An August to Remember

I THINK THE CONSENSUS IS IN: This Saratoga season has been sensational for every stakeholder in the New York breeding community. Once again the Fasig-Tipton New York preferred sale of New York-bred yearlings climbed into record territory, a pair of New York-breds won grade I stakes at the Spa, and the inaugural Saratoga Showcase Day program the day after the Travers Stakes (gr. I) was a smashing success.

The headline for this year's New York-bred yearling sale is that interest in Empire-breds continues to strengthen among a diverse group of buyers. On the heels of a record-breaking edition of the sale in 2013, the average price this summer climbed 11% to \$80,108 and the median rose 18% to \$65,000.

I've made the point before, but it bears repeating: the average price for a horse this year is more than double the \$39,106 average in 2010. As Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning told the *Wall Street Journal* in a feature article on the demand for New York-breds, "It's been a phenomenal change, and it has not been replicated anywhere in the industry."

Once again we also had standouts at the select sale. Ten New York-breds changed hands for an average price of \$223,750 and a median of \$157,500. The New York-bred topper was a bay colt by Awesome Again bred by Camelia J. Casby who was purchased by the powerhouse partnership of Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton for \$700,000 and was the co-fifth highest-priced yearling overall. Two other New York-breds had surpassed the \$300,000 mark by the time the hammer fell.

On the racetrack, standout performances continued to show off the quality of our breeding program. I need go no further than this year's Ballerina Stakes (gr. I) on Travers day. Four serious contenders in the field of nine were New York-breds, and the race was won by Artemis Agrotera, a 3-year-old facing elders, with one of the most dominant performances of the meet. It certainly didn't hurt either that the Ballerina

was part of the nationwide NBC Sports telecast. Palace blazed the Saratoga grade I trail by winning the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap early in the month. And all meet long we have seen an impressive array of 2-year-olds that will supply plenty of excitement in the New York-bred ranks and beyond down the road.

Saratoga Showcase Day—designed to round off Travers week with a bang—did just that. It was very effective for keeping our program into the national spotlight at a time when all eyes are fixed on Saratoga Springs. Apparently it was also good business. Although figures for handle are no longer available, attendance was up considerably. On the day after the Travers last year, the attendance was 18,706; this year the New York Racing Association reported a figure of 24,843.

I would be remiss in a recap of our program's achievements this summer if I failed to mention two more August highlights. Thanks to the generosity of two New York Thoroughbred Breeders board members, we were able to award two substantial scholarships on NYRA's college day: the inaugural Debby Malloy Winkler New York Thoroughbred Breeders Scholarship donated by Mrs. Vivien Malloy, and the third annual Gerald A. Nielsen, Sr. New York Thoroughbred Breeders Scholarship donated by Mrs. Gerald A. Nielsen.

Another longtime board member brought our program into prominence in another way. Chester Broman, along with his wife, Mary, the owners/breeders of Artemis Agrotera, enjoyed extraordinary success throughout the meet with their New York homebreds, from first-time starters to stakes horses. As the Bromans kept hovering near the top of the owner's standings, their success became a routine part of the daily headlines.


I firmly believe our goal as a regional breeding program should be to strive to transcend the label "regional" and make ourselves relevant nationally. I believe this summer we truly arrived.



STATE-BREDS CHALK UP A PAIR OF GRADE I WINS AT THE SPA

New York-breds get plenty of exposure at the Saratoga meet, and a pair of state-breds found top-level success during the stand by scoring grade I wins. On Aug. 2, New York-bred Palace won the \$350,000 Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap for Antonino Miuccio and trainer Linda Rice; then, on Aug. 23 Chester and Mary Broman's Artemis Agrotera stepped out to star on Travers Day by winning the \$500,000 Ballerina Stakes (gr. I) by 6½ lengths over 2011 champion My Miss Aurelia.

One of four state-breds in the field and the lone sophomore, Artemis Agrotera sat just off the pace set by La Verdad in the seven-furlong Ballerina. The opening fractions were :23.14 and :45.78. La Verdad held a one-length lead coming into the stretch before jockey Rajiv Maragh went to work on the daughter of Roman Ruler—Indy Glory, by A.P. Indy. Artemis Agrotera responded and "was pretty dominant" and "much the best" according to her rider after getting the trip in 1:21.89.

A winner last year of the Frizette Stakes (gr. I) after breaking her maiden at Saratoga by 11¾ lengths, Artemis Agrotera was the 7-2 second choice in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I) but came home a lackluster fifth. She made her 2014 debut in the TVG Acorn Stakes (gr. I) on Belmont Stakes Day, finishing eighth, but tipped her hand with a 10¼-length laugher against allowance optional claiming types July 23 at the Spa. If you're keeping score, that's three starts at Saratoga and three wins by a combined margin of 28½ lengths.

A Breeders' Cup "Win & You're In" race for the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I), it appears she'll be heading back to Santa Anita for this year's World Championships.

The Ballerina winner was foaled at the Bromans' Chestertown Farm near Chestertown, N.Y. She is the last live foal from Indy Glory, who delivered a dead foal by Noonmark in 2012 and has come up barren the last two years.

"She's at the farm and back in foal to Pioneerof the Nile,"

said farm manager Jeff Raine. "She missed a couple of years on us, but we think she's going to be all right this year."

Palace, a \$20,000 claim by Rice, earned his first grade I victory in the \$350,000 Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap Aug. 2 at Saratoga Race Course.

Reeling in 8-5 favorite Happy My Way in the final sixteenth of the six-furlong test after that rival set the pace throughout, Palace closed from second on a fast track to finish the race in 1:08.56 under jockey Cornelio Velasquez. Palace topped \$1 million in career earnings with the victory.

Velasquez gave Palace a ground-saving trip from the rail behind Happy My Way's opening quarter in :22.13 and a half in :44.49, then shifted outside to grind down the center of the track with the tiring front-runner in his sights. Five-eighths went in :56.15 as the 5-year-old son of City Zip trailed by two lengths, but Palace surged in deep stretch to carry him past by one length.

"This horse really has a strong finish, and once he switched to his right lead and he was in reach of (Happy My Way)—he's such a tremendous competitor—I knew that he would get to him," Rice said.

Palace came off a second-place finish in the July 5 Belmont Sprint Championship Stakes (gr. III) and prior to that had won the June 6 True North Stakes (gr. II), both at Belmont Park. He also owns a victory in the 2013 Fall Highweight Handicap (gr. III), earned at Aqueduct Racetrack last November.

Peter J. Callahan Revocable Trust bred Palace out of the End Sweep mare Receivership. The bay horse was a \$160,000 purchase by Doug Cauthen from the 2011 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March selected sale of 2-year-olds in training when consigned by Crupi's New Castle Farm, agent.

Palace raced four times for WinStar Farm and Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott before he was claimed by Rice out of a maiden heat at Belmont in October 2012.

The Vanderbilt victory improved his record to 10-5-2 from 20 starts for earnings of \$1,009,550.

TEN NY-BREDS SELL AT F-T SARATOGA

Ten of the 12 New York-breds offered during the two-day Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling auction Aug. 4-5 changed hands (including one private sale) for an average price of \$223,750 and median of \$157,500. In the sale at large, the major indicators dipped slightly compared to last year. The average of \$291,965 was down 1.1%, and the median fell 5% to \$237,500.

Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton purchased the top-selling New York-bred, going to \$700,000 in the second session for a bay colt by Awesome Again out of the stakes-producing Lord At War mare Zambezi Belle. The colt was the co-fifth highest-priced yearling overall.


Bred by Camelia J. Casby and foaled Feb. 18, 2013, at Hidden Lake Farm near Otisville, the colt has five winning siblings led by Zambezi Belle's second foal Law Enforcement. Bred and campaigned by Casby and trained by Mark Hennig, Law Enforcement (by Posse) won four stakes for New York-breds and earned \$458,638. Zambezi Belle's filly Tough Market (by Suave) is a multiple winner and earner of more than \$100,000.

Zambezi Belle's offspring have found success in the sales ring before. At the 2012 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale her Exchange Rate yearling colt Shimba was purchased by Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation for \$320,000 as the second top-selling lot of the sale.

John Moynihan, adviser to Stonestreet, explained the appeal of the colt: "He's a really pretty horse. He's a big, strong horse, an Awesome Again. He looks like he'll run far and looks like he'll be a classic-type horse."

Two other New York-breds surpassed the \$300,000 mark. A colt from the first crop of champion Uncle Mo bred by Thomas Mina and foaled at Jeffrey Tucker's Stone Bridge Farm near Gansevoort, was purchased by Ice Wine Stable and Aisling Duignan for \$375,000. Consigned by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield Farm, the colt is out of stakesplaced Southern Charmer (by Dixie Union). Mina purchased the half sister to the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Frac Daddy at the 2010 Keeneland November breeding stock sale for \$130,000.

Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock adviser John Ferguson, the sale's leading buyer, signed the ticket for Hip 126, a daughter of Kitten's Joy who brought \$350,000 as the top New York-bred filly. The dark bay or brown filly is out of Wild Chant (by War Chant), who is a half sister Untapable (by Tapit), winner of the Longines Kentucky Oaks (gr. I), and to grade I winner Paddy O'Prado (by El Prado). The filly was bred by Gallagher's Stud where she was foaled last March 23 and consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud. Gallagher's Stud purchased Wild Chant at the 2011 Keeneland November sale for \$300,000.

Willcox Inn to Saratoga Stud

Roy and Gretchen Jackson and All In Stable have announced the retirement of millionaire and multiple graded stakes winner Willcox Inn (Harlan's Holiday—De Aar, by Gone West) to stand at Saratoga Stud near Stillwater. His 2015 stud fee will be \$7,500.

A graded stakes winner or graded-placed each year over four seasons from ages 2 to 5, Willcox Inn was trained by Michael Stidham for the Jacksons' Lael Stable and All In Stable. The connections plan to give strong support to Willcox Inn and his progeny.

Willcox Inn retired with a record of six wins, four seconds and four thirds in 22 starts and earnings of \$1,015,543. He was bred by Dr. John Chandler and raised and sold by Mill Ridge Farm.

Suzie O'Cain said, "We are thrilled the New York breeders will get a chance to send their best mares to this talented son of the late Harlan's Holiday. Willcox Inn was a quality, consistent graded stakes winner."

Willcox Inn won his debut at 2 over eventual Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner and champion 3-year-old male Animal Kingdom. In his second start he finished third in Keeneland's Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) and in his third and final start as a juvenile he was a closing third the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (gr. IIT) at Churchill Downs.

Willcox Inn won the first two legs of the Mid-America Triple Crown at 3: the Arlington Classic Stakes and the American Derby (gr. IIT). Later in the year he won the Hawthorne Derby (gr. IIIT).

Willcox Inn won his first start at 4 and ran in three grade I stakes that year, finishing second in the Shadwell Turf Mile Stakes (gr. IT) to eventual two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan. At 5 Willcox Inn finished on the board in six of eight starts, winning the Washington Park Handicap (gr. III).

OBITUARY: ELISABETH JERKENS

Elisabeth Jerkens, a longtime Thoroughbred owner and breeder who was married to Hall of Fame trainer H. Allen Jerkens since 1987, died the morning of Aug. 3 in South Florida at the age of 86. The cause of death was heart failure.

She campaigned her horses under the name of Hardwicke Stables. Among her homebreds were a pair of top-level New York-breds: Spite the Devil and Becky's Flute.

Spite the Devil, won the Withers Stakes (gr. III) at Aqueduct in 2003 and was a two-time winner of the Evan Shipman Handicap at Saratoga and the Empire Classic Handicap at Belmont. He won eight of 46 races and earned \$849.512.

"I just love the breeding business, especially the mares, who I want to

hold onto for dear life," Jerkens told *Daily Racing Form* in 2003. "I've always been fascinated by gene pools.

Some of our mares weren't great runners, but they had pedigrees I liked."










Five Questions for...

Cary Frommer has been involved in the Thoroughbred industry for more than 30 years. The daughter of an Army officer, she traveled the globe before settling in Aiken, S.C., working for trainers such as Hall of Famer Mack Miller. She began yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking in 1999 and has had grade I success with the likes of Joyful Victory and Dance to Bristol, and grade II winners Trappe Shot and More Chocolate. The second-leading buyer by gross at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred sale Aug. 9-10 in Saratoga, Cary found time to talk with Evan Hammonds of *New York Breeder* once she returned home.



You're based in South Carolina. What makes that the ideal spot for your operation?

The climate is more moderate than up north in New York and more moderate than down south in Florida. The horses get enough cold weather where it is actually healthy for them and healthy for their coats. I personally am at the Aiken Training Center, which has one of the best surfaces in the country.

Tell us something about your process in selecting yearlings. What are looking for when you go to a sale?

First of all, before I scrutinize the pedigree too much, I try to get some sire power because I resell, and you need that to sell. And then I look at the individuals. Once I narrow down the individuals I like, then I scrutinize the pedigree a little. I allow a little lapse if it is a nice individual. One thing about my program is that we've made a lot of pedigrees because when I bought the horse there wasn't much there and the horse went on to be a nice horse. I'm not afraid to make a pedigree. They do have to be nice, athletic individuals.

Speaking of 'sire power,' which sires pique your interest at the moment?

Curlin is so hot. I was lucky to get a New York-bred Curlin at the sale and I'm very excited about her. I've always been a fan of Majestic Warrior; I think he's underrated. I bought a really nice Majestic Warrior at the New York sale, and I had a couple of Super Savers last year. I wasn't able to get any of them this year. I think he's off to a great start and so is War-

rior's Reward. I had a few last year but couldn't get close to him this year.

Then there are the old standards. I bought a Grand Slam in Kentucky (Fasig-Tipton July sale), and I love Grand Slam. I've had nothing but good luck with the Grand Slams.


Is there a premium on a New York-bred yearling these days?

Absolutely. I've been buying at the Fasig-Tipton New York sale for years and every year a few things have happened, especially the last few years with the expanded purses. The yearlings are getting much harder to buy, and they have much better pedigrees—giving us reasons to pay that much more for them. If you can get the whole package with a New Yorkbred, then you will be very well rewarded.


How has the New York-bred sale advanced over the years?

The New York-bred buyers in the past weren't flashy buyers. For the most part they stuck to a price range. The yearling buyers had to step up a little this year, and I'm hoping the 2-year-old buyers will step up a little, too.

When I started going to the sale (in the mid 1990s), they were shaggy little ponies. Now they are prepped better and they look a little healthier. They kind of have the "Kentucky prep" thing going on there now. There was nothing wrong with buying good, healthy, robust horses, but now the breeders and consignors realize they have to have good size, they have to have good bone, and they are raising them accordingly.



Interest in state-bred yearlings continues to advance; preferred sale figures advance **AT THE FASIG-TIPTON SELECT** yearlings sales in Saratoga Springs on Aug 4-5, New York-bred horses made their presence known. The connections of three of racing's biggest operations—Stonestreet Farm, Coolmore, and Darley—purchased high-priced New York-breds, with Stonestreet and George Bolton paying \$700,000, the fifth-highest price of the sale, for an Awesome Again colt out of Zambezi Belle.

The activity augured well, said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, for the Aug. 9-10 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale.

"Seeing what happened at the select sale," said Cannizzo in the days leading up to the state-bred sale, "I think New York is starting to eliminate the perception that this is a regional market. I think that's all going to transition to the New York-bred sale."

And transition it did, with national and international buyers such as Mandy Pope, Hubert Guy, and Art Preston signing tickets, some for the first time at a New Yorkbred sale.

"You had new faces and buyers from all over the country," said Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning.

The 316 horses cataloged represented a 5% increase over the 2013 sale. Though 20 fewer horses—176—sold this year compared to last year, the average price increased 10.5% from \$72,480 to \$80,108. The median was also up, 18.2% to \$65,000 from \$55,000 in 2013.

The gross for the two-night sale was \$14,099,000, a dip of just \$107,000.

"The New York racing program is no longer just for folks in New York," said Browning, "It has reached national prominence and national interest."

The diversity of purchasers suggests the strength of the market for New York-breds, particularly for the highest quality individuals. Known for buying fillies and mares to add to her broodmare band, which includes 2011 Horse of the Year Havre de Grace and two-time Eclipse champion Groupie Doll, Florida's Pope purchased the

sale-topper, a Lookin At Lucky filly out of Rose Rhapsody for \$270,000, consigned by Rhapsody Farm/Hidden Lake Farm.

"She's a very lovely filly, well-balanced, with a good mind on her," said Pope. "I was determined to get her."

Pope purchased two other fillies and a Discreet Cat—Loving Lucy colt, spending \$510,000.


Bloodstock agent Guy, a first-time buyer at the sale, purchased two six-figure horses. A \$250,000 Tizway filly out of the Crafty Friend mare Free as Tristan, consigned by Marshall W. Silverman, was the highest price on the first night of the sale and is a half sister to the multiple stakeswinning New York-bred Amberjack (by

On the second night he bought a Super Saver colt out of That's OK for \$230,000, consigned by Baccari Bloodstock.

bought in the select sale and then additionally at the New York-bred sale, you have a whole cast of characters that are national and international figures buying New York-bred yearlings, and that's a very good thing for breeders; it's a good thing for racing, and, overall, it's just good for the New York breeding program."

New York-based Jeff Treadway bought two horses, a Scat Daddy filly out of Follow Your Bliss, also consigned by Silverman, for \$130,000 and a colt from second-crop sire Eskendereya out of Sarah's Pleasure, consigned by Indian Creek, agent, for \$140,000.

"I think the biggest difference is the quality of sire we're seeing in the sale," he said. "You walk in saying, 'We're not looking for a New York-bred; we're just looking for a good horse,' and if it happens to be a New York bred, then all the better because of the options you have."

New York-based trainer Nick Zito, who as agent was the sale's leading buyer, spending \$730,000 on five horses, echoed Treadway. Among Zito's purchases was a \$200,000 Girolamo colt out of Thin Disguise. Girolamo began his breeding career at Sequel Stallions New York and stood the 2014 season at Darley in Kentucky.

"These are the kinds of horses we want," Zito said. "They've got the New York label next to them. They've also got enough pedigree. Darley owns this stud and brought him back to Kentucky."

Zito also purchased a \$230,000 colt by Ice Box, the horse he trained to a win in the 2010 Florida Derby (gr. I) and a runner-up finish in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

"I'm partial to Ice Box, and I think he's going to make it as a stud," said Zito. "This is a nice horse, and he had all the qualifications."

"And a lot of people forget I trained one of the greatest New York breds of all time," he continued, referring to Commentator, a multiple graded stakes winner who won the Whitney Handicap (gr. I) twice.

Elliott Walden, president and CEO of WinStar Farm, was also active, purchasing through Maverick Racing two colts by WinStar stallions on the second night of the sale.

Walden went to \$180,000 for a Super Saver colt out of Tartan Lady, consigned by Thorndale Farm as agent. Earlier in

the day two Super Saver colts had won at Saratoga Race Course: Market Conduct broke his maiden in his debut, and I Spent It won the Toyota Saratoga Special Stakes (gr. II), pushing the 2010 Kentucky Derby winner to the top of the first-crop sire list.

While Walden acknowledged that the winners across the street from the sales grounds might have increased interest for the stallion's progeny, he said he expects them to perform well all year. Of the colt he bought, Walden said, "He looks like the rest of them (Super Saver's offspring), and he has a great mind. He just comes in here and acts like he's been

here his whole life, and that's something that has been a characteristic of all of them."

Walden also signed the ticket for \$150,000 on a Bellamy Road colt out of Rule One, consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

If there were one sour note in an otherwise upbeat sale, it was the 35.3% RNA rate, perhaps an unintended result of the state's racing and breeding program. Browning remarked that rather than sell horses for less than desirable prices, New York breeders might prefer to keep their horses instate to take advantage of the lucrative purses and breeders' awards funded by video lottery terminal revenue from the Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct.

"It makes sense," he said. "It's the market reality of the New York bred program."


Other sales opportunity also beckons.

"(Consignors) can work the private

"(Consignors) can work the private marketplace; they can try to sell them on a post-sale basis; they can bring them to our sales in Kentucky or the Mid-Atlantic, or to a 2-year-old sale," he said.

On the plus side he pointed out that the horses that sold were "blowing past the reserves."

"All the horses we had that were just really awesome individuals, extremely athletic and good-sized, good-looking horses, we had no problem (selling





them)," said Katie Taylor-Marshall, assistant to the vice president of boarding and sales coordinator of Taylor Made Sales, which consigned 17 horses at the sale.

While consignors welcomed the robustness of the top of the market, they acknowledged that the market for lower-priced horses had all but disappeared.

"Outside those really top-end horses, you had to work a little harder to get things done," said Taylor-Marshall. "It seems like where those purses are, everybody's after the top, elite horses."

Select Sales' Carrie Brogden, who brought 21 horses to the sale, experi-

enced first-hand the increasing selectivity of the sale.

"In years past," said Brogden, "you used to be able to walk up with a horse with minor issues and still get them done. Now you have to take them to 2-year-old sales or race them to prove they're sound."

Six of the horses she consigned failed to meet their reserves, with two being sold privately post-sale.

By the end of the sale, seven horses initially listed as "not sold" had found purchasers. Browning said that the sales office was "very busy" on the Monday morning following the sale with private sales that are not included in the official sales results.

"In general," Brogden said, "I'm very thrilled and happy to bits for the horses we had. My clients had very realistic reserves and expectations for what they are. They far exceeded their reserves."

While Browning said that no dramatic changes were in the work for next year's sale, given this year's success, he conceded that the changes in the market might lead to reconsideration of next year's catalog.

"Clearly we would have liked to do a better job in the selection process to the replace the bottom 40 or 50 horses with better horses," he said, "or if not, not have them. There's probably a limited market for those horses worth \$25,000."

"People used to come with \$25,000 and had a chance to buy a quality horse," he continued. "As the median has moved up, there are fewer buyers here at the bottom end than there would have been two or three years ago."


"This is an expensive place to be in the month of August if you're on a budget and looking for a bargain," said Browning. "It's probably not realistic to expect it if the market is good."

State-breds sparkle on Showcase Day at the Spa **THE NEW YORK RACING** Association capped its summer state-bred stakes program with the inaugural Saratoga Showcase Day Aug. 24, featuring six stakes races worth \$1.15 million.

The main event was the nine-furlong Albany Stakes, the third leg of the Big Apple Triple. The first, the seven-furlong Mike Lee Stakes at Belmont Park May 31 on Big Apple Showcase Day, was won by Barry K. Schwartz' homebred Captain Serious;

Empire Dreams, owned by West Point Thoroughbreds, took the 11/16-mile New York Derby at Finger Lakes July 12. Both horses were back to contest the Albany, named for New York's capital city, located about 30 miles from Saratoga.

But, fittingly, it was Albany native Patricia Schuler's So Lonesome who got the win, Schuler's first in a stakes race at Saratoga.

"This has to be the greatest ever," said Schuler in the winner's circle.

Purchased by Schuler for \$55,000 at the August 2012 Fasig-Tipton preferred sale of New York-bred yearlings, So Lonesome never had an anxious moment in the Albany, going to the lead un-

der jockey Jose Lezcano and repelling a mild bid by Captain Serious coming around the final turn. Asked by Lezcano in the stretch, the 3-year-old son of Awesome Again responding willingly to win by four lengths in 1:50.17.

Out of the General Meeting mare Dash for Money, So Lonesome was bred by Waterville Lake Stables and is the second stakes winner for his dam. Four of her five foals have earned more than \$100,000.

Schuler was accompanied by 89-year-old Frank B. Murphy, a longtime family friend who served in World War II, Vietnam, and Korea.

"I've been coming to Saratoga since 1947," Murphy said. "This is the best day. I'm 89, and even if I had a heart attack, I'd die with a smile."

Schuler ran her first horses at Saratoga last summer, when two firsttime starters won in the same week.

"I thought nobody could top that," she said, "but today did."

Earlier this month Schuler purchased a Giant's Causeway—Jesse's Justice colt for \$200,000 at the New York-bred sale.

"We now have four New York-breds," she said. "I love New York racing. It's so much fun and it's great to be here.

"Saratoga's the best. It really is."

Just Another Day

If horses could talk, Dayatthespa would no doubt echo Schuler's sentiments. The 5-year-old City Zip mare named for Saratoga won the \$150,000 Yaddo Stakes for the second year in a row, giving her four victories in five starts at Saratoga. Her lone loss came earlier this summer, a second-place finish in the Fasig-Tipton De La Rose

Stakes off an eight-month layoff.

Out of M'Lady Doc (by Doc's Leader) and purchased privately as a 2-year-old, Dayatthespa is owned by Jerry Frankel, Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon, and Bradley Thoroughbreds and has won a race at Saratoga in each of the last four years.

Allowed to set an uncontested slow pace under leading jockey Javier Castellano throughout the 1½-mile Yaddo, Dayatthespa drew off in the stretch to win by 2½ lengths in 1:41.93.

Sidelined by bone bruising, Dayatthespa has shown no signs of slowing down in her return to the races.

"(Bone bruising) isn't unusual for a horse that's had a four-year campaign," said partner Peter Bradley. "It's one of those things that if you give them the time, they usually come back to their old form. You hold your breath, but she just put in two great races."

Her successful comeback has no doubt been aided by returning to Saratoga.

"She thrives on the Spa," said Bradley of the Chad Brown trainee.

A multiple graded stakes winner who counts Keeneland's Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes (gr. IT) among her victories, Dayatthespa was named by Laymon's wife Barbara. Residents of North Carolina, they also own a home

in Saratoga and have been coming to the upstate New York town for nearly 20 years.

"We love it up here," said Barbara. "It's just a special place for us."

Still the King

Graded stakes winner King Kreesa got his first Saratoga win in the 8½-furlong West Point Stakes, prevailing by a head over Lubash in a hard-fought stretch run.

Making his first start since finishing 12th in the Longines Hong Kong Mile (HK-I) in December, the son of King Cugat—Storm's Advance, by Storm Creek, is owned by Gerald and Susan Kresa, who have a majority stake in his breeding as former members of Horse Partners.

"We saw an ad for Horse Partners in the *Daily Racing Form*, so we made a phone call," said Gerald. "That's how we got involved in horse racing, and everything turned out great for us after that."

The Minneapolis residents have since left the partnership, racing and breeding in their own name, a name their horses often share, but with a different spelling to enable the correct pronunciation.

The Kresas acknowledged some concern about how their horse would do after such a long layoff, but his determination in the stretch left no doubt as to his fitness, thanks to trainer David Donk.

Setting a slow early pace under jockey Irad Ortiz Jr., King Kreesa had an easy lead until fellow graded stakes winner Lubash challenged him in a neckand-neck duel to the wire. Despite the quickening pace, the dark bay or brown gelding refused to cede to his rival, digging in to win in a final time of 1:42.07.

"He was training so well and he's such a fighter," said Kresa. "He did a fantastic job."

Star in the Making

A day after their New York-bred homebred Artemis Agrotera won the \$500,000 Ballerina Stakes (gr. I) on the Travers Day undercard, Chester and Mary Broman were back in the winner's circle, this time for the nine-furlong Fleet Indian Stakes with their 3-year-old filly Star Grazing.

A homebred by Sky Mesa out of the Unbridled mare Unbridled Star, Star Grazing under jockey Angel Arroyo wore down favored Flipcup in the stretch for the three-quarter-length victory in 1:53.40.

After developing a splint as a 2-yearold, Star Grazing spent the winter at the Bromans' farm near Chestertown, not far from Saratoga, returning to the races in July at Belmont Park to break her maiden. She's undefeated in three

Trained by Jimmy Jerkens, Star Grazing is a half sister to the Bromans'

multiple stakes-winning Friend Or Foe and two other earners of more than \$150,000. The Bromans purchased Unbridled Star in 2002 for \$115,000; earlier this year she foaled a Girolamo colt described by the Bromans' farm manager Jeff Raine as "a nice, big, strong colt."

The win in the Fleet Indian was the Bromans' ninth of the summer meeting, putting them into a tie with Repole Stable for leading owner and establishing a new benchmark for the stable's success at Saratoga.

"Usually our limit is about five," said Chester Broman, decked out in green to reflect his stable colors. "This is 20 years in the making."

The Bromans have bred and raced horses in New York for decades, committed to the state's program during times of uncertainty and instability, long before current purse structures and breeding incentives made New Yorkbreds a financially enticing prospect.

"Everybody ought to know this is the greatest guy for the Thoroughbred breeding business," said Raine of Broman. "There ought to be more like him, but there aren't. He's a smart businessman, and his heart's in it."

Myfourchix All Class

After 10 years in Thoroughbred racing, Clear Stars Stable got its first Saratoga stakes win when 2-year-old My-

fourchix closed into a testing pace in the \$196,000 Seeking the Ante Stakes, overcoming heavily favored Hard to Stay Notgo to win the 6½-furlong race by three lengths in 1:20.34.

Named for partner Steve Ruvituso's wife and three daughters, Myfourchix was purchased by Clear Stars, formed by a group of Albany State University alumni and trainer Rick Schosberg, for \$90,000 earlier this year at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April 2-year-old sale. Out of the Tapit mare Stellaluna, she was bred by Dr. Charles Kidder and Nancy Cole.

"We were looking at her in the book beforehand," said partner Michael Sternklar. "Then Rick called me up and said, 'She stepped out of her stall and all I see is class.'"

While Schosberg does most of the work at the sales, Sternklar handles the claiming.

"Together," said Sternklar, "we figure it out."

The division of labor seems to be working pretty well, as in 10 Saratoga starts, the group has two wins, three seconds, and two thirds.

"To get that many starts and that much success in Saratoga bespeaks a really good trainer," said partner Rich Honen. "Rick has all of our horses ready to run and places them perfectly. He's the best trainer in America."

Honen wasn't the only partner in the winner's circle expressing effusive sentiments. In the wake of a stakes win at Saratoga, near the city in which they first met and where Honen now lives, Sternklar was exultant.

"It's the happiest moment of my life," he said.

Up and Running

Winning at an exceptional clip at Saratoga this summer is owner Ralph Evans, who got his sixth win from eight starts when Upstart took the \$196,000 Funny Cide Stakes to remain an undefeated 2-year-old. The son of Flatter has won both of his starts at Saratoga this summer.

A 51/4-length winner in his debut Aug.

15, the Rick Violette-trained Upstart had to work for his win in the Funny Cide, wearing down favored Bustin It to win by a length, running the 6½ furlongs in 1:16.23.

Bred by Mrs. Gerald A. Nielsen out of the Touch Gold mare Party Silks, Upstart was purchased by Evans as a yearling for \$130,000 at last year's state-bred preferred sale.

"I don't know very much about conformation," said Evans, who has had horses

with Violette for more than 20 years, "and there are a few pedigrees that I prefer that I think I can afford. It is very rare, when I pick out four or five pedigrees, that Rick likes them when he looks at them.

"As it happens with this particular horse, I liked this pedigree, and, lo and behold, he liked it."

Though Evans would have preferred a longer time between races for the ridgling, he and Violette wanted to get one more race into Upstart before trying open company this fall.

A breeder as well as an owner, Evans, who lives in Greenwich, Conn., keeps a small stable of a half-dozen horses in training; he also owns the New York-bred broodmare Graeme Central, dam of three winning offspring, including Ampersand, who's earned more than \$200,000.

Though characterizing himself as a supporter of the New York-bred program, Evans said Upstart "just happened to be a New York-bred."

He also said he doesn't remember the last time he and Violette agreed on a horse to buy before Upstart, but the numbers don't lie, and Evans' record at Saratoga this summer suggests the duo is doing something right. Even Evans had to admit that.

"It is a ridiculously good meet," he agreed.

A recent addition to the New York-bred program at New York Racing Association tracks, Saratoga Showcase Day, placed on the day after the Travers, is the third such showcase on the NYRA calendar. Established in 2013, Big Apple Showcase day took place at Belmont May 31, a week before the Belmont Stakes (gr. I), and the original showcase in October will be held Oct. 18, the week before the end of the Belmont fall meet.

Success Comes to Coleman

EVEN THOUGH THE FIRST horse ever bred by Thomas Coleman is a graded stakes winner, the owner/breeder had to first rely on patience before that first foal, New York-bred Zivo, soared on the track this season.

The Westchester County owner has opted for patience in both his breeding operation and racing stable during the development of this year's Suburban Handicap (gr. II) winner. Zivo has extended his win streak to six straight this season, a stretch that has included three victories in New York-bred stakes and a dramatic, worst-to-first rally for a three-length win in the \$500,000 Suburban July 5 at Belmont Park.

But before Coleman could enjoy the win streak and graded stakes glory—a stretch that started with an allowance optional claiming score to close out the 2013 season at Aqueduct and has included his first five races this season—the new Thoroughbred breeder faced setbacks.

Coleman landed the dam of Zivo, American Skipper, by Quiet American, for \$47,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. Off the Hook's Joe Appelbaum, a friend from childhood who works with Coleman's Thoroughbred operations, signed the ticket on the three-time winner who was bred in Kentucky by Brereton Jones.

The decision to purchase proved to be a family event in the Coleman household, which includes his wife and three children.

"My kids wanted to buy a dog and I asked about maybe getting a pregnant broodmare instead," Coleman said. "And we did! We put her at a farm nearby."

The first foal American Skipper produced for the Colemans didn't survive. But Coleman and his family enjoyed

visiting American Skipper at the farm and she was sent to Appelbaum's New York-based stallion True Direction, who soon would be sent to Venezuela to stand. Coleman still chuckles about how the timing of that breeding decision worked out to deliver True Direction's only Northern Hemisphere stakes winner to date.

"It was late in the season, and I think he was on a boat to South America a

few days after that," Coleman said.

In 2009 American Skipper would produce Zivo at Keane Stud near Amenia, N.Y. But racing glory would not immediately follow. Zivo would not race at 2. He would be given time to develop. A plan that had hoped to see an American Skipper foal racing as early as 2010 instead got pushed back to 2012, when a 3-year-old Zivo made his debut.

A promising start was unfortunately followed by an injury that forced Zivo to the sidelines. He would earn the first stakes-placing of his career with a runner-up finish to Willy Beamin in the Albany Stakes Aug. 22, 2012, at Saratoga Race Course, but injury put Zivo on the shelf again, this time for nearly a year.

Good things would come for Coleman. For one thing, Albany winner Willy Beamin would return three days after that score to win the Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I), proving a good omen for Zivo, who would return to racing in August 2013.


Zivo would earn placings in New York-bred stakes at ages 3 and 4, before taking things to another level this year.

On the breeding side, American Skipper already has produced a second winner, filly Clean Eleven, by Officer, who won in her sophomore season last year. Future racing prospects include a 2-year-old filly named Southern Prospect, by Northern Afleet, and a Birdstone yearling, both Florida-breds; and a New York-bred Eskendereya weanling colt.

"I think the one thing that has allowed for his success is patience," Appelbaum said. "If you look at Zivo in particular, it took him a while to get to the track. Then he ran four or five races and he got hurt. He (Coleman) did the right thing and allowed the horse to take a year off, just about, before we brought him back again. We know in this business not everyone would have that sort of patience. I think that's really done well for him."

Coleman credited Appelbaum and his Off the Hook partner Carlos Morales with nursing Zivo back from injury and then the training job by Chad Brown and his assistant Cherie DeVaux. American Skipper is still Coleman's lone broodmare and he has about a half-dozen horses in training, some owned in partnership.

That stable includes Testa Rossi, whom Coleman owns with partners James Covello and Mike Doheny. They purchased Testa Rossi after she won three straight races in France last year. For her new owners the French-bred daughter of Dr Fong closed her juvenile season with a win in the Miss Grillo Stakes (gr. IIIT) on the turf at Belmont

Park and a runner-up finish behind Chriselliam in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT) at Santa Anita Park.

"I've never really thought about goals. I want to win big races, but I also want to have healthy horses, have fun with the horses, and work with good people," Coleman said. "You want to try to be profitable, but that's not the main goal; it's just one of many goals. I love the sport."

That love traces back to going to camp one summer in upstate New York, where Coleman met Appelbaum. The two would venture to Saratoga to enjoy racing days. Later Coleman enjoyed wagering on Standardbred races at Yonkers, with the goal of "winning enough to pay for Chinese food for dinner."

As Appelbaum thrived in his career as a bloodstock agent, Coleman continued his interest in the sport. After launching a small racing stable, Coleman eventually took the plunge on his first broodmare. Coleman and Appelbaum typically discuss all breeding decisions for American Skipper, followed by Coleman's making the final call.

"In the end he's the decision maker, especially with this mare," Appelbaum said. "I act as his portal into the industry, the fact gatherer, the man on the ground so to speak. And then we sit and talk and he makes a decision."

Brown acknowledged Coleman takes a hands-on approach with his racehorses. Brown said that both parties wavered a bit on the Suburban start, not wanting to make a class jump before Zivo was ready while also stretching him out to 1¼ miles. Coleman initially had planned to spend the weekend in the Hamptons, but as Brown watched Zivo prepare that week, he talked the owner into making the trip to Belmont Park.

A casually dressed Coleman would watch Zivo rally past all 10 of his Sub-

urban rivals and pull away for a threelength win over runner-up Moreno, who would turn around and win the Whitney Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga in his next start. Coleman celebrated their 13-1 upset in the winner's circle with Brown and winning rider Jose Lezcano.

"Tom Coleman, the owner, who bred the horse, we work as a team," Brown said after the race. "He said, 'Let's just enter and look.' All the way until this morning, he wasn't really committed to coming in from the Hamptons. He said, 'You want me to come?' I said, 'Let's try it. The horse is training well enough and he loves Belmont; let's try it.' Once I saw the strong pace, I knew he'd come running," Brown said. "That last eighth was definitely as strong as I've seen from him. But, then again, he's a horse that's only gotten better."

Coleman, 48, is a co-founder of the Connecticut-based hedge fund Kensico

Capital Management. Some of the skills he uses as a hedge fund manager cross over to racing.

"In both, the thought process behind the decisions is important," Coleman said. "That analysis and the decisions you make, from the buying to the personnel, to the racing goals and targets, all that, you could say in some ways it's similar to owning and managing an investment fund.

"Maybe Chad Brown should start a hedge fund," Coleman added with a laugh.

Obviously Coleman is a fan of the New York breeding program.

"What's not to like about owning a New York-bred? It's great. I think it keeps a lot of horses and owners supporting the New York meet," Coleman said, adding that he's thought about Zivo's opportunities to progress in New York-bred races before his graded stakes

success. "That's the piece of it that is one of the tangibles that is hard to evaluate how real it is. Is Zivo better than we thought and he always had this in him? Or did his New York-bred race progression help him get there? It's a mystery to me, and I don't know the answer."

But Coleman is thrilled with the results. Sometimes Appelbaum and Coleman are amazed at how their racing dreams have come true.

"We grew up as fans together here at the track; hanging out at the back door, running around the clubhouse," Appelbaum said. "So to be able to graduate from that to actually breeding and owning horses is kind of a thrill."



First-Time Charmers

The Spa bubbles over with state-bred horses getting their initial stakes wins

SARATOGA MAY BE KNOWN as the graveyard of favorites, but for three New York-bred horses this summer it was also the birthplace of stakes wins.

Saratoga's state-bred program kicked off July 31 with the \$100,000 Evan Shipman Stakes at nine furlongs, won by Chevalier Stable's homebred Sinistra, who eked out a neck victory and paid \$56 to win his first stakes as the longest shot in the field of eight.

"I think he was overlooked," said Chevalier's Edward Shapoff of the Stonesider colt out of Margin for Error (by Dixie Brass). "One of the middle-priced horses we had beaten once or twice, so I figured we'd be 10-1. I didn't think we'd be 27-1."

The runner-up by a head in the Kings Point Stakes for New York-breds at Aqueduct in February, 4-year-old Sinistra was beaten that day by Zivo, who would go on to claim the Suburban Handicap (gr. II) at Belmont in July. In the Evan Shipman, Sinistra, under jockey Rosie Napravnik, tracked the leaders patiently to wear them down at the wire in 1:51.96.

"As the race was unfolding," said Shapoff, "I'm looking at it and saying, 'This is precisely what I visualized to be the perfect way to ride this race.' I really think Rosie was a massive help to us.

"Sinistra tries hard and he has a lot of heart. There have been very few occasions that I can think of where this horse has just flat out not tried."

The son of longtime New York trainer Skip Shapoff, he also credits trainer Karl Grusmark with Sinistra's success.

"I'm going to call him an old-school trainer," said Shapoff. "He's very hardworking and he has a good eye for horses. He kind of knows when Sinistra is ready to run, and he's the one who said to me that this horse is going to be terrific when we get to a mile and an eighth. He's managed this horse as well as you could ever hope for. We couldn't be happier."

Also notching a first stakes was William Punk Jr. and Philip DiLeo's Selenite, breaking through in the New York Stallion Series Statue of Liberty division Aug. 4.

Pinhooked by Ellen Kim for \$11,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale in September 2012, Selenite is by Cosmonaut out of the Western Expression mare Offhand Remark and was bred by Flying Zee Stables. Punk and DiLeo purchased her as a 2-year-old for \$20,000 through agent Marette Farrell.

"We rely on her a lot," said Punk of Farrell. "This horse was just an add-on, and she called me up and said, 'Look, there's no reserve and I think you ought to buy her.' I said, 'OK, buy her.' I didn't

even know what the price was going to be."

With partner DiLeo and trainer David Donk, Punk also campaigned the multiple New York-bred champion Hessonite, another turf-loving filly. "It's funny," he said. "We end up with grass horses and we also wind up with a lot of fillies, but we don't specifically look for them. We buy whatever seems to fit our program."

Selenite had yet to place in three stakes attempts before the Saratoga Stallion series race, but Punk felt confident his filly would show up in the Statue of Liberty.

"We thought she'd run well," he said.
"But it was a very competitive field, and we were hoping to come in the money.
We were lucky to win."

Under a patient ride by jockey Irad Ortiz Jr., Selenite saved ground along the hedge on Saratoga's inner turf course, swinging wide around the turn to gain ground steadily and win by 1½ lengths. She ran the mile in 1:36.64.

A frequent purchaser of New Yorkbreds, Punk has watched the state's restricted races get tougher over the last few years and welcomes the change.

"Without a doubt, New York-breds are more competitive," he said. "The quality has gone up significantly. The foal crop has been small, and now that we're getting more horses the quality will be getting even better."

When Carameaway got her first stakes win in eight attempts in the

\$100,000 Saratoga Dew Stakes, breeder/owner Richard Greeley, who has been involved with Thoroughbred racing for more than 20 years, got to celebrate something he'd never experienced: a win with a homebred.

But if the filly's career had gone according to plan, someone else would have been celebrating, because the filly was supposed to have been sold as a yearling at Fasig-Tipton's New York-bred yearling sale in 2011.

"Nobody bid on her,"

said Greeley recently. "Dale Romans asked me why I was selling the horse, and I said, 'I could really use the money.' He said, 'Don't sell her. She's gorgeous.'"

By Lawyer Ron, Carameaway is out of the Grand Slam mare Adorable You. Adorable You was a private purchase by Greeley.

"She didn't start to blossom until she was a little bit older, when we figured out she was a turf horse," she said.

A racing accident resulted in an injury serious enough that Greeley thought he might lose Adorable You.

"It was breaking my heart," he said, but she recovered to become a staple of his broodmares. He has an unraced homebred 2-year-old filly named My Cara Mia by Colonel John who is a half sister to Carameaway, along with a yearling colt by Include and a weanling colt by Macho Uno. Adorable You is in foal to Freud.

And while Greeley names his horses in homage to his wifes, Cara, he admits it might be time to start looking for other names.

The 4-year-old Carameaway has made 23 starts and has earned \$266,220. In the Saratoga Dew her 5-year-old stablemate Dreaming of Cara, a veteran of 37 starts, finished second.

Calling Carameaway's victory a "huge win," Greeley credited trainer Mitch

Friedman for keeping his horses in good form.

"We don't need to win the first time out," said Greeley. "We really want longevity. Our trainer really takes care of them. We're thrilled for Mitch."

Carameaway sat just off the lead under jockey Rajiv Maragh, pulling away in the stretch to run the 1½ miles of the Saratoga Dew in 1:52.54.

A resident of Mountainside, N.J., Greeley was in Saratoga to see his filly win.

"I was almost in shock; we'd been nipped so many times," he said. "It was one of the best experiences of my life. I'm thrilled with the New York breeding program. Every one of mine is going to be a New York-bred now."

The Hoffman family's Red and Black Stable got a first of another kind when Weekend Hideaway took the \$100,000 John Morrissey Stakes Aug. 15. Weekend Hideaway had won a Saratoga stakes race before—the David in 2012—but the John Morrissey was the first stakes win here when the daughter of Red and Black's Mike Hoffman was present.

"We used to come here and sit in box C44 when she was in diapers," said Hoffman.

Now 18 and heading to college this fall, Siobhan expects to play a larger role

in her family's racing business.

"I rode horses for about four years," she said, "and I've always been into racing. It's been a huge part of my life."

Black and Red purchased Weekend Hideaway in a Fasig-Tipton dispersal sale of Flying Zee stock following the 2011 death of Carl Lizza, who bred the horse. Hoffman purchased the colt by Speightstown—Apocalyptical, by Wiseman's Ferry, for \$40,000, and in six starts this year he's been off the board only once.

Weekend Hideaway zipped through early fractions of :22 and :44.80, having enough left at the end of the 6½ furlongs to leave his rivals in a two-length wake, stopping the timer in 1:15.83.

"This is a big day for us," said Hoffman. "It's our second stakes win at Saratoga. But Siobhan wasn't here for the first one, and we've been waiting a year to do this."

The names of Chester and Mary Broman appear abundantly in the records of New York-bred races, but they got their first win in the Stallion Series' Cab Calloway division when their homebred Mark My Way won Aug. 4, his second consecutive stakes victory.

Racing wide under jockey Cornelio Velasquez throughout the one-mile race on the inner turf course, Mark My Way stalked an unhurried pace, dueled briefly in the stretch, then pulled away to win by 2¾ lengths as the favorite in 1:37.57.

Trained by Linda Rice, Mark My Way is a 3-year-old son of Noonmark, in whom the Bromans were partners when he stood at Sequel Stallions in New York, out of Whichwaydidshego, by Storm Cat. His 2-year-old half sister by More Than Ready, Hard to Stay Notgo, is also owned and bred by the Bromans and broke her maiden by five lengths in her debut Aug. 6 at Saratoga for trainer Jimmy Jerkens.

The Bromans purchased Whichwaydidshego, who retired with one win in four starts, for \$425,000 at the 2009 Keeneland November breeding stock sale.


