

Establishing New York

My guess is you don't need me to tell you what a spectacular success the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale was last month. I congratulate you all! Moreover, the hard work you put in as breeders to bring such quality horses to the sale was not lost on anybody who follows our industry.

It is worth quoting Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning Jr.'s reaction to the sale's phenomenal results. "It is a tribute to the New York program," Browning said. "It shows what happens when the breeders and the horsemen cooperate and when the legislators understand the opportunities and the significant impact that our industry can have on a state. You can see the enthusiasm that the breeders feel, that the people at the racetrack feel, and it demonstrates the power of cooperation amongst constituents and the results have been frankly extraordinarily impressive and we are thrilled to have been a part of it. This is the culmination of 10-20 years of work by a lot of people in the state of New York."

The sale continued the dramatic upward trajectory we have seen since 2011 when the marketplace first responded to the influx of video lottery terminal revenue into the New York

Racing Association purse structure and New York-bred awards program.

The catalog for the New York-bred preferred yearling sale was larger this year, up 15% from 260 yearlings in 2012 to 299. A total of 196 yearlings brought \$14,206,000 over the two sessions, compared to 2012 when 138 yearlings sold for \$8,632,000. The average rose 15.9% from \$62,551 in 2012 to \$72,480 in 2013, and the median was up 10% from \$50,000 last year to \$55,000. A whopping 43 yearlings brought at least \$100,000 in the two sessions, more than double the number from 2012, which saw 20 six-figure sellers. The buy-back rate decreased from 38.1% in 2012 to 25.5% for the sale in 2013.

Before the sale began, I had the chance to sit down with the folks at the *Thoroughbred Daily News* to talk about the growth of our program in a Q&A format. It gave me a chance to put lots of significant numbers relevant to New York breeding and sales out on public view and to talk about breeders' legislative accomplishments this session in Albany. I was also asked about what we might see down the road for the next couple of years. As stakeholders, you will find this interesting and perhaps want to share it with your clients and others.

The arrival of VLTs at Aqueduct two years ago translated into a major influx of cash to the New York racing program and sent the state's purses and breeding incentives through the roof. The New York breeding industry has responded with increases from the breeding shed to the sale ring. The *TDN* sat down with New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive director Jeff Cannizzo ahead of the Aug. 10-11 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale to discuss the growth of the state's breeding program.

TDN: How has the New York breeding industry grown in the last 1½ years?

JC: In the last 1½ years New York has seen quite a bit of change. The breeding landscape has certainly turned around. In 2012 we had roughly a 13% increase in the number of mares that were bred in New York state. There were about 2,400 mares bred here in New York last year. Sixty-eight percent of those were bred to New York sires and 32% were by out-of-state sires. There were more mares covered by New York sires last year than by out-of-state sires—based on my estimates; it was roughly a 10% increase in New York-sired versus out-of-state sired. Last year we had an influx of 800+ mares from out of state that came into the program. Mares came here in foal, dropped their foals; they weren't resident mares so they needed to breed back to New York stallions, which increased our New York-sired population to about 68%, when it typically hovers around 55%.

How does this growth compare to other states?

In 2012 The Jockey Club reported New York was essentially the only state with a double-digit increase in our number of mares covered by our in-state stallions. So our New York stallions covered 43% more mares than they did the year before, which is astronomical. We went from 64 stallions to 76. Mares have transitioned here. We're the one state that has seen a positive growth in terms of our mare population and our breeding trend. There was a 13% increase in mares bred last year. Why was that? It is absolutely because of what has happened to the value of a New York-bred, and it is all derived from the racetrack.

Obviously, the earnings potential of a New York-bred has skyrocketed in the last couple of years.

The purse structure for New York-breds has become by far the most promising it has ever been. There is roughly a \$10,000 gap between a New York-bred restricted race and an open race here in New York, which has been unheard of. So you have New York-bred maidens running for \$70,000 and up this summer at Saratoga. All of the value that comes alongside buying a New York-bred is the potential of what they can do on the racetrack and what they can earn. And when you have a horse that can run through its restricted conditions with an earning potential in those restricted conditions worth more than \$200,000, and then come back with that same horse and those same set of conditions in open company that he can run in and earn double that amount, the earnings potential is through the roof. In addition to \$4-million plus worth of restricted stakes that are run in New York, there are more than 50 New York-bred stakes races across the state.

How does the New York model differ from other regional programs?

The value of the horse is on the racetrack, and that is what is driving this model. That's really what separates New York from some of the other regional programs. Our racing environment is supporting and is the driver to our bloodstock market. It is not the breeding end and awards that are driving people to be involved here. It's the actual fact that, if you own a New York-bred, you're essentially granted the opportunity to generate a lot of revenue from that horse. That's the difference between us and some of the other states.

How has the increased value of New York-breds been reflected in the sales ring?

From 2010 to today, we've seen a 24% increase in the average sales price for New York-bred 2-year-olds; the average was \$38,500 in 2010 and has gone up to \$48,000. Total sales were around \$5 million. As of last year the total sales for New York-bred 2-year-olds was \$9.2 million. The median increased from \$20,000 to \$25,000. In 2010 there were 12 six-figure 2-year-olds sold and in 2012 there were 30. In the yearling sales we went from total sales in 2010 of \$9.9 million up to \$15.3 million. The average in 2010 was \$26,000. Last year it was \$42,000. The median was \$12,000 in 2010 to last year, \$25,000. There were 19 six-figure yearlings in 2010 and last year there were 36. For weanlings, in 2010, the total sales were \$1.3 million, last year \$3 million. The median went from \$9,500 to \$15,000.

In addition to the New York-bred catalog, there are several state-bred yearlings in the select catalog this year.

There are 11 New York-breds in

the select sale and that is close to the highest number we've had. What that says is that those horses were obviously good enough to be in that catalog and have a boutique appeal to them, which goes to show you the type of breeding that is happening in New York. That's really the major difference with what we're doing here regionally in New York versus what is perhaps the perception about regional breeding. The horses that are being bred here are commercially viable. Their pedigrees stand next to any other horse in the country. And their performances on the racetrack go hand and hand with that. New York has proved the whole stigma that regional breeding isn't necessarily of quality is wrong.

Have you been surprised by the industry's growth?

It was expected. We were expecting to grow, given the landscape here. It is so promising. When you have a New York-bred that has become more valuable because its value on the racetrack has increased by 30-40% because of the purse increases here in New York, the demand for that horse has gone up alongside of it. The racetrack drives this entire industry via purses; the breeding end of it follows suit with the sales market. As horses become more valuable on the racetrack, demand in the sales market is increased, which creates more people who want to breed New York-breds. It's all logical, and it's going as planned.

Are there any concerns that the slots revenue will be reallocated away from the racing industry at some point in the future?

This past year's gaming act that our governor has now signed con-

tains guarantees for the racing industry. The reality is that purses in our breeding fund are going to continue to receive what they were slated to receive originally for years to come. The belief that New York would follow suit along with some of the other states that have seen changes to their program has not come to fruition. We are actively involved with our legislature so that they understand the importance of this industry, both in terms of what it does for the economy and tourism in the state. I'd like to believe our legislature actually gets why we're important and gets why it's vital that we maintain what we're supposed to maintain. We've been protected going forward, and we'll continue to fight to prove our worth for years to come.

And how about the overall trends at the track?

Our New York model is showing results. As purses and the breeding fund have been supported by gaming, we're also showing the results of that support with what it is doing to pari-mutuel wagering in New York. NYRA's product and model are actually growing. It's unheard of these days. But our pari-mutuel handle has increased in the last 1½ years, and the business itself is becoming better because our product is getting better.

Have there been any new developments on the legislative front in the last year?

The most important thing we have accomplished, besides continuing a law that allows breeders to get 65% of all the breeding funds money, is, starting in January of next year, the breeding fund will now receive a percentage of all advance deposit wagering that is taken in from New York state

residents. This is a significant accomplishment that has been in the works for several years. ADW wagering is the only growth segment of our pari-mutuel wagering. In many states, breeding funds do not receive ADW handle. New York was one of those, and, again, we just essentially changed the law to get breeders included in this revenue and this will mean a new \$1 million and up for the breeding fund from the beginning of next year. So it is a significant accomplishment that is only going to help the breeding industry here in New York.

What type of growth do you see going forward for the state's breeding industry?

The reality is that the growth in New York will be steady and consistent. I'm not expecting numbers to fly through the roof because I think people are smarter today in terms of making calculated choices. This goes hand in hand with our economy and the national state of the industry. Nationally, foal production is down a third, so when there are 10,000 fewer mares that are being bred in the last handful of years, you can't expect New York to just skyrocket, while everyone else is plummeting. What you can expect is slow, steady growth in terms of people dabbling into the New York market. And that is what has happened. People have taken tiny steps into our environment, and the people who have done that have seen promise and they've seen results. The results they've seen are in the sales market because New York-breds are selling at a premium today. And for the people that are involved as end users, as owners, the purse structure has never been better. When you see results, you'll see people continually trying to get involved. It's going to happen slow and steady over the course of the next several years. 🐾

The New York Thoroughbred Breeders presented the 2013 NYTB Gerald A. Nielsen Sr. Scholarship to Allison Tuchrello in the winner's circle at Saratoga Race Course after the seventh race July 25, which was the New York Racing Association's fifth annual College Day.

Valedictorian of her class at Livonia High School in Livingston County, Tuchrello will be a junior at State University of New York at Geneseo this fall, where she is pursuing a double major in biology and the pre-veterinary medicine professional program. She aspires to become an equine vet, and hopes to attend the veterinary school at Cornell University.

Tuchrello, whose first horse, Zeus, was an off-the-track Thoroughbred from Finger Lakes, has been a 4-H member since 2004 and president of her 4-H Club since 2009. She has also volunteered as a leader and side-walker at Rainbow Ridge Therapeutic Riding Center. At Geneseo she belongs to both the Biology

Club and Pre-Vet Club.

"I cannot wait to give back to the racing industry with the help of the NYTB scholarship as I finish up my undergraduate degree and start to prepare my applications for vet school. COSMONAUT GETS FIRST WINNER

New York stallion Cosmonaut celebrated his first winner practically in his own backyard when Marvin's Miracle posted a three-quarter-length victory Aug. 8 in the fifth race at Saratoga Race Course.

The 2-year-old colt, ridden by Javier Castellano, tracked the pace in third until moving up to second in the stretch and pulling ahead for the win in the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile maiden special weight on turf.

The gray colt was bred by the late Carl Lizza's Flying Zee Stable in New York and is out of the Western Expression mare Idle Gossip.

Trained by Juan Coronel, Marvin's Miracle was also the first winner for new owner Bacon Barn.

Cosmonaut was bred in Kentucky by Patricia Pavlish. Upon his retirement the multiple graded stakes winner boasted a record of 8-8-3 from 36 starts and earnings of \$1,397,723. An 11-year-old son of Lemon Drop Kid, Cosmonaut is out of Cosmic Fire, a daughter of Capote.

Cosmonaut is a Highcliff Stallion standing at McMahan of Saratoga Thoroughbreds near Saratoga Springs, N.Y. His fee for the 2013 breeding season was \$5,000.



'Boom'

New York-bred Preferred sale lives up to the hype

Sometimes the results live up to the hype. Several weeks out there was plenty of buzz surrounding the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Preferred yearling sale and the 299 state-breds cataloged to the two-session sale. After the hammer fell for the last time Aug. 11 at the Humphrey S. Finney Sales Pavilion, the figures were staggering, leaving breeders, consignors, sale company officials, and even buyers, beaming.

The gross, \$14,206,000, soared 64.6% from the 2012 sale that had been the largest grossing state-bred yearling sale in history. Fifty-eight more yearlings were reported as sold than in 2012 with the average price advancing 15.9%. The median, a bellwether figure that often tells the marketplace about the strength of the middle market, rose 10% from \$50,000 to \$55,000.

“This is the third time we’ve sold up here,” said Derek MacKenzie, director of public sales for Vinery Sales & Millennium Farms. “The first year (2011) was big; you could feel it. Last year there seemed to be a little bit of a lull. The momentum just didn’t carry through. This year it went ‘boom.’”

Remarkably, 43 of the yearlings realized a price of \$100,000 or more.

“I thought it was a tremendous success, and the success is attributable to the quality of horses we had for sale,” said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning Jr. a few days after the sale. “The quality of New York-breds in that catalog from a physical aspect and from a pedigree perspective represented considerable improvement from where we’ve been over the last five to 10 years, and it’s even jumped forward in the last two to three years.”

The driver of the sale, of course, is the purse structure currently in place in New York with revenues from slot proceeds. Additional legislation that could further enhance the breeding and racing program in the Empire State will be put before the state’s voters this fall.

“The proof was in the pudding—purses are the engine that pull the whole train,” said Craig Bandoroff, the sale’s leading consignor through his Denali Stud, agent, consignment. “The purses for these horses are good, and people are optimistic they are going to be around for awhile.”

Big Build-up

The sale grounds in Saratoga Springs was hopping the entire first two weekends of August. The high-end Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale was held Aug. 5-6 and drew its usual crowd of major national and international players. The select has always had a few New York-

breeds sprinkled among its black-type rich catalog, but this year, as a testament to the growing strength of the state’s breeding program, 11 of the 152 cataloged youngsters were registered New York-breds. Ten made their way into the ring and seven were sold for an average of \$192,857 with a median price of \$200,000.

Buyers of New York-breds during the select sessions included Sheikh Hamdan’s Shadwell Estate Co.; T. Paul Bulmahn’s GoldMark Farm, owner of Whitney Invitational Handicap (gr. I) winner Cross Traffic; and high-flying newcomer Nat Rea’s Regis Farms.

The momentum carried over from the select sale to the following weekend for the state-bred sale as potential buyers swarmed the sale barns searching for racing prospects.

“The grounds were packed when the rain started Friday (Aug. 9) morning all the way to late afternoon on Saturday, and there was additional activity Saturday and Sunday. Those sale grounds were as crowded on Friday as I’ve ever seen in my life,” Browning said.

Consignors agreed.

“The first day of showing we showed 1,500 times for 26 horses, and I think they ended up being shown 2,600 times,” Bandoroff said. “It was very busy, and there was real, genuine interest... and they sold well.”

“It’s always a busy sale as far as lookers go, and it was the busiest that I’ve seen it,” MacKenzie agreed. “The top-end horses were being shown 75 times the first day of the show. That exceeds anything I’ve seen in Kentucky.”

What those buyers

saw was an improved lot of state-breds for sale. As the purses have improved, so, too, has the quality of horses, from better-bred mares being mated with higher-quality stallions from both in and out of state.

"I would definitely applaud the New York breeders stepping up to the plate and providing a better product for the sale," said Nick de Meric, who wound up being the leading buyer at the sale by gross, spending \$1,142,000 for 10 yearlings. "This was far and away the best

group of New York-breds I have ever seen under one roof, which is what you would expect, considering the increases in the purse structure and breeder awards and stallion awards into the state of New York."

Tapit at the Top

The sale-topper, a filly by Tapit, brought a final bid of \$430,000 from agent Steven W. Young for owner Gary Bizantz during the second session from Gainesway, agent. The price is the highest ever in the history of the New York-bred preferred sale.

The filly had been accepted to the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select sale, but her connections opted to place her in the New York-bred sale.

"We thought she might stand out here and hopefully bring a premium,"

Gainesway director of public sales Brian Graves told *The Blood-Horse*. "We thought we'd have a chance to top the sale while she'd be a mid-range horse in the other sale."

Bred by Marbat, the filly is out of the stakes-winning More Than Ready mare Miss Challenge, who is a half sister to dual graded stakes winner Ventana (by Toccet).

Fillies lit up the first three spots in the sale, with daughters of Kentucky-based sires Speightstown and War Front selling for \$300,000. The top-priced colt, a son of Midnight Lute consigned by Gallagher's Stud, Denali Stud, agent, is also by a Kentucky-based sire.

Desert Party, winner of the Sanford Stakes (gr. II) in 2008 and

owned by Darley, was the leading New York-based sire with six yearlings selling for an average of \$111,167. Desert Party (Street Cry—Sage Cat, by Tabasco Cat) stands at Sequel Stallions New York along with the state's perennial leading sire by progeny earnings, Freud. Freud (Storm Cat—Mariah's Storm, by Rahy) had by far the largest number of yearlings in the sale. Sixteen of the 17 yearlings by Freud offered were listed as sold for an average of \$51,438, more than five times his

listed stud fee of \$10,000.

"That was scary as a stallion owner," said Sequel Stallions owner Becky Thomas, of Freud's presence in the sale. "You don't want to overwhelm the market with too much supply. But Freud does sire an attractive horse, so I was optimistic."

Thomas noted that six of the 43 six-figure-plus yearlings were by stallions that are based in New York—two by Freud and two by Desert Party.

Thomas wore two hats at the sale: one as a seller and operator of one of the state's major stallion farms, and, as a buyer—she purchased seven yearlings for \$283,000 (an average of \$40,429).

"There were a lot of people that had \$100,000-\$200,000 to spend," she


said. “The individuals were there. As a pinhooker, we’re trying to be careful of what we spend, but I can tell you my top (rated) horses were taken by end-users or pinhookers that were more aggressive than I was.”

De Meric, who is also in the pinhooking game, was one of the aggressors.

“The bidding was definitely more competitive,” he said. “I counseled the people for whom I buy that we needed to roll up our sleeves and be ready to pounce. We struck where we thought we should strike, and, hopefully, we made some good decisions.”

While the yearling-to-juvenile pinhookers hope they make out alright at next year’s juvenile sales, several savvy pinhookers tried the weanling-to-yearling game and found success from buying products last October out of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall mixed sale.

A few examples: A colt by Congrats out of Relativa sold for \$37,000 last fall and resold for \$200,000 at the

yearling sale to Xavier International Bloodstock, agent; a colt by Freud—Day Trading sold for \$110,000 after being purchased for \$33,000; and a colt by Yes It’s True—Gambler’s Passion that sold for \$25,000 last fall

went for \$75,000 at the preferred yearling sale.

MacKenzie noted: “The pinhookers did well, and they’ll come up in droves for this year’s sale. It was experimental last year, but it performed really well in hindsight. Last year we had a big consignment there, and we will again this year.”

This year’s Saratoga fall mixed and horses of racing age will be held Oct. 7.

Quality, Quality, Quality

The success of the sale, the Saratoga racing season, and the purses available for state-breds continue to provide proof the New York-bred program is moving in a positive direction. The figures and momentum mean New Yorkers will have to continue to step up their breeding programs with quality and some quantity to meet demand.

“The change has been really dramatic this year,” Browning said. “The market has begun to reward breeders for producing a quality product, and the racing rewards owners for having quality New York-breds. The quality of horses has skyrocketed.”

“What I kept hearing was the quality of the horses on the grounds was much better than it ever had been before,” Bendoroff said. “Our hole card had always been that our horses looked better than everyone else’s...well, I don’t think we had that advantage anymore.”

Thomas summed it up best, again, from a breeder and a buyer’s perspective.

“We’re no longer the welfare program we were when it (New York-bred program) started,” she said. “Gone are the days when we used to be able to breed to a second- or third-tier horse and think we were going to win all these restricted races. It is now a strong market for both buyers and sellers, so I was happy to maybe pay a little more and get outbid...and as a breeder, all I was thinking was, ‘What do I have in the pipeline?’” 🐾

Running from the Start

'Improbable' owner Frank Paolangeli is now in the game for the long haul

“It’s a long story,” Francis Paolangeli cautions when asked how he first got into horse racing. He doesn’t add that it’s also wildly improbable.

As he tells it, Paolangeli—Frank to his friends—was at the race-track in 1982 for one of the few times in his life. The native of Ithaca, N.Y., went to Finger Lakes with some friends who had purchased a yearling that had finally made it to the races, after a series of delays not uncommon in young horses.

After Call Me Slade had finished well off the board, his friend invited Paolangeli and his wife, Jeanne, back to the barn.

“So we went to the backside, and there’s this fellow walking a horse,” Paolangeli recounted. “I was up \$1,400 because I’d hit the last trifecta of the day, so I said to him, ‘Is that horse for sale?’ When he said yes, I said, ‘What’s his name and how much do you want for him? And will you take cash?’”

Eight-hundred dollars later Frank Paolangeli was the owner of a Thoroughbred racehorse.

“He had nice big knees and ankles,” he recalled, laughing. “I didn’t know anything about horses. I said, ‘Look how big his knees are! This is like a famous athlete.’”

The horse ran a few times for his new owner, never hitting the board, but instead of being discouraged, Paolangeli was hooked.

“Something just grabbed me, just took hold of me,” he said of Thoroughbred ownership. “I bought another one, then I bought two, then I claimed some, and that’s how we got to today.”

“Today” is owning about 40 horses, from weanlings to broodmares. He

keeps his six mares at Keane Stud near Amenia, N.Y.; his yearlings go to Ocala, Fla., or Kentucky. He used to own a farm in North Carolina that had its own training track, but, he said, absentee ownership was tough,

Nashua and the 2012 Lemon Drop Kid stakes. With 10 additional stakes-placings, he was a steady, reliable earner, the very quality that led, no doubt, to his being claimed in January by Mike Repole.



Frank and Jeanne Paolangeli at the Spa

and he eventually sold it. Pretty much all of his horses are New York-breds.

His breeding business began with Shelter Strait, whom he purchased for \$15,000 as a 2-year-old at the Fasig-Tipton February sale in 1986. She had five foals that made it to the races, beginning their racing careers with Paolangeli; all were winners, the best of them Ridden in Thestars (Cormorant), who earned nearly \$180,000.

His homebred Serenity’s Smile (Dixie Brass—Aggressivebynature, by Distinctive Pro), a multiple stakes-placed earner of nearly \$180,000, has produced some of Paolangeli’s best runners, including stakes winners Johannesburg Smile and Wildcat’s Smile, horses who for Paolangeli and his family epitomize the highs and lows of the racing business.

From October 2009 through this past January, Johannesburg Smile won eight races for Frank and Jeanne, including the 2011 Noble

But as hard as it is to see a beloved horse get claimed away, it’s nothing compared to seeing one break down, which had happened earlier in the month when Wildcat’s Smile suffered multiple fractures while racing on the lead in the Cat Cay Stakes. The multiple stakes winner, runner-up in the 2011 Demoiselle Stakes (gr. II), and earner of \$420,321, had to be euthanized on the track.

“I’ll never forget that,” said Paolangeli, distress evident in his voice. “I knew what happened as soon as she went down, and it broke my heart. She was probably the best horse I ever owned.”

Wildcat’s Smile was trained by Dominic Galluscio, whose relationship with Paolangeli goes back decades. Galluscio earned his 1,000th win earlier this year with Paolangeli’s Discreet Force, a Discreet Cat filly purchased as a yearling in 2011. Discreet Force won her first two starts and recently finished third in an al-

lowance/optional claiming race at Saratoga.

Charlton Baker trains his Finger Lakes horses.

"They're both fabulous trainers," Paolangeli said enthusiastically. "They're very good and very honest, and I talk to each probably once a day."

Paolangeli seldom travels to Belmont or Aqueduct to see his horses race, preferring to watch from his home in central New York. A site contractor who works primarily on Cornell University's construction projects, he prides himself on his work ethic, working hard during the day so that he can go home at night and indulge his racing interests with his wife of 46 years, who also helps out in the office of Paolangeli Contractors, the business he's owned for 40 years.

"At night, after dinner," said Jeanne, "we'll spend a couple of hours studying the *Form* and watching replays—that's his routine."

"She loves it as much as I do," said Frank. That may be true, but it's clearly he who enjoys the competition and the breeding; Jeanne, who says that she's on the shy side, admits that she likes the social element of going to the races and the people that she's met, particularly one racing luminary at Aqueduct many years ago.

"I saw Woody Stephens and his wife walk into the restaurant," she recalled, "and I don't know what

possessed me, but I said to myself, 'I'm going to do it. I'm going to meet him,' so I walked over and introduced myself."

It turned out the family of Stephen's wife, Lucille, had owned a department store in Ithaca, and the two women "had fun reminiscing" as they waited for their horses to run.

"Our horse happened to win that day," said Jeanne, "and Woody gave me a thumbs up after the race. Then his horse won, and he did it again. It made my day."

Both Frank and Jeanne acknowledge that their two grown sons, who live nearby and who have joined the family business, aren't much interested in horse racing. When they were younger, Frank used to make them help him pick out names for his horses.

"They named one 'Green Corn Flake;' they thought that would stop me from asking them. He wound up winning a couple of races," he said. "And, no, it didn't stop me from asking."

These days, grandson Angelo is the one who helps with the names, and having weathered the tough financial times in New York racing and breeding over the last decade, Paolangeli revels in the sport as much as he did at the beginning.

"I was never tempted to get out," he said. "I saw that someday, once the casino got straightened out, racing had a bright future in New York."

"Running a race is a thrill," he continued. "Winning is an even greater thrill, but I just want the horses to do well, and I want everyone—the horses, the jockeys—to come back safe and sound."

"No matter what level we're racing at, I get nervous and excited. If I lose that excitement," he said, "that's when I'll get out."

Which will not, it seems clear, be any time soon. 🐾

Reality Sets In

Escapefromreality upends Amberjack's Big Apple Triple bid

According to the official track program, *Escapefromreality*, winner of the Aug. 21 Albany Stakes at Saratoga Race Course, is owned in partnership by MeB Racing Stables and Brooklyn Boyz Stables. But according to Brooklyn Boyz' Anthony Bonomo Sr., the horse really belongs to his wife, Mary Ellen, from whose initials MeB gets its name.

"Where's my wife?" he asked in the winner's circle after the Albany as reporters circled him.

"You're the owner," he called to her, "so come here."

The Bonomos' horse had just foiled the Big Apple Triple dreams of the connections of Amberjack, who had won the Mike Lee Stakes at Belmont Park in June and the New York Derby at Finger Lakes Casino &

Racetrack last month. Had Amberjack swept the series, he would have won a \$250,000 bonus in addition to the owner's share of the \$150,000 purse of the Albany.

Instead, he had to settle for finishing second, two lengths behind *Escapefromreality*.

A son of Read the Footnotes out of the Medaglia d'Oro mare Queen of the City, *Escapefromreality* is a 3-year-old Brooklyn Boyz homebred. A close second, beaten just a neck by *Revolutionary* in the Withers Stakes (gr. III) at Aqueduct in February, *Escapefromreality* finished ninth a month later in the Gotham Stakes (gr. III) before taking four months off when a post-race scope detected a lung infection.

When he returned against state-bred company at Belmont Park in

July and won his return easily, the Bonomo family decided to keep him in restricted races and aim for the Albany.

"Dominick thinks he's the best New York-bred 3-year-old around," said Anthony Bonomo, referring to trainer Dominick Schettino. "And he thought that the Albany was a race he could run in because he could win it, and being a New York-bred, it's the premier race."

Though *Escapefromreality* came from off the pace in the Withers, he returned to his front-running style in the Albany and led favored Amberjack on a merry chase through the 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ -mile race over a fast Saratoga main track. Amberjack stayed within a length of the leader but couldn't get past him, *Escapefromreality* and

jockey Javier Castellano drawing off to win in a final time of 1:51.61.

"We were fortunate enough to win and now the decision is where do we go next," said Bonomo, "and that's up to Dominick and my son. They'll figure it out."

The Bonomo family's racing connections go beyond Anthony Sr. and Mary Ellen; their son Anthony Jr., 26, is their racing manager.

Ten years ago neither father nor son had ever been to Saratoga, despite years of Mary Ellen's pestering her husband to take a trip upstate from their home on Long Island. Growing up near Belmont Park, she'd gone to the races as a child, first with her father, then later as a teenager with her friends.

"My girlfriend's father used to be an assistant trainer," she said, sitting in the Saratoga clubhouse the day after the Albany. "When I was 12 or 13, I used to come up here with her."

Anthony grew up in Brooklyn—hence his stable's name—but while he went to the races occasionally, he said, he never really liked it.

"When these guys were little," he said, referring to his children, "my wife begged me to come to Saratoga like three years in a row, and I said, 'I don't want to go all the way up there to watch races. I don't want to do it.'"

Unrelenting, Mary Ellen finally convinced him, and in the summer of 2005, the family made its first visit. By the end of the weekend, after Mary Ellen mentioned wanting to own a racehorse, Anthony had picked out a stable name and the colors of his silks and applied for an owner's license. They bought their first horses two weeks later.

"I dragged him into it," she said.

"I was in high school at the time," said Anthony Jr. outside Schettino's barn. "I fell in love with this—the business, the intricacy, what it takes to get a horse to the races. When you're watching a race, you just see the horse run. You don't understand the entire back side of everything."

The younger Bonomo began work-

ing for Schettino and ultimately decided to focus on his family's horses, handling all the racing and breeding operations while studying for a master's degree in finance.

Asked about Escapefromreality's pedigree, Bonomo Sr. defers all questions to his son, even though it was the elder Bonomo who purchased Escapefromreality's dam. The daughter of Medaglia d'Oro out of the Distorted Humor mare Biogio's Beauty, Queen of the City was a \$52,000 purchase at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred Preferred yearling sale, but she never made it to the races.

"She was a beautiful, beautiful filly," said Bonomo Jr., "but as a 2-year-old, she just wasn't training very well. We took her out of training and noticed she was having a problem with her feet, and her feet just never got better after that."

Escapefromreality is her first foal, and in an attempt to decrease the size of a broodmare band that quickly grew to eight or nine, the Bonomos had, said Anthony Jr., given Queen of the City away. She has a 2011 filly by Utopia and sold for \$11,000 at the Keeneland January sale in 2012.

"We're trying to find her right now," said the younger Bonomo, with a twinge of regret that the family no longer owns her. "You never know; sometimes a mare can throw one good horse or five good horses, but at least we have her son."

The family initially raced only in the name of Brooklyn Boyz, but Mary Ellen decided she wanted her own stable name and her own racing silks, and so MeB Racing Stables was born. At first the family assigned horses to one stable or the other, but that was a short-lived experiment.

"Mine were winning more often," said Mary Ellen, "so we combined them."

"I knew," she went on mischievously, "that would be his way of dealing with it," referring to her husband.

"She was kicking my butt up here every year," said her husband with mock outrage. "We'd run six races, I'd win one, she'd win five. I said, 'I'm not having that.'"

So now their horses run for both stables; they run in the silks of whichever of the couple names the horse. He favors streets in his old Brooklyn neighborhood; she names them after friends or, in the case of their Albany winner, "crazy names," she said.

The sense of competition is feigned and exaggerated; the sense of family is not. Anthony and Mary Ellen's youngest daughter, Jaelyn, began riding horses after her parents got involved in racing; though their oldest, Julianne, isn't interested in the sport, she comes to Saratoga to spend time with her parents and siblings.

"In this world," said Anthony Sr., "there's so much stuff that pulls families apart. This is what pulls our family together."

The man who started the family on their racing path, Mary Ellen's father, took ill in July and couldn't be at Saratoga for the race; Anthony lost his mother and his sister a year ago. Four days before the Albany one of their horses broke down on the track and had to be euthanized.

"It's been a tough two years," admitted Anthony Sr. "And then when you have a win like that, it just makes you feel so good for a day."

"You escape reality," he said, making an unwitting pun, then paused to acknowledge it with a smile. "I mean, that's a great name, right?" 🐾

Bigger Is Bettor proves best in the Evan Shipman

New York-bred stakes wins at Saratoga are always special

The first New York-bred stakes race of the 2013 Saratoga meeting went to longtime New York breeders Chester and Mary Broman when their 5-year-old Bigger Is Bettor just got up to win the \$100,000 Evan Shipman Stakes July 22.

A head and two necks separated the top four finishers in the 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ -mile race over a fast track, with Bigger Is Bettor getting a ground-saving trip under jockey Joseph Rocco Jr., who

collected his first Saratoga stakes win with the victory. Sneaking up the rail, the gray/roan horse passed pacesetter Readthebyline and outfinished a closing Awesome Vision in 1:51.07.

Said trainer Rodrigo Ubillo, "He (jockey Joe Rocco Jr.) really listened to me. It's a big key. I gallop the horse in the morning, and he likes to fight with the jock. He's hard to make switch leads. In the morning I give him his head, and he loves it. No problem. In the afternoon when the

jocks start getting into him, he likes to fight. This kid today did perfect."

A Bromans homebred, Bigger Is Bettor is by Grand Reward out of the stakes-winning Regal Intention mare Regal Angela, with lifetime earnings of \$328,881. His last stakes victory came in the Albany Stakes at Saratoga in August 2011.

Another repeat Saratoga stakes winner, Saginaw, notched his fourth stakes victory this year when he took the John Morrissey Stakes Aug. 1,

winning the race for the second year in a row.

Bred by Ted Taylor, the 7-year-old gelding is by Peruvian out of the Devil's Bag mare Devilzene. He was claimed for \$30,000 by David Jacobson and Drawing Away Stable in March 2012 and has won 14 of 17 starts for his new connections.

"There is nothing left to say. He's an incredible horse," said Jacobson.

Stalking pacesetter B Shanny and heavily favored Saratoga Snacks, Saginaw took command in the stretch and held off the late-charging Mine Over Matter to win by 1¾ lengths, running the 6½ furlongs in 1:16.47 over a muddy, sealed track.

"He just has the biggest heart and he's out there to compete," said Jacobson. "He especially loves Saratoga."

Saginaw has won his last three starts at the track in upstate New York.

"He loves it up here," continued Jacobson. "He really thrives. We graze him; we take him out in the day; he really enjoys being here. Hopefully, we'll be back again next year."

Jacobson said that winning the John Morrissey, named for the man who established racing in Saratoga 150 years ago, was especially meaningful.

"Because of who he was and what he did for racing...It was just very interesting and I enjoyed it," he said. Winning the race in the year that Saratoga celebrates its racing sesquicentennial was, he said, "the icing on the cake."

The following week the two homebred winners of the Stallion Series at Belmont Park came back to take the series here, and progeny of Frost Giant continued to show why that stallion's 2013 book increased three-fold over the last year.

After winning the Spectacular Bid division of the

Stallion Series Stakes in June, West Hills Giant captured the Cab Callo-way division at Saratoga Aug. 7 when longshot Orino was disqualified and placed second.

Over an inner turf course rated firm, Orino under Luis Saez raced in the two-path, with West Hills Giant and Edgar Prado hugging the rail. Attempting to come through an open-

ing in the stretch, West Hills Giant was crowded by Orino approaching the wire, impeded enough that the stewards saw fit to reverse the order of finish.

"I thought we lost fair and square," said Robert Castelli, whose Long Island Racing Stables owns West Hills Giant in partnership with Sunrise Stables and Gina Bentivegna. "Then we saw the replay...he was cut off, and I think he was a faster horse."

"Orino's a great horse and ran a great race," Castelli said. "I don't like to win like this, but we'll take it."

The final time of the race was 1:36.18.

West Hills Giant was the 3-5 favorite in the race and is out of the Take Me Back mare Outtawesthills, who is back in foal to Frost Giant and who has a yearling full brother to West Hills Giant.

On Aug. 8, the Frost Giant filly Frosty Bay took the

Statue of Liberty division for her second consecutive stakes win, following her victory in the \$100,000 Cupecoy's Joy Stakes at Belmont. Racing midpack over a yielding inner turf course under jockey Javier Castellano, the 3-year-old dispatched her rivals with ease with a two-length win in 1:37.29 for the mile.

Owner/breeder Robert Rosenthal, who owns and bred the filly with his brother, Peter, was wearing his lucky hat in the winner's circle.

"Everyone makes fun of me, but we won this race last year with me wearing this hat," he said, beaming, referring to last summer's Cupecoy's Joy won by My Jopia, co-owned and co-bred by Rosenthal with Bernice Waldbaum. "I wore it again, and (Frosty Bay) won it. We are happy, and I will wear this hat all the time."

Trained by Dominick Schettino, Frosty Bay is the third foal—and third winner—out of the Wild Again mare Baymont, claimed by Rosenthal for \$40,000 in February 2004. In addition to her dual stakes-winning 3-year-old, she has a 2-year-old Posse filly named Missy Bay in training at Saratoga. Baymont delivered a filly by Golden Missile in March and is in foal to Eskendereya for 2014.

"We're really thankful and happy," said Rosenthal. "This is as exciting as it gets. We've been breeding for 20 years, and to win a stakes race in Saratoga with a homebred is just a wonderful, wonderful experience."

"The New York-bred program is just a great program, and I proudly wear my pin," he said, gesturing to his New York Thoroughbred Breeders pin, "and I'm wearing my hat. So,

on to more."

Another fan of New York-breds is Steve Taglienti, breeder and owner of Hangover Kid, winner of the \$150,000 West Point Stakes Aug. 15. He races as Four Tags Stable.

The son of Lemon Drop Kid raced in last through much of the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile race on an inner turf course labeled "good," swinging out into the middle of the track under Irad Ortiz Jr. and steadily gaining ground to win by a length in 1:43.34.

Hangover Kid is out of the Rakeen mare Absolute Patience, who was bred by Taglienti's stable manager Bruce Grossman in partnership with Thomas J. Moran and is a half sister to the multiple graded stakes winner Who Did It and Run.

Though a New Jersey resident who also races at Monmouth, Taglienti is "invested," he said, in the New York program.

"It all started with Bruce Grossman leading the way," he said.

Taglienti has been involved in racing for nearly a quarter of a

century, but the West Point is his first stakes victory.

"(Trainer) Jason Servis has done great," he said. "He pointed him to this race, and we're thrilled. I'm so proud of the team; they're just so unbelievable."

"Jason has done a tremendous job with all of our horses," he continued.

SARATOGA HOT SHOTS

Quick 2-year-olds are always a hot commodity at Saratoga Race Course, and a pair of New York-breds caught the eye of race fans early in the meet. Z R J Stables' Sol the Freud drew clear by 3¼ lengths in his debut Aug. 2 under John Velazquez. Bred by Tony Grey and Tass Thoroughbred Partners, Sol the Freud is a full brother to the grade I-winning New York-bred Franny Freud and is out of the D'Accord mare Frankly Fran. He was a \$90,000 Ocala Breed-

ers' Sales Co. March 2-year-old sale purchase earlier this year and is trained by David Cannizzo. On Aug. 16 Chester and Mary Broman's homebred Artemis Agrotera won a \$70,000 state-bred maiden special race by 11¾ lengths with Joel Rosario aboard for trainer Michael Hushion. The daughter of Roman Ruler is out of the grade II-placed A.P. Indy mare Indy Glory and is a half sister to a pair of stakes-placed runners.

"He gives them time."

While owners and breeders were professing their support for the New York breeding program, 4-year-old Dayatthespa was affirming her affinity for Saratoga, winning here for the third consecutive year in the \$150,000 Yaddo Stakes Aug. 16.

Tracking pacesetting Sally's Dream on a firm inner turf course, the City Zip filly cruised to an easy lead in the stretch, running the 1¼ miles in 1:42.57 with a winning margin of 1¾ lengths.

"It's very special to win a race at Saratoga," said Steve Laymon, who co-owns the filly with Jerry Frankel,

Ronald Frankel, and Bradley Thoroughbreds. "Everybody tells you that, right?"

A lot of people do, but not all of them have an undefeated filly here.

"It's pretty nice to win up here three years in a row," he said.

Out of the Doc's Leader mare M'Lady Doc, Dayatthespa was bred by Castellare DiCracchiolo Stable, Cracchiolo & Goldsher. She was purchased privately by Laymon and Peter Bradley of Bradley Thoroughbreds. They brought in additional partners once she started winning. The filly has a record of eight wins and two second-place finishes from

12 starts.

"She was just too valuable not to take some of that money off the table," said Laymon. Dayatthespa has currently earned \$743,892.

She became a grade I winner at Keeneland last year when she won the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes, and Laymon suggested she could return to Keeneland for another race this year.

"(The Yaddo) is a good building block," he explained. "We won (the Riskaverse Stakes) here last year and then went down and won the Queen Elizabeth, so a repeat performance at Keeneland would be quite nice." 🐾


