. I stopped riding for a little while and decided to start breeding Thoroughbreds."

A native New Yorker, Dan grew up in Delaware County and taught in Salem, but the Barracloughs knew they wanted to be closer to Saratoga.

"We decided to relocate to Saratoga

mainly because of the quality of veterinary care, blacksmiths, and other support services was so much greater," Barraclough said. "We wanted to have access to the best that New York had to offer. I wouldn't say I chose New York over another state. It is all I have ever known. I have worked in Florida and Kentucky, the bigger Thoroughbred areas, but I have always called New York home."

On the breeding side the Barracloughs have put their focus on identifying mares that have future earning potential. "We spend a lot of time looking for broodmares and recruiting broodmares to purchase," said Barraclough. "What we have really been good at is identifying and purchasing mares that will produce middle- to high-end sale horses. We have been able to buy those mares for reasonable prices.

"For example, we were involved in a mare named Bit of the Bubbly—she was a cool mare," he said. "She was a Becky Thomas mare, and then we bought her for an Australian client. We exported her, and later we were able to buy her back. She's pensioned now, but she was

a great producer for us."

Another horse associated with the Barracloughs is 2015 New Yorkbred champion 2-year-old filly Frosty Margarita.

"We raised Frosty Margarita for a client, and we've had some \$500,000 earners as well," said Barraclough. "We have

done well for our small farm, but we are still looking for bigger and better things down the road."

When it comes to consigning, the Barracloughs aim to sell wherever it makes the most sense for each individual horse. Sometimes that means New York; sometimes it doesn't.

"We pick sales based on the horse's development," said Barraclough. "We are looking to sell horses when they are at their peak. We are happy to ship horses and sell them all over the East Coast. What we want to do is sell them when they are at their best, and sometimes they need more time. Sometimes horses we really want to sell at the preferred sale in August just aren't quite ready. You can sell a New York-bred anywhere if it is a good horse."

Branching Out

Beyond breeding and selling, a major aspect of the couple's future plans involves the training and rehab branch of their operation. They are currently leasing a facility about 10 miles away from the main farm to aid in expanding this venture.

"It's become a big part of our business, and it helps us stand out," said Barraclough. "I believe we are the only breeding farm in the state of New York that does that as well. That has been a nifty part of the business that we have been growing the last two years, and it is going well.

"Being so close to Saratoga, it was easy for us to recruit clients and really grow our business," he said. "We are getting lay-ups from some big trainers who have horses that need to be rehabbed, and we are breaking babies for other clients. We also buy three to five a year to train and sell ourselves."

Horses in the program do their early lessons—driving, round pen work, field work—at the farm in early to mid-fall, and then when the weather turns inclement, they move up the road to the facility that has an indoor arena as well as outdoor gallops.

"It started because we had some clients asking us to do it," said Barraclough. "They just didn't want to ship their horses to Ocala or South Carolina. They weren't in any big rush to have them make May or June starts. We have a good team in place. My wife is a licensed trainer, and our assistant trainer, Keriann McGillycuddy, supervises all

the breaking and training and is also very well qualified.

"It's been a pleasant surprise. If you had asked me five years ago if that is where we were headed, I would have said no, but we've been able to combine our specialized skill sets and grow an interesting part of the business that no other breeding farm in New York is really offering."

Last year the Barraclough's broke 17 yearlings and are looking to raise that number to around 25. One of the battles they face is the New York weather, but they believe the mental preparedness their horses receive outweighs the breaks for weather.

"A lot of these horses we are breaking were foaled here, raised here, and trained here," said Barraclough. "They've never been more than 15 miles away. They go right to the Oklahoma track when it opens. The last two years we've had the first horses that stepped on the track to train every April, and we are usually the last to leave. We get six to seven good months of training on arguably one of the best training tracks in the country."

During the winter, when there is significant snow on the ground, the horses still get turned out, including all of the horses in training, and enjoy getting to gallop in their paddocks.

"What we lose here in preparation due to the weather is made up for in their mental conditioning," said Barraclough. "When we hand these horses to trainers, their minds are great. They train forward, they gallop forward, they breeze well, they are straight and true, and they are confident and secure in their surroundings because they have seen all the racetrack stuff.

"When they go to the track, they see water trucks and ambulances, they see ponies of every size and color, and they get to experience being in the gate with horses breezing by. It's going to take some time for us to prove that we know what we are doing and we can get the job done, but all of the owners and trainers were happy with all the horses

we did last year."

Many of the horses that are going through the training program Saratoga Glen offers were also foaled and raised on the property and come from families the Barracloughs are familiar with.

"A lot of times we are breaking yearlings out of mares that were born here," said Barraclough. "We have gotten feedAnother of the major benefits to being in New York, of course, is the breeder awards program. The Barracloughs acknowledge the program is one of the reasons they were able to survive the economic downturn that impacted so many other farms, and it continues to be a boon as they look to grow their operation now.

back over the years how they trained and areas we might need to focus more on. For instance, we dropped off a 2-year-old to a trainer in Belmont at the end of June, and he said his mom was the worst weaver he ever had at the track.

"We knew that, and we knew to keep that 2-year-old happy and to make sure he was turned out enough, had things to do, and had toys to play with. He never weaved, never stall walked. It was important to us that whatever question marks the trainer had on the horse, we took care of it and made sure the horse got to him in perfect mental and physical condition."

In addition to traditional training, the Barracloughs also rehab and re-home both racehorses and broodmares they have been associated with when it is time for them to move on to a different career.

"It adds a lot of stability to the ebbs and flows in the market, especially the sales market," said Barraclough. "When we had the downturn in 2008 and 2009, people found stability in buying New York-bred yearlings and foaling mares in New York. You saw a lot of struggling Kentucky farms start to take advantage of the program then. That coincided with slots money and other factors, but a big part of it was they saw the breeder awards. I was less concerned about going out of business than I think my counterparts in other states without such a strong breeding program were.

"I wouldn't have imagined trying to take advantage of any other state bred program," he said. "The New York program is just so much stronger. It's just phenomenal. There are just so many different reasons to buy and breed in New York."





HORSES AND RACING HAVE BEEN A FAMILY AFFAIR for trainer H. James Bond, who grew up as the son of a horseman near Finger Lakes Race Track, later introduced his wife, Tina Marie, to the sport, and now has his sons, Kevin and Ryan, working as his assistants. Bond, who started riding as a child and quickly progressed to galloping racehorses, was just a teenager when he took out a trainer's license to help out with the string left behind when his father passed away.

"I was about 15 when I was saddling horses at Finger Lakes," Bond remembered. "My father had a lot of health problems. The stewards gave me a license because they knew us and the hardship on my family. I originally wanted to be a veterinarian because I made pretty good grades, but with my dad (sick) I was at the barn at 4 a.m. every morning, and I'd gallop horses until about 7:30 before going to school.

"That was my life, and I wouldn't change it, even if it's hard to imagine doing today. I had a lot of fun."

Tina Marie also grew up near Finger Lakes, but she had little experience with horses until she began dating Jim while attending the Bryant & Stratton Business Institute. After graduating, she worked for Eastman Kodak's foreign exchange department and later became an investment specialist for ESL Federal Credit Union.

The Bonds married in 1984, and their son Kevin was born in 1987. The young family started out living on a farm near Victor, N.Y., close to the Finger Lakes oval where Bond had become a leading trainer.

At Tina's suggestion Bond wound up connecting with one of his first major owners, Virginia Kraft Payson.

"We had heard that she was possibly considering sending some horses to run at Finger Lakes," Bond said. "Dick Lundy was stepping down as her trainer, and we sent her a letter with some ideas that might fit her program and win a few more races and breeders' awards since she had some New York-breds and had Carr de Naskra standing in New York. Not long after that I got a phone call at 5 a.m., and the voice on the other line said, 'Good morning, this

is Virginia Kraft Payson,' and I almost fell on the floor. The first horse I ran for her was Wonderous Wise, and he set a track record at Finger Lakes (in 1989). She was very good

to me and gave me a lot of great opportunities."

Bond left his Finger Lakes base in 1990 to focus on racing at Saratoga and Belmont Park while spending the winters in Florida. He started to make headlines with runners such as Payson's homebred L'Carriere, a son of her 1984 Travers Stakes (G1) winner Carr de Naskra out of her 1995 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year Northern Sunset. The popular New York-bred L'Carriere won two renewals of the Saratoga Cup Handicap (G3) and was runner-up to Cigar in the 1995 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1). In 1996 L'Carriere traveled with Cigar to the United Arab Emirates for the inaugural Dubai World



Cup and finished third behind Cigar and Soul of the Matter, completing a trifecta for American-based runners.

"I think Mrs. Payson put it best: 'It was a magic carpet ride.' I could probably be here, but I couldn't be here," Bond said. "It was my first international experience. It was uncharted waters that first year. Bill Mott and I are friends, and both horses were stabled across from one another at Payson Park, looking at each other every day before they went to Dubai. Tina has a great photo from after the race, with all three owners (Allen Paulson, Burt Bacharach with Soul of the Matter, Payson) and they were also the breeders of those horses, which is a rarity these days. It was a great day

for the sport. But Sheikh Mohammed couldn't have been a better host."

For a native of upstate New York, few trophies are more coveted than the Travers, Saratoga's marquee event. It was a feat Bond accomplished in 1996 with Will's Way, who surged past Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Louis Quatorze with champion Skip Away finishing a length back in third. The bay colt, owned by Donald Rudder's Rudlein Stable and William Clifton Jr., returned to Saratoga the following summer to prevail in an epic renewal of the Whitney Handicap (G1).

"The Travers is number one, for sure," Bond offered when asked about his favorite racetrack moment. "It was amazing. He might be my favorite horse, he had the biggest heart. He (Will's Way) was just a spectacular racehorse. He had a 126 Beyer Speed Figure when he won the Whitney, and I was lucky enough to be part of his career."

Bond has fond memories of his introduction to the son of Easy Goer.

"I still remember the first time I saw him at the Keeneland (July) sale," he recalled. "It was a very hot, hot day; I think it was 102 degrees. They brought him out for Dr. Cheney and (the horse) just double-barreled at Doc. I thought to myself, 'If that horse has that kind of energy when it's 102 and he's been showing all day, I sure want to train him.""

A \$60,000 RNA at the Keeneland July sale, Will's Way sold to Equix Biomechanics for \$95,000 during the sale company's September sale.

Rewarding Lifestyle

Having seen the heights at an early age, the couple's sons were horse crazy from the start.

"They would go to the barn any chance they got," Jim said. "When Tina was still working for Kodak, they would spend most of the summer with me in Saratoga. They learned to ride and were always around horses with me, so I probably created monsters in doing that. But their mother insisted that they go to college and get degrees just in case things went south in life."

Tina Bond left the corporate world to spend more time with her sons and also to handle the business aspects of the family operation. But the Bonds eventually settled in the Sunshine State to concentrate on Kevin and Ryan's education.

"I moved with the kids four times a year, but in order to make it work for high school, we had to choose, so we chose Florida because that way we could be together more months as a family," she explained. "They did have 'regular' jobs at an ice cream parlor and a fish market, but their first love was always the horses."

Kevin, 30, graduated from Lynn University with a degree in business management and oversees the Bond string at Belmont. Ryan, 26, majored in finance at Florida Atlantic University and is his father's assistant at Palm Meadows Training Center in South Florida. The family convenes every summer at Saratoga, where Jim Bond has a private, 40-stall barn near the Oklahoma Training Track.

"It is rewarding," Tina said about her sons' determination to follow their passion. "It's wonderful because you can watch them develop not only as an individual, but also professionally. We


tried to make them well-rounded. We are unique because we have a farm, that Jim is a trainer. We breed and race, and we've sold horses as a consignment, and Jim also has a truck for shipping. I do think we've exposed them to all aspects of the equine industry."

The Bonds acquired a 100-acre property near Stillwater, N.Y.—just 12 miles from the Saratoga main track—and set

about establishing Song Hill Thoroughbreds as a multi-service facility.

In addition to having 33 broodmares and their foals on the property, the Bonds offer sales preparation and breaking and training of yearlings and juveniles.

"I'm very hands-on as far as the management of the mares and babies," Tina said. "That's the beauty of it, and I think

it allows us to shape the young horses. We're also lucky that we have the farm so that we can give horses the time they need if they have an injury or if they need to rehabilitate. Honestly, I spend more hours doing this than I ever did in the corporate world. It's truly a passion, a love, but it took a little bit of an adjustment to embrace the lifestyle."

Song Hill also is the home of a pair of retirees, Ruffino and Tommasi, who were bred by the Bonds and were stakes winners in New York-bred company. Ruffino, 14, concluded his career for trainer Steve Klesaris, who contacted the Bonds to alert them about the horse's retirement. Tommasi, 15, had been claimed from the Bonds and was intended to be retrained for a second career via the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation but sustained an injury to his hind leg and eventually made it back to his birthplace.

"I can't seem to let them go," Tina



said. "They're like our children and our neighbors. I still have Tommasi's dam, Shock It. She was our foundation mare that built the farm."

Another former Bond-trained runner, millionaire Pleasant Breeze, 22, is enjoying life as a pony for the "007" barn.

Political Gains

Tina Bond decided to try her hand at racing politics in 2014 and was elected to the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association Board that autumn.

"When my boys were interested in coming into the racing world, I felt that I needed to do whatever I could to make the industry stronger and better, and that by doing so they could stay in the industry as long as they want to," she explained. "We need stability. I think there's a lot we can do to promote it in New York. New York has the best racing in the country, but I think there's a lot we can do to raise it up even more than it is now.

"We need to be better at selling the sport and bringing people in to show them how enjoyable it is, and to bring all of the good things that we do to light. I don't think we are that good at tooting our own horn. If horsemen and race-tracks can work together, we can reach out to people that don't know that much about us. I think that promoting the horses and the people behind them will bring new fans to the table, and that in turn will

grow the revenue on the (handle) side."

The couple established an ownership syndicate, Bond Racing, in an effort to make racing more accessible to more individuals.

"The bottom line is that it costs money to raise these babies and to get them to the races," Jim pointed out. "We had to change our operation a little bit, so we started Bond Racing where you can have five or 10% of a horse. It's been fun to put some new people into racing. Australia has been doing it more and more. and it's the wave of the future. You can cut out a lot of the risk, and the reward is very, very high. And it's a great addition to have the farm—we can just pull up with the truck if they need a week or a month off-we're very close to Saratoga, which is our main base of operation from April to November, so it all incorporates itself.

"I do sit them down at the beginning and say, 'I can make you a millionaire if you're a billionaire," he continued. "I try to compare it to a golf club membership, where the equity of your membership is the horse's cost, and your greens fees are the monthly upkeep costs. The bottom line is that you should try it if you're considering having horses of your own one day, that you can get your feet wet to see if you really like it. But it does come with the stipulation that we are in charge, that the horse will be retired when it needs to be retired. We've gotten tremendous feedback from our partners, and they've really enjoyed it, even if the horse ran fourth or fifth, and I give any one of a million excuses that trainers can come up with. They're learning about the sport and that the horse comes first."

Putting the horse first has been the mainstay of Bond's career, and is the principle he has most emphasized to his sons.

"I decided that I would do my best to make the boys great horsemen," he said. "They're hard workers and, as Mr. Paulson said to me years ago, 'Hard work makes good luck,' and he's 100% right."

What a Catch, Pure Silver win juvenile stakes in similar fashion **ON JULY 15 THE \$100,000 ROCKVILLE CENTRE STAKES** featured a pitched battle between a pair of fleet up-and-coming New York-bred freshmen—Gary Barber's What a Catch (by Justin Phillip) and John Caputo, Lady DelPo, and The Boys Racing's Morning Breez (by Morning Line). Both colts were second-time starters, having sported stylish wins in their debuts.

Justin Phillip stands at Castleton Lyons near Lexington. What a Catch, trained by Todd Pletcher, was bred by the farm. Susie Hart, along with Elaine Peck's Rhapsody Farm, bred the Carlos Martin-trained Morning Breez. Both breeders were enthused about their colts' unfolding careers.

"What a Catch (Justin Phillip's first freshman winner) now has a good chance to win a black-type race at Belmont and further increase the reputation of Justin Phillip, who has started off very well with his first runners," said Castleton Lyons'

manager Stuart Fitzgibbon.

"We wanted to step into the New York-bred program," said Hart. "This colt is a really good one. The mare (Tico Breeze) is a Carson City. We look at the physicality and pedigree (in selecting a stallion). She was short-legged and stout. So we chose Morning Line in hopes of getting more size into her offspring. Then we sent her to Elaine. It had to be Elaine because she really mothers them."

Having left from the starting gate in the Rockville Centre, Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, aboard What a Catch, decided to put his colt on the lead after a superb break. Racing directly to his outside was Morning Breez, with Rosario Montanez in the irons.

The speedy combatants quickly separated themselves from the trio of other 2-year-olds, seemingly staging their own private race on the front end.

Nearing the top of the stretch, Velazquez brought his experience into play using some savvy in the saddle to gain an edge.

"I tried to get away from the (other colt) at the quarter pole," he said. "I tried to discourage that horse a little bit, and I think it worked."

After an opening half-mile in :46.48, Velazquez used that advantage throughout the length of the stretch, holding a hard-trying Morning Breez and Montanez at bay. Although Morning Breez appeared to be gaining ground late, it was indeed, too late. What a Catch registered a one-length win in 1:11.21.

"Catch My Fancy (the winner's dam) is a very good-looking daughter of Yes It's True. We bred her to Justin Phillip in his first year at stud. We continually support our stallions with our own mares. She was one of 14 Castleton residents that went to the (stallion)," said Fitzgibbon. "We decided to participate in the New York breeding program and sent three mares up there to foal, including Catch My Fancy. We felt that this program is probably the best of its type in the country, and having a 'NY' suffix would add to the appeal of his first crop. So it proved as What a Catch brought \$90,000 at the Fasig-Tipton New Yorkbred Saratoga preferred yearling sale and then \$265,000 for Steve Venosa at the Fasig-Tipton Florida select 2-year-old sale at Gulfstream, as his family's pedigree was also boosted by Girvin's grade 2 win in the Risen Star Stakes in February.

Girvin is out of Catch My Fancy's daughter Catch the Moon.

Undefeated in his two starts, with both wins coming at Belmont Park, What a Catch has earned \$97,200.

"He's always been pretty classy, a precocious 2-year-old. He's been benefiting from that and stepping up every time we've asked him, " said assistant Byron Hughes, who saddled for Pletcher.

The runner-up, Morning Breez, displayed continued promise in a hard-fought defeat.

Morning Breez is a late-April foal while What a Catch was foaled May 9. Conditioners Pletcher and Martin should be recognized for having their colts already so advanced in their training.

Ouick Silver

The \$100,000 Lynbrook Stakes for freshman fillies, contested a day later, seemed like a mirror image of the Rockville Centre. Once again, in a field of four, Velazquez seized the lead right out of the gate, this time with Twin Creeks Racing Stables' homebred Pure Silver (by Mission Impazible), also trained by Pletcher.

The filly on the chase was the 1-5 favorite, I Still Miss You (by Majestic Warrior), owned by Gold Star Racing Stable,

Matthew Hand, and Brian McKenzie. In her last encounter I Still Miss You had been a 2¼-length winner of the open company Astoria Stakes June 8 at Belmont.

Pure Silver made the pace along the rail and then cut the corner into the sandy stretch with I Still Miss You, beneath Javier Castellano, gearing up to pounce.

I Still Miss You put in a serious challenge for the lead in upper stretch, but Velazquez motivated Pure Silver to repulse the bid, pulling clear nearing the furlong marker and eventually recording a 1½-length win in 1:11.40 for the six furlongs.

"After the last start (her debut), we

knew she had speed from the gate and she showed it again today," said Hughes. "We will see how she comes out of the race and from there (her next start) will be somewhere at Saratoga for sure."

Out of Jehan (by Forest Wildcat), Pure Silver is undefeated in her tworace career, with earnings of \$97,200.

The runner-up, I Still Miss You, is trained by Jeremiah Englehart, who had a banner spring/summer Belmont Park meeting winning 17 races. He is ably assisted with his New York string by Axelle Angeliaume.

One Last Cast (by Algorithms), owned by Jake and Todd Pletcher, finished third.

Twisted Tom Gets His Derby

Scores in Finger Lakes' New York Derby; Bonita Bianca gets up in the Oaks



TWISTED TOM, WHO MADE A VALIANT RUN at the June 10 Belmont Stakes presented by NYRABets (G1) after back-to-back open stakes wins in Maryland this spring, bounced back with a half-length score over state-breds July 22 in Finger Lakes' \$160,150 New York Derby.

The chestnut gelding from the first crop of Creative Cause was on the engine in the 1¼6-mile Derby and got the trip in 1:44.52 as the 7-10 favorite over Broken Engagement and Pat On the Back. Twisted Tom, bred by Dr. William Wilmot and Dr. Joan Taylor, races for Cobra Farm, R R Partners, and Head of Plains Partners, and is trained by Eclipse Award winner Chad Brown.

The Derby winner is out of Wilmot and Taylor's Tiffany Twisted, a 14-year-old daughter of Thunder Gulch who found her way to the winner's circle twice in 14 starts while with trainer Michael Matz. Tiffany Twisted, who unfortunately came up barren to the cover of Paynter for 2017, is out of the Seattle Slew mare Miss Turlington.

Wilmont and Taylor spent \$100,000 for Miss Turlington in the name of their Stepwise Farm at the 1994 Keeneland November sale and she has rewarded them in spades. In addition to Tiffany Twisted, Miss Turlington produced Incurable Optimist, the 1998 New York Horse of the Year and a leading sire in Argentina, grade 2-placed Feisty Step, and group 3-placed Cervinio.

The Saratoga-based Twisted Tom, with wins in Laurel's Private Terms Stakes and Federico Tesio Stakes, has won five of eight starts and has earned \$350,131. He made his first two starts for Thomas

Brockley and trainer George Weaver before bloodstock agent Steve Young made a run at him for Cobra Farm owner Gary Biszantz. After the private purchase he was sent to Brown's shedrow.

Also shipping from Saratoga to Finger Lakes was Michael Dubb, Michael Caruso's Bethlehem Stables, and Michael Imperio's Bonita Bianca. Last year's New York-bred champion 2-year-old filly had a more difficult trip but powered from last to first to capture the \$75,000 New York Oaks under Dylan Davis. She edged Playinwiththeboys by a neck and got the 11/16 miles in 1:46.72.

Bred by Dormellito Stud and foaled at Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater, Bonita Bianca was purchased by Dubb for \$97,000 at last year's Ocala Breeders' Sales' March 2-year-old sale.

A gem of a purchase, Bonita Bianca is by top sire Curlin out of the grade 1-winning Friendly Michelle, who took the 2004 Prioress Stakes (G1) and the La Troienne Stakes (G3). She also placed in the Acorn Stakes and Las Virgenes Stakes (both G1).

Friendly Michelle is a half sister to stakes-placed Abba Gold, the dam of grade 2 winner Kathmanblu and stakes winner Kathballu.

Bonita Bianca, named for trainer Rudy Rodriguez' niece, won last year's Maid of the Mist Stakes and East View Stakes over state-breds and finished third in the grade 2 Demoiselle Stakes on her way to championship honors. She's won four of six starts and \$323,000.




