A very prosperous start

Dear Breeders,

This month is all about numbers, but I think you will agree—the numbers are sweet. I attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony and opening day of Resorts World Casino New York City on October 28 at Aqueduct, and as you may have heard or read, it was and has been simply remarkable.

The revenue for the Resorts World Casino from the first full week of operation was \$10,186,336 from 2,486 video lottery terminals (VLTs), an average of \$1,455,191 per day, well above the projected figure of \$1-million a day, with a \$585 win rate per machine per day. This rate well exceeds all of the original estimates. While it is unclear whether the casino will be able to sustain these numbers as time goes on, based upon these figures, the projections for casino revenue and—

more to the point—for the New York State Breeding and Development Fund and purses when the entire facility is open are remarkable.

For 2012, the Fund is allotted 1% of the revenue. If the casino continues with this \$585 per VLT win rate per day, we will be on track to have an additional \$10,676,250 available for awards in 2012. As you may recall, the casino was projected to do \$375

to \$425 win per machine, which would equate roughly to \$6-million in revenue for the Fund next year.

The New York Racing Association, which is allotted 6.5% of the revenue for purses in 2012, will be able to add more than \$69-million to its purse account. Therefore, if the casino continues its present course for 2012, the revenue could be almost double what had been projected for both the Fund and NYRA purses. It also is important to remember that in January an additional 2,500 machines will come into operation, providing the casino with 5,000 VLT machines total. Given that Resorts World had to turn customers away from its doors due to the initial demand, these additional machines should help keep the win numbers in our favor.

I don't think you need me to spell out what this means for the breeding and racing programs in our state and for your businesses. The influx of exciting new stallions and performance of New York-breds in the sales ring over the past six months is just the beginning of the story.

So with this, you have my best wishes for the holidays and may you all enjoy a very happy (and prosperous) new year.

Finally, Aqueduct casino opens

Large crowds turn out for first days of electronic gaming at Queens track

After a decade of toil, trouble, and turmoil, video lottery terminals (VLTs) finally began operating at Aqueduct on October 28.

The opening of Resorts World Casino New York City, complete with 2,285 video slot machines and 200 electronic table games in its Times Square Casino, brought South Ozone Park to life in late October as gamblers poured in from throughout the region to play in New York City's first casino.

The gaming revenues are expected to breathe new life into the downstate racing industry. Because of political roadblocks and assorted shenanigans, much of it fueled by ingrained, deep-seated animosity toward the New York Racing Association, Aqueduct was the last racing entity to receive gaming devices overseen by the New York Lottery.

The Aqueduct opening came exactly one year after ground-breaking for the facility, which will cost close to \$1-billion, and one day short of ten years after the New York General Assembly approved racetrack gaming in the aftermath of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on New York City's World Trade Center.

Genting Group estimated the first day of gaming attracted 20,000 patrons to the 5,000-person capacity casino, and the first weekend's attendance was estimated at 65,000. The casino is open from 8 a.m. to 4 a.m. EST daily.

"We are incredibly grateful to the leaders of the state of New York and the Lottery for allowing us the privilege of opening this wonderful facility," said K T Lim, chairman and chief executive of Genting Group, at an early-afternoon ribbon-cutting on October 28.

"Since breaking ground a year ago, we have had the extraordinary experience of working with a dedicated group of government, civic, and political leaders, a tremendous construction crew, and a welcoming community."

The facility will employ 1,500 full-time workers when a second level opens over the winter. Resorts World New York City President Michael Speller said that 89% of the employees would be women or minorities. The facility drew its workforce from 41,000 applicants.

The first day of gaming attracted a huge crowd, as expected, and the line to enter the facility was estimated at a mile long. Many potential patrons were urged to come back another day. "We were truly humbled by the astounding welcome we received on opening weekend. This reception exceeded everyone's expectations," Speller said.

Casino patrons arrived from the John F. Kennedy International Airport, the Q37 bus stop on the Aqueduct property, and the A Train North Conduit subway stop. By the end of the year, the property will feature a new covered skybridge connecting the Aqueduct MTA station to the casino.

Resorts World plans to open the 5th Avenue Casino and Crockfords Casino on the second floor by the end of the year with

2,515 additional gaming devices; the Central Park Events Center housing the largest event space in Queens; and upscale dining facilities in the RW Prime Steakhouse and Chinese-themed Genting Palace.

Genting is one of the world's largest gaming companies, with more than 35,000 employees. It operates the world's most profitable casino in Singapore and is a partner in Monticello Casino and Raceway's VLT operation near Port Jervis.

Genting paid the state of New York a \$380-million upfront franchise fee in September 2010, and it has supported NYRA with a \$25-million line of credit until the VLT revenue began to fill its coffers.

Under the memorandum of agreement developed by the New York Lottery and accepted by Genting, NYRA is to receive 7% of the VLT operation's net revenues, after VLT players are paid, while another 6.5% will flow to purses, with that cut increasing to 7% in year two and 7.5% in year three and beyond. Breeders will get 1% percent to start, increasing to 1.25% in year two and 1.5% in year three and beyond.

The benefits of gaming revenues will start with the new year. NYRA announced in late September that purses for Aqueduct's winter-spring meeting will increase 36% over the comparable meet this year. New York-bred purses also will be part of a purse increase that NYRA estimated at \$8.6-million.

"The 2012 winter-spring meet marks a new era for our purse structures," NYRA President Charles Hayward said.

Average daily distribution will increase approximately \$100,000 a day to \$375,000.

Breeder awards to increase by half in 2012

Reaping the benefits of higher purse levels and projected income from Resorts World Casino New York City video lottery terminals at Aqueduct, breeder-award payments will be increasing by half in 2012.

The New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund announced the across-the-board increases on October 26 for both New York-sired runners and those by stallions who are not part of the New York program.

In addition to the 50% increase in breeder awards, the earnings caps for the awards will be raised substantially.

For all races run in New York, New York-sired New York-breds now earn 20% of the winner's portion of the

purse in breeders' awards for first place, and 10% for secondand third-place, respectively. In 2012, the respective awards will increase to 30% for winners and 15% for second and third.

For New York-breds by non-New York sires, the current regime of 10% bonuses for winners and 5% for second and third will increase to 15% and 7.5%, respectively.

The Breeding and Development Fund board of directors, chaired by New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman John D. Sabini, also approved on October 22 an increase in the earnings

cap for New York-sired New York-breds from \$10,000 per award to \$40,000, a 300% increase. The cap for other New York-breds will double to \$20,000 from \$10,000.

"Raising the breeders' awards percentages is yet another message to breeders across the country that New York is open for business, and the incentives and purses here are up for grabs," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. "If you have mares and are contemplating the move, simply take a look at the numbers: 600-plus restricted races with \$35-million-plus in state-bred purses and an incentive breeding fund worth upwards of \$17-million in 2012.

"Raising the awards by 50%

across the board will further increase the net worth of New York-bred foals and hopefully get more cash back into breeders' and owners' hands. We took an additional stride toward rewarding excellence by raising the cap on breeders' awards," said Cannizzo, who serves on the Breeding and Development Fund board.

"Now, the sky is virtually the limit for breeders whose horses are winning purses of significant value. They will be rewarded for excellence. There is endless opportunity here with great upside for every class of breeder."

Strong results at Flying Zee dispersal

Fasig-Tipton Kentucky staged the first phase of the Flying Zee Stable dispersal on October 26, and the late Carl Lizza Jr.'s yearlings received a favorable reception from buyers for the 39 New York-breds to go through the ring.

In all, 35 Flying Zee

yearlings were sold for \$1,236,700, an average of \$35,334, and the median was \$15,000. Those numbers compared favorably with the overall Fasig-Tipton Kentucky selected fall yearling sale, which averaged \$24,010 and had a median price of \$12,000.

Lizza, who died at his New Jersey home on July 8 at age 73, bred many of his New Yorkbased mares to commercial stallions, and the resulting foals fared well in the commercial marketplace. All the yearlings were sold by Hidden Brook Farm as agent for Flying Zee.

Topping the dispersal was a Lemon Drop Kid

filly out of Salty Romance, by Salt Lake, who sold for \$375,000 to agent Donato Lanni, purchasing for Florida-based Glen Hill Farm.



> Salty Romance won the 2003 Boyd Gaming's Delta Princess Stakes at Delta Downs and placed second in the following year's Santa Ysabel Stakes (G3) at Santa Anita Park.

From three foals of racing age, she has winner Luxury Appeal, by Johannesburg, who placed in two New York-bred stakes, and Agave Kiss, a two-year-old Lion Heart filly who scored a flashy maiden victory on the New York Showcase undercard on October 22.

"She checked every box. She moved great, she did everything right, and is just a nice filly," Lanni said of Salty Romance's yearling filly. "All the right guys were on her. Everybody waited on her."

Among the underbidders was EQB's Patrice Miller.

A Tapit filly out of Comacina, by Dixie Union, was the thirdto-last yearling to enter the Fasig-Tipton sales ring and garnered a final bid of \$170,000, the second-highest of the dispersal. Leading Woodbine-based trainer Mark Casse, acting as agent, signed the ticket. Comacina is a two-time stakes winner, including the Interborough Handicap, and has a winning four-year-old, her only foal to race.

Fillies accounted for the top six prices in the dispersal and eight of the top ten yearlings. Red and Black Stable acquired the fillies that went for the third- and fourth-highest prices: a Bernardini filly out of The Real Melody, by Unbridled's Song, sold for \$140,000, and a Heatseeker (Ire) filly out of Swept the Series, by Grand Slam, who went for \$65,000.

The second part of the Flying Zee dispersal will offer weanlings, broodmares, and horses of racing age. It will take place during Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic December mixed sale on December 5.—Don Clippinger

Paul Pompa Jr.'s D' Funnybone, who won five Grade 2 races and figured prominently in the 2010 Triple Crown campaign, will join the Vinery New York contingent at Sugar Maple Farm in Poughquag for a \$3,500 fee in 2012.

In addition, first-crop sire Maybry's Boy will transfer from Vinery New York to Highcliff Farm, operated by C. Lynwood O'Cain, D.V.M., and his wife, Suzi, in Delanson.

Trained by Richard Dutrow Jr., cleverly named D' Funnybone (D'wildcat out of Elbow, by Woodman) was a championship contender at two and one of the top

three-year-olds in the months leading into the 2010 Triple Crown races

Sold privately to Pompa by breeder Harold Plumley and trainer Joseph Calascibetta after a second-place finish in the 2009 Frank Gomez Memorial Stakes, D' Funnybone rolled to a $10^{1/2}$ -length win in the Saratoga Special Stakes (G2) and a $4^{3/4}$ -length victory in the Futurity Stakes (G2) at Belmont Park.

He started his 2010 campaign with back-to-back victories in the Hutcheson (G2) and Swale (G2) Stakes at Gulfstream Park and won the Woody Stephens Stakes (G2) on the Belmont

Stakes (G1) undercard.

"We are very pleased to add D' Funnybone to our New York stallion roster," Vinery President Tom Ludt said. "This horse was one of the best two-year-olds of his generation and was an outstanding three-year-old."

D' Funnybone retired with career earnings of \$686,700.

D' Funnybone is a half brother to graded stakes-placed Dr. Kathy, by Polish Numbers. His third dam is Chain Bracelet, winner of the 1981 Top Flight Handicap (G1).

Maybry's Boy transferred to Highcliff after collecting his first winner, Flying Zee Stable's home-

bred Sportswriter, who debuted with a victory in a Saratoga Race Course maiden special weight race on August 5.

By Broad Brush, Maybry's Boy won the 2002 Spectacular Bid Stakes (G3), one of his eight victories from 43 career starts from age two through seven. In all, he earned \$322,700.

He is out of Aly's Conquest, by Alydar, a six-time winner who finished second to Sky Beauty in the 1995 Vagrancy Handicap (G3). His second dam was the highly capable Am Capable, a durable racemare whose 12 career victories included the 1984 Affectionately (G3) and Distaff (G3) Handicaps.—Don Clippinger

Sequel reopens and adds Girolamo

Becky Thomas and Dennis Narlinger announced on November 1 that they are reopening Sequel Stallions New York for the 2012 breeding season. The stallion roster will include Freud, Noonmark, and new addition Girolamo.

Freud perennially ranks among New York's leading sires and was the state's champion sire in 2008 and 2009. Through November 15, he ranked second by earnings in 2011 and led by stakes wins with 15 by eight individual winners. Among them is Giant Ryan, winner of the Vosburgh Invitational Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park.

Joining him at Sequel in Hudson will be 2010 Vosburgh winner Girolamo, who will stand at Sequel for Darley. The A.P. Indy horse, who also won the 2009 Jerome Handicap (G2), is out of the Grade 3-winning Mr. Prospector mare Get Lucky and is a full brother to graded stakes winners Daydreaming and Accelerator. His full sister Supercharger is the dam of Super Saver, winner of the 2010 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

"Girolamo is a horse with tremendous potential on all fronts," said Charlie Boden, Darley America's head of sales. "He was a dominant racehorse with speed and class and is a Grade 1 winner from a tremendous Phipps family."

Noonmark, a graded stakes winner by Unbridled's Song, will have his first crop of yearlings in 2012.

"We are proud to offer New York breeders this outstanding facility, which already is the home of 18 graded stakes win-

Midwest family, star-crossed sire

Weemissfrankie hails from a Michigan brood that reached the top with ill-fated Sunriver

Weemissfrankie, the only New York-bred to win two Grade 1 races in 2011, certainly is well traveled.

She was foaled in New York, sold in Florida, raced in California most of her two-year-old season, and concluded the year's journey with a third-place finish in the Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) on November 4 at Churchill Downs.

Her family also has some miles on it as well, growing out of a Michigan brood that was enriched by two sires, Three Wonders and Sunriver, who did not live long enough to achieve their full potential.

Weemissfrankie's roots in the Midwest are very deep, to say the least. Her sixth dam, unraced Bam Bong, by Clock Tower, was a foal of 1949 and produced Michigan stakes-placed Admiral Bong.

The family continued through two Michigan generations bred by Mrs. Viola Johnson, beginning with minor winner Falling Star, by Pan Echeta. Falling Star produced stakes winner My-Sun-Rullah, a Pocket Ruler filly who was a minor stakes winner and produced a family of minor stakes winners.

My Second Star, Falling Star's 1966 filly by Beau Prince, was a modest winner, accumulating \$11,663 in purses from four victories, but she too proved to be of greater value as a Michigan broodmare.

She produced two stakes winners, Avie's Double, by Lord Avie, and Star Tracer, by Irish Castle. Each earned more than \$100,000 and demonstrated that the family could move ahead economically when bred to commercial stallions.

My Second Star produced Weemissfrankie's third dam, Twist a Star, in 1977. By Twist the Axe, Twist a Star was bred in Michigan by E. C. and Ruth Reuter and raced for her breeders. She won five of 20 starts and finished second in Hazel Park's Early Bird Prep in 1979. She produced 1987 Michigan Futurity winner

Star My Words, by War of Wars, and two stakes-placed fillies, My Kinda Star, by Peterhof, and Lite a Star, by Our Michael.

Lite a Star

Lite a Star, bred and raced by the Reuters, finished second in the 1987 Ann Arbor Stakes at Detroit Race Course and earned \$28,945 from 12 career starts.

Michigan-bred Lite a Star would establish the family in Michigan and then move it out of the regional market. Her first foal was Program Pick, a 1989 filly by Peterhof who won three restricted stakes from her first six starts in 1991 and 1992, all at Detroit, and completed her career with nine wins from 28 starts and purse earnings of \$125,589.

Program Pick proved to be the mare that attracted attention to the family. She was claimed from her final career start by trainer Mark Casse, and she went into the broodmare band of his principal client, Harry Mangurian's Mockingbird Farm in Florida.

By far, Program Pick's best was Stormy Pick, by Storm Creek, who sold for \$145,000 at the 1999 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. August yearling sale. Stormy Pick was worth every dollar of her purchase price. Owned by Raymond Dweck and trained by Ben Perkins Jr., she won the 2000 Spinaway Stakes (G1) and Sorority Stakes (G3).

In all, Stormy Pick won seven races, five of them stakes, from 15 career starts at two and three, with purse earnings of \$441,900. At stud, Stormy Pick produced stakes-placed Stormandaprayer, by Songandaprayer.

Program Pick's second Mockingbird-bred stakes winner was Expected Program, by Valid Expectations, who sold for \$150,000 during the 2000 OBS August sale and won

two listed stakes at Hollywood Park in his first three career starts at age two.

After Program Pick's on-track exploits, Lite a Star went into the 1994 Keeneland November breeding stock sale and sold for \$14,500 to Preston Madden, who sent her through the Keeneland ring three years later, when she sold for \$18,000 in foal to Farma Way.

Starinthemeadow

The purchase put her in the broodmare band of Ocala-based Hidden Point Farm, owned by Massachusetts developer Peter Van Rosbeck. In 2000, Lite a Star produced Starinthemeadow, a Meadowlake filly who would never race but would produce the family's second Grade 1 winner, Weemissfrankie.

Starinthemeadow initially was bred to Hidden Point's Three Wonders, a Storm Cat horse who was Florida's leading freshman sire in 2006. A member of Three Wonders' first crop, My Fair El won \$145,305 in 32 career starts.

Bred back to Three Wonders, Starinthemeadow produced stakes-placed No Wonder in 2006. Three Wonders was euthanized in 2008 at age 11 because of a spinal disorder similar to wobbler syndrome.

In 2008, Starinthemeadow was bred to Sunriver, and the result was Weemissfrankie. Sunriver had a marvelous pedigree, a good record on dirt and grass, and a brief but notable career at stud in New York.

Sunriver was by Saint Ballado, a full brother to champions Devil's Bag and Glorious Song who started his stud career in relative obscurity but eventually had no fewer than 70 stakes winners, approximately 10% of 718 foals, before dying at age 13 in 2002.

His best was Saint Liam, the 2005 Horse of the Year who died

after a single year at stud. In that one season, Saint Liam sired Havre de Grace, who is on course for an Eclipse Award as 2011's champion older female.

Bred by Aaron and Marie Jones, Sunriver was out of Goulash and thus was a full brother to Ashado, the two-time Eclipse Award winner. Sunriver won the 2006 Peter Pan Stakes (G2) and proved to be a top turf runner with his victory in the following year's Hollywood Turf Cup Stakes (G1).

Sunriver spent two years at Empire Stud before suffering a suspected burst aneurysm in August 2009. Weemissfrankie was from his first crop and has furnished most of Sunriver's progeny earnings.

She was first offered at the 2010 OBS August yearling sale and was bought back on a final bid of \$40,000. Consigned by Eddie Woods to this year's OBS spring sale of two-year-olds in training, she sold for \$175,000 to Joe Ciaglia, acting for a California partnership that named the filly in memory of actor, director, and horse owner Frank Alesia, who had died on February 27 at his Carlsbad, California, home at age 67.

The ownership group includes Alesia's widow, Sharon; Mike Mellen's Bran Jam Stables; professional skateboarder and MTV personality Rob Dyrdek; and Nick Cosato. She is trained by former jockey Peter Eurton.

Weemissfrankie sustained her first career defeat in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies after a track-record maiden score at Del Mar and victories in the Del Mar Debutante (G1) and Santa Anita Park's Oak Leaf Stakes (G1).

Eurton said Weemissfrankie had trouble with the wet Churchill Downs track and did not grip it well. "Being third is no disgrace," Eurton said. "I'm very proud of her."

A focus on quality

New York-breds fill one-quarter of Belmont fall races and beat meet markers

by Don Clippinger

The New York Racing Association condition book for the 2011 fall championship meeting was filled with quality races for horses pointing toward the Breeders' Cup World Championships, and a similar pattern of high-level contests for the track's New Yorkbreds was followed this recent season.

The meeting that ran from September 10 through three races on October 29—a freak October snowstorm canceled the rest of the program and the entire October 30 card—began and ended with New York-bred races.

As always, New York-breds played a large role in the racing program's structure. Of 334 total races, 86, or 26%, were for native New Yorkers.

New York Racing Association Vice President of Racing P. J. Campo's condition book contained 89 straight claiming races,

but not one of them for New York-breds. Rather, the emphasis for state-breds was on non-claiming events and maiden races, which included 18 maiden claiming races.

In all, non-claiming races made up nearly 80% of all restricted races and more than 90% of all New York-bred purses. For the entire meet, non-claiming contests were 56.3% of all races and 78.8% of purses.


Here are some of the key statistics for New York-breds from the fall championship meet:

- New York-breds raced for purses totaling \$4.2-million, an average of \$49,035 per race, which compared with \$53,014 for all races. When stakes money is removed from the calculations, the New York-breds raced for higher purses per race, \$39,963 to \$37,154 for all races.
- With the New York Showcase on October 22 and other races, New York-breds had a healthy stakes program, with 11 races averaging more than \$110,000. The overall fall stakes program was 47 races worth more than \$7-million, for an average purse of \$149,860.
- New York-breds accounted for a higher percentage of all races than in the two previous meets, up from 23.3% at the Belmont spring-summer meet and 20.1% of all races at the Saratoga Race Course meet.
- New York-bred races filled well, averaging nine starters per race compared with 8.3 for the entire meeting.

Race conditions

The stakes purses in the New York Showcase card helped to move non-claiming money in the New York-bred program to 90.8% of all purses distributed in state-bred races.

Creating winners was a major theme through the fall meeting. The New York-bred menu contained 18 maiden claimers and 31 maiden special weight contests; the combined maiden races were 57% of all New York-bred races.

The maiden special weights were the largest single category of races, and their \$46,386 average purse was the next highest after stakes races, which averaged \$110,891. Of the 31 maiden special weight races, 18 were limited to two-year-olds, with nine each for males and females.

Campo's program also provided a precise balance between New York-bred straight allowance races and optional claimers, which are allowance races with a claiming option for horses that do not fall within the allowance conditions. The 13 allowance races averaged \$44,867 per race, and the same number of optional claimers paid \$45,283 per race.

The maiden claimers went for average purses of \$21,518, or less than half of the overall average. Two-thirds of the maiden claimers were for the bottom \$16,000 level, and they averaged \$19,554 per contest. The two \$50,000 maiden claimers went for \$29,000 each.

Age and sex

By the time the fall meet comes around, three-year-olds are expected to race against their elders, and two-year-olds become an increasingly large part of the racing program. In fact, the meeting contained no races solely for New York-bred three-year-olds.

Two-year-olds, usually in abundant supply in the fall, filled 26 races, or slightly more than 30% of all New York-bred races, and they were split equally between open races (which effectively are for males) and fillies.

The purse structure for the two-year-olds essentially was equal. The open races went for average purses of \$45,167, and the filly average was \$45,153.

Older competitors are the core of any racing program, and New York-breds filled 60 races for horses three and older. Those races had a significant disparity between males and females, however. Females were allotted 24 races, and their average purse was \$47,616. The open races numbered 36, and they averaged \$52,780.

To be sure, a significant factor in the purse average for open races was the New York Showcase, in which Haynesfield won the biggest prize—the \$200,000 Empire Classic.

Field size and surface

Field sizes held up well for all levels of New York-bred races, and the 9.0 average promised a sizable colony of New Yorkers for the rich Aqueduct winter meet. Often, field size inversely is proportional to purse size, with smaller fields in the stakes races because the competition is so much keener. That did not prove true, however, in New York-bred racing during the Belmont fall meeting.

The largest average field size was for maiden special weights, with 9.8 starters per race, and the next highest category was stakes races at 8.8. Those bulging fields boosted the non-claiming average field to 9.2 starters, compared with an average of 8.3 starters in the maiden claimers. The \$16,000 level of maiden claimers averaged 8.8 starters, but the two at the \$50,000 level had six starters each.

The condition book offered a good balance of dirt and turf races, but the rainy autumn forced a total of 12 races off the

grass. The 46 dirt races were to be complemented by 40 turf contests, but in the end 58 of the 86 races were on the main track.

The vast width of Belmont's main track has one advantage: It can accommodate large fields. One field, for a two-year-old maiden special weight, had 14 starters, and 13 went to the starting gate for the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes, won by Flying Zee Stable's Night Maneuver on the New York Showcase card, as well as a maiden race for two-year-olds on the same card.

Meet leaders

The Showcase program also yielded one of four two-time winners at the Belmont fall meeting.

La Marca Stable's Compliance Officer won the afternoon's final race, the \$125,000 Bluegrass Cat Mohawk Stakes at 0.85-to-1 to go with his victory in the Ashley T. Cole Stakes on September 11.

The two turf victories were worth \$135,000 for the five-yearold Officer gelding, who was unplaced in the TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1) on November 5. Other two-time winners at the Belmont fall meet were Beautyinthepulpit, Precious Metal, and Wee Freudian.

Sequel Stallions' Freud was the meet's leading sire with eight victories by seven individual winners. Second was Hook and Ladder with four individual winners of four races.

Haynesfield rules Empire Classic

Freud and Flying Zee also shine on New York Showcase program

Haynesfield is back.

It has been a rough year for Turtle Bird Stable's five-year-old Speightstown horse, who ruled as the New York-bred Horse of the Year in 2009 and 2010, the latter year after winning the historic Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1).

But it was downhill from his first Grade 1 victory. He had traffic problems in the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and finished 11th; then he was beaten a head in the Hill 'n Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (G1). Given the winter off by trainer Steve Asmussen,

Haynesfield returned with a fourth-place finish in this year's Westchester Stakes (G3) in April and a fifth in the Metropolitan Handicap (G1) in May.

After another extended break, Haynesfield returned to New York-bred racing and demonstrated his class with a one-length victory over Green Monster in the \$200,000 McMahon Adena Empire Classic Stakes, the featured race of the rich New York Showcase day at Belmont Park on October 22.

Bred by Barry Weisbord and Margaret Santulli, Haynesfield also won the Empire Classic in 2009.

"We've had a lot of ups and downs this year," said Toby Sheets, who manages Asmussen's New York operation. "His feet have bugged him a lot. We finally got it back together, and he's been training really well."

Haynesfield's front-end speed carried him to a four-length victory over eventual champion older male Blame in the Jockey Club Gold Cup last year, but the tactic in this year's Empire Classic was to stay away from the front end. "The instructions were to not get in a hurry," said Ramon Dominguez, Haynesfield's regular jockey.

In an unusually run race, Green Monster set an uncontested pace for more than a half-mile of the 1½-mile Empire Classic, ceded the lead to 0.85-to-1 favorite Haynesfield on the far turn,

and then menaced the leader through the final furlong.

"He got a little tired in the last eighth," Dominguez said of Haynesfield. "Just when [Green Monster] came to him, for a second I thought he was going to go by him. He kept sticking his neck in front, and I felt he wasn't really too happy about letting him go by. He still galloped out pretty strong, so I'm very happy with him, especially off the layoff."

Sheets said his staff had worked through the summer to restrain Haynesfield's

speed. "We worked with him a lot in the mornings to try and get him to relax—worked him behind horses and stuff—and it worked out."

Haynesfield ran the McMahon Adena Empire Classic's $1\frac{1}{8}$ miles in 1:49.08 on a fast track. The \$120,000 first-place purse raised his career earnings to \$1,306,981.

Two for Flying Zee

The Flying Zee Stable operation of the late Carl Lizza Jr. is in the process of slimming down under the management of Lizza's widow, Viane. (See report on first phase of the Flying Zee dispersal on page 12.) Still, the stable is more than formidable.

At the end of the Belmont fall meeting, Flying Zee was the leading owner, just as it had been at the spring-summer session.

Flying Zee held a strong hand on Showcase day, especially with four of 13 starters in the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes for two-year-olds. The entry, with two from Carlos Martin's barn and two from trainer Phil Serpe, went off as the 1.30-to-1 favorite and yielded a stylish winner in Night Maneuver, an Orientate gelding out of Smoke N Shadows, by Smoke Glacken.

Bred by Lizza's Nustar Breeding LLC, Night Maneuver dispensed with stablemate The Prize Fighter before completing a half-mile, opened a clear lead at the three-sixteenths pole, and won by $1\frac{1}{2}$ lengths over Jaw Crusher, who made a late move on the inside.

Ridden by Ryan Curatolo, Night Maneuver ran the Bongard's seven furlongs in 1:23.56 and remained undefeated in three starts. Martin got away with starting him out in a \$35,000 maiden claimer at Saratoga Race Course on August 31, when he won at 19.50-to-1 odds.

Flying Zee also collected third- and fourth-place money with The Prize Fighter and Western Tryst, both trained by Serpe. From the Bongard's \$100,000 purse, Flying Zee took home \$75,000.

"That was exciting," Martin said after the victory. "He's a nice colt. He keeps getting better. He surprises me. He didn't show much early on in his training, but the more you do with him, the better he is."

The Bongard was preceded by a maiden special weight race

for New York-bred two-year-old fillies, and Flying Zee trainer Rudy Rodriguez unfurled Agave Kiss, a first-time starter by Lion Heart out of Salty Romance, by Salt Lake.

With Curatolo in the saddle, Agave Kiss broke on top and simply outclassed her 12 opponents to win by $6^{1}/_{4}$ lengths while speeding through six furlongs in 1:09.79.Bred by Nustar, Agave Kiss went off at 10.60-to-1 and most likely will not see such long odds in her next start.

The performance undoubtedly added a little more luster to her yearling half sister by Lemon Drop Kid, who topped the Flying Zee dispersal's first stage at \$375,000 at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky four days later.

Two for Freud

Always at or near the top of the New York stallion rankings, Freud also had a double on the Showcase program, with General Maximus in the \$125,000 Posse Hudson Stakes and Hessonite in the \$125,000 Justenuffhumor Ticonderoga Stakes.

Ridden by Corey Nakatani, General Maximus shadowed the early pace of Dr Disco and took command inside the sixteenth pole to win by a length in 1:09.58 for the Posse Hudson's six furlongs. Flying Zee's Mineswept, ridden by Curatolo, finished third, another 1½ lengths farther back.

Bred by Jill and Dominque Imperio, General Maximus won for the first time since taking the 2010 Hudson for owners Goldmark Farm, Michael Imperio, and Elizabeth Loftus. The four-year-old Freud ridgling boosted his career earnings to \$319,640.

"It took him a little while to get back to form," trainer John Terranova II said. "He's had some little mishaps, thankfully nothing serious. We have great owners behind him. That's the key. They had the patience to wait it out until we had him back at 100%. We're hoping we have a nice, fresh horse for the winter."

Freud's versatility over varying distances and surfaces was evident when William J. Punk Jr.'s and Philip DiLeo's three-year-old filly Hessonite powered past 1.65-to-1 favorite Gitchee Goomie near the sixteenth pole and won the Ticonderoga by a length under Dominquez. Hessonite, second betting choice at 2.75-to-1, ran the race's $1^1\!\!/_{16}$ miles in 1:45.87 on yielding turf.

Bred by Berkshire Stud and Waterville Lake Stables, threeyear-old Hessonite is out of the Manila mare Lakab and collected her third stakes victory of the year for trainer David Donk. She previously had won two New York Stallion Series races on the turf and picked up a graded stakes placing with a third-place finish in the Boiling Springs Stakes (G3) on June 25 at Monmouth Park. Hessonite also finished second in Belmont's open

Pebbles Stakes on October 10.

Donk said Hessonite came out of the Pebbles in good shape and was well tuned for the Showcase contest.

"I wouldn't have run her if I didn't think she was okay," he said. "Really, really good race. They finished really fast, and beating a really good older filly like Gitchee Goomie bodes well for the future."

Donk said Hessonite would be turned out for the winter and brought back next spring.

Compliance Officer in charge

In another Showcase race on the turf, La Marca Stable's Compliance Officer took charge inside the furlong pole and drew clear to a five-length victory in the \$125,000 Bluegrass Cat Mohawk Stakes at odds of 0.85-to-1.

Lubash finished second, and Adirondack Summer closed for third. Alex Solis rode the winner, who covered 1½6 miles in 1:43.93.

The Bluegrass Cat Mohawk was the fifth consecutive victory for Compliance Officer since trainer Bruce Brown claimed him for \$25,000 at Belmont on May 14. After two optional claiming wins, he won the West Point and Ashley T. Cole Stakes in succession before the Mohawk.

"The way this horse keeps running, it's not only that he's been winning but he keeps doing it so impressively," Brown said. "Usually with these horses, they kind of come in and out, but he's just been bringing his 'A' game every time. It's mainly him. He trains himself, pretty much." Compliance Officer finished off the board in the TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1), but next on the docket is the \$100,000 Emerald Claiming Crown Stakes at Fair Grounds on December 3.

Sanford Bacon's homebred Risky Rachel secured her first stakes victory when the four-year-old Limehouse filly drew away from favored Lovely Lil to win the \$125,000 Friendly Island Iroquois Stakes by $2^{1}/_{4}$ lengths as the 2.75-to-1 second betting choice.

Barry Schwartz's Lovely Lil, favored at 6-to-5 on the strength of her Union Avenue Stakes win at Saratoga Race Course and a third in the Foxwoods Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2), set the pace, but Javier Castellano drove Risky Rachel to the lead before the furlong pole and drew clear.

In the afternoon's other Showcase race, the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes for two-year-old fillies, George and Stephanie Autry's Bellacourt turned back Wildcat's Smile to win by a half-length at 9-to-1. Nakatani rode the winner, who completed the seven furlongs in 1:24.44.

EXPLANATION OF INDEXES

Racing Index (RI)

RI is based on the average earnings per start for all runners in the United States, Canada, England, Ireland, France, Italy, Germany, Puerto Rico, and United Arab Emirates. RI is determined by calculating the average earnings per start, divided into males and females, of all starters in each individual country, and the average for each individual year is by definition 1.00. Median RI, however, is much lower. Actual distribution of RI is detailed below.

Sire Index (SI)

The Sire Index (SI) is an average of the Racing Index (RI) of all foals by a sire that have started at least three times. For SI to be calculated, a sire must be represented by a minimum of three crops and 25 starters lifetime.

AUCTION INFORMATION

Auction information is for North American sales from 1980 to the present and includes the following:

· Subject horse (stakes winner): All auction activity—weanling, yearling, two-year-olds in training, or horses of racing age sales—found after the winner's name under the first dam.

· Sire of stakes winner: The sire's lifetime and current year yearling auction information is reported, with number of crops offered at yearling sales (lifetime), number of yearlings sold

(lifetime), and average price (lifetime, including yearlings sold in current year), followed by information for the current year. (Current year information is reported beginning October 1; current year information from January 1 through September 30 is in the previous year's auction information.)

· Dam of stakes winner: most recent sale, either as weanling, yearling, or two-year-old in training. Also reported is most recent sale as broodmare (including covering sire) or broodmare prospect, plus any sale of the dam while subject horse was in utero (including covering sire).

PEDIGREE SYMBOLS

Symbols preceding or following names of horses in pedigrees are used to identify horses that were imported into North America for racing or breeding, and to indicate country of birth. Equal signs preceding a horse's name indicate that a horse was foaled outside the U.S. or Canada and has never been imported to North America; a horse's country of birth appears in parentheses following its name. An asterisk preceding a horse's name indicates the horse was born outside the U.S. or Canada and was imported to North America prior to 1976 (no country codes are included for such horses). Names of horses imported since 1976 include a country code in parentheses following their name and are not preceded by equal signs. Horses that do not have a symbol preceding their name or a country code following their name were foaled in North America.



Abbreviations used for class of race are similar to those used by Equibase: Alw—allowance; Hcp—overnight handicap; names of stakes races are spelled out, with the grade of the race, when applicable, in parentheses. Class of race is followed by the distance of the race, expressed in furlongs and fractions of furlongs, followed by first-place money earned by the winner.

Breeding Rules

To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

Resident Mares: Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back required.

Non-Resident Mares: Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.

New York State Breeding and Development Fund NY-Breds Award Program

Breeder, owner, and stallion owner awards are based on purse money earned (first through third) while competing in pari-mutuel races run in New York state.

BREEDER AWARDS

In 2010, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$5,400,945 to breeders of registered New York-breds. A breeder is the owner of the mare at the time the mare foals in the state of New York. Breeder awards are determined by covering stallion. If the New York-bred is by a registered New York-based stallion, the award is up to 30% of the purse earned for a first-place finish and up to 15% for a second- or third-place finish.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 15% for a first-place finish and up to 7.5% for a second- or third-place finish. The breeder awards are capped at \$40,000 per horse per race for New York-sired New York-breds, and the cap on breeder awards for non-New York-sired New York-breds is \$20,000 per horse per race.

STALLION OWNER AWARDS

In 2010, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund distributed \$1,559,215 in stallion owner awards. Stallion owner awards are paid to owners of registered New York-based covering stallions (at time of conception) at up to 7% of earned purses from first through third positions. All stallion owner awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

OPEN OWNER AWARDS

In 2010, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$859,621 to owners of registered New York-breds who earned purse money in open-company races. Owner awards for registered New York-breds sired by a registered New York-based stallion is up to 20% of purses earned from first through third positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward, with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% of purses earned from first through third positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

NEW YORK-BRED RACES

More than 45 stakes races exclusively for registered New York-breds are run at New York Racing Association race-tracks (Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course) and Finger Lakes racetrack with total purses exceeding \$4-million. In 2009, more than 900 overnight races exclusively for registered New York-breds were held at the four New York racetracks.


