

The future is now in New York

by Jeffrey A. Cannizzo, Executive Director New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc.

Dear Breeders,

For a long time we will look back on 2011 as the ultimate watershed year for New York's breeding and racing industries.

For the state's breeders, the "before"especially the preceding five years—was marked by uncertainty and amounted to nothing less than a fight for survival while NYTB devoted all of its energy and resources to keeping pace with the final twists and turns of the long, drawn-out political process of choosing a bidder for the Aqueduct racino. Then, we all received a final bombshell: the insolvency and final shuttering of New York City Off-Track Betting Corp. in December 2010.

Resorts World worked around the clock on the Aqueduct casino during 2011 and, although we were JEFFREY A. CANNIZZO all left in something of a "holding pattern" with all

of the most important questions as yet to be answered, positive signs began to come thick and fast.

Swift and effective action by the New York Racing Association did a great deal to fill the gap in handle created by the demise of the off-track bet-taker. Next, the Fund, on receipt of money from a New York City OTB escrow account combined with NYRA's forgiveness of 2010 purse enrichment money, was able to provide some immediate relief by disbursing all breeders' awards withheld in 2010 and about half owed from 2009.

Around midyear, a nearly 40% increase in yearling prices at the Fasig-Tipton New York Saratoga preferred yearling sale proved decisively that confidence in the New York-bred marketplace was returning after years of decline.

All the industry buzz was about New York. Vinery, Adena



Springs, Spendthrift, and Darley committed to stand stallions in the state for 2012, and a major leading commercial farm, Sequel Stallions, reopened for busi-

As 2011 wound down, things continued to fall into all the right places. The Resorts World Casino had its grand opening, and the video lottery terminals (VLTs) are showing every sign of outperforming all projections. NYRA announced a 36% purse hike for Aqueduct's winter-spring meeting, and the Fund announced a 50% increase in breeders' awards.

If NYTB was relegated to a reactive position "pre-2011," and was compelled to play a kind of waiting game as things fell into place in 2011, "post-2011" becomes the most important phase of all. While I think the marketplace will take care of it-

self for the time being, the critical role of NYTB in the future will be to be vigilant and proactive in the legislative

sphere.

Given that we live in a cash-strapped state, we certainly will be compelled—probably sooner than later—to justify our share of Resorts World VLT revenue to the Legislature. Moreover, now that the issue of expanding gaming in the state is moving closer to the foreground, NYTB must ensure that breeders have a voice and a presence in the debate from the start.

I cannot state strongly enough that, in order to protect our future, we need to make lawmakers understand that a healthy and prosperous breeding industry is good business for the state. The message needs to come across loud. And clear. And often. I will keep you up to date on NYTB's legislative agenda and absolutely rely on your help with this critical work for our future.

New York-bred Haynesfield retired, to stand at Airdrie

Two-time New York Horse of the Year and millionaire Haynesfield, winner of the 2010 Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1), will stand in 2012 at Brereton and Libby Jones' Airdrie Stud as an Airdrie Stud-WinStar Farm venture.

A stakes winner at two, three, four, and five, and a winner of ten of 19 lifetime starts, the now-six-year-old chestnut horse by 2004 champion sprinter Speightstown retires with lifetime earnings of \$1,319,481.

The eight-time stakes winner recorded his biggest victory in the 2010 Jockey Club Gold Cup, in which he bested eventual 2010 champion older male Blame by four lengths in the 11/4-mile race under equal weights. The loss was the only defeat incurred by Blame during his championship season.

Haynesfield also captured the 2010 Suburban Handicap (G2) and was beaten by only a head in that season's Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (G1).

Bred in New York by Barry Weisbord and Margaret Santulli and campaigned by Harvey Weinstein's Turtle Bird Stable, Haynesfield is out of Grade 2-placed stakes winner Nothing Special, by Tejabo. His immediate family includes Canadian Broodmares of the Year Shy Spirit and Passing Mood, the latter the dam of graded stakes winners and sires With Approval and Touch Gold.

Haynesfield will stand the 2012 season for \$10,000. In addition to the pay-early and multiple-mare discounts that Airdrie already has in place, first-season breeders to Haynesfield are eligible for the farm's new Breeder's Reward Program.

Any first-season breeding that produces a two- or three-year-

old winner of a graded stakes race in the U.S or Canada will earn the breeder of record a \$50,000 check and a lifetime breeding right to Haynesfield. In addition, if the mare is booked through the farm by an agent, that agent will receive \$20,000.

"We believe this horse has a big future and we want to really reward the people that are helping us get there," Brereton Jones

Longtime New York trainer Ferriola dies at 69


Peter Ferriola, who led the New York Racing Association's trainer standings in 1987, 1991, and 1992, died on December 9 in Spring Hill, Florida, from complications of a stroke and chronic diabetes. He was 69.

Ferriola earned nine meet titles at Aqueduct and two at Belmont Park during his 23-year career, which spanned from 1978 to 2001. He retired with 1,129 wins for total earnings of \$26,292,286.

The biggest of Ferriola's 12 graded stakes victories came in his second year as a trainer, when Koluctoo Bay won the 1979 Young America Stakes (G1) at the Meadowlands for his

first and only Grade 1 victory. Other graded stakes winners trained by Ferriola were Groovy Feeling, Shots Are Ringing, Nome, Argyle Lake, and Tarantara.

A native of Philadelphia, Ferriola began his career in racing in 1969, working for trainer John P. Campo Sr. He later moved to California to work for Bobby Frankel before returning to

New York as Campo's foreman. Ferriola went out on his own in 1978.


"He was a good horseman," said trainer Bruce Levine, who worked for Campo while Ferriola was serving as his foreman. "He was the first one who was running with turndowns. He was ahead of his time. Then everybody started using them. His horses always looked well and ran well."

Ferriola is survived by his wife, Ingrid; daughter, Veronica; son, Peter Jr.; and granddaughters Bella and Holly. His son-in-law, Tony Micallef, is the agent for apprentice jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.

"He took care of so many people and took the

utmost care of his horses," said Veronica Micallef. "All he did were the best things for his horses. He was the most gracious, loving man. If you needed a meal or a dollar, he'd give it to you."

Ferriola was cremated in Florida. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation.


NYTB fills six board seats

New York state of mind

As added gaming money pours into state Thoroughbred industry's coffers, many successful young stallions could find themselves heading to the Empire State

Let the procession begin!

With the infusion of purse money and breeder incentive funds into New York's Thoroughbred racing industry, it is probable that popular, successful stallions from across the country will be making their way to New York to take advantage of this new economic windfall.

And with millions of new dollars pouring into the industry's coffers from added gaming at the Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct, which opened for business on October 29, you can bet that some successful stallions with impressive résumés may make the trip to the Empire State to grab their own share of the jackpot.

The first of the big guns to arrive in New York for the 2012 breeding season is Grade 1 winner Bluegrass Cat, who ranked second on the Thoroughbred Times second-crop sire list by earnings through December 13.

The newly turned nine-year-old by Storm Cat, a Grade 1 winner who was the runner-up in the 2006 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and Belmont Stakes (G1), will stand the upcoming season at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple Farm in Poughquag, New York, as part of a WinStar/Vinery joint venture.

Bluegrass Cat, who is out of the A.P. Indy mare She's a Winner, a full sister to the dam of 2010 Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver, will stand for \$17,500.

Bluegrass Cat had five wins, including the 2006 Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1), and four seconds from 11 starts in his two seasons of

racing and earned \$1,761,280. He is the sire of 59 winners from 132 starters, including multiple graded stakes winner Kathmanblu and Grade 3 winner Sabercat.

"We're ready to make a big splash in New York," WinStar President Elliott Walden said. "It's a market we've looked



The times, they are a-changin'

A look at the sires who helped make New York breeding

Not long ago, America's regional breeding centers were up against the wall when it came to bloodstock acquisition, locked in perpetual second-fiddle mode to the mighty Kentucky.

What the Central Kentucky breeders wanted, they generally got, and breeders in other states were in a tough position trying to compete with Kentucky's insatiable demand for top-tier stallions.

So what were the traditional regional options?

Breed a homegrown star—a Thunder Puddles, Fio Rito, Fratello Ed, Champagneforashley, or Say Florida Sandy.

Take a chance on a promising prospect with a royal pedigree or top-notch race record—but seldom both at the same time.

Acquire a formerly well-regarded horse who had, perhaps, misfired just a bit with his debut crops.

Or, obtain the services of a distinguished stallion in the latter phase of his career, perhaps a Phone Trick or Regal Classic.

The challenge, of course, always has been to find, or luck upon, just the right young stallion, one whose first foals look great and then come out flying. The trick is holding onto him. Striking early success often brings the major farms knocking, a fact that breeders in New York (and Florida) know all too well.

Florida, for example, launched the careers of Mr. Prospector, Fappiano, Kris S., and Northern Afleet before watching them depart on vans headed north. New York's painful goodbyes have included the exits of Belong to Me and City Zip (to Kentucky) and Precise End (to Japan). Catienus and Personal Flag left, but later returned.

Things are changing these days—and quickly. New York's historically marquee-level racing is about to get even better with

the introduction of millions of dollars in casino-generated revenues, money that will increase purses and enhance breeder, owner, and stallion awards.

In anticipation of this, partnerships have been forming between Kentucky and New York breeding operations, with topcredentialed young sires and sire prospects heading in increasing numbers to the Empire State. Expect more of the same in the future.

Most influential

As this new era begins, it seems like a good time to look back and salute those New York stallions of the past who helped to build the industry and left a genetic imprint that lives on today.

Who were the most successful New York-based sires of the past several decades? Not counting those in current service, the list includes the following:

Cormorant (1974 foal). A Grade 1 winner, Cormorant set the pace for most of the first six furlongs in Seattle Slew's 1977 Preakness Stakes (G1) before finishing fourth. He subsequently served 17 New York seasons, where 44 of his 47 career stakes winners were conceived, including 1992 Eclipse Award champion Saratoga Dew, 1994 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Go for Gin (foaled in Kentucky), and Grade 1 winner Grecian Flight. Throughout his time, he often battled Talc for statistical leadership, each taking the state sire title on several occasions during the late 1980s and early 1990s. Cormorant is the broodmare sire of 47 stakes winners, most notably 2005 TVG Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) hero Silver Train, now among the nation's leading second-crop sires of 2011. The son of 1984 leading sire His Majesty died at age 33 in 2007.



Cure the Blues (1978). This son of Stop the Music was a runner of brilliant speed, winning six of ten starts including the 1980 Laurel Futurity (G1). The well-traveled stallion later served mares in Ireland and at several Kentucky farms before arriving in New York in 1994, where he stood his last five seasons. They were brief but productive years, during which he sired 26 stakes winners, including multiple Grade 3 winner Incurable Optimist, Argentina's leading sire of 2009. Cure the Blues, a six-time leading state sire (1995-2000), is the broodmare sire of 2011 Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes (G2) winner Holiday for Kitten and 2010 Mile Championship (Jpn-G1) hero A Shin Forward, both from New York-bred mares.

Talc (1972). A foundation New York sire of the 1970s and 1980s, Talc was rather unstylishly bred, but a hickory-tough racehorse who won 17 of 54 starts including a pair of 1975 Grade 3 stakes at Bowie and Delaware Park. At stud he got runners much like himself—gritty and durable—with more than a touch of class. Talc left behind 65 stakes horses from 16 crops (16.3% of starters), including multiple graded stakes-winning millionaire Lottsa Talc, who is the second dam of 2011 Forego Stakes (G1) winner Jackson Bend.

D'Accord (1979). By Secretariat out of Fanfreluche, D'Accord was a son of two champions and a full brother or half brother to three more. He was no slouch himself, displaying high talent in winning the 1981 Breeders' Futurity (G2) by 7½ lengths. D'Accord began and ended his stud career in New York, where, like Cormorant, he lived into impressive old age, dying at 32 in 2011. Though long-pensioned, he continues to figure prominently in quality pedigrees through his daughters, whose offpring include 2010 Grade 1 winner Franny Freud and earlier Grade 1 winners D'wildcat and Buy the Sport.

Distinctive Pro (1979). This Grade 3-winning Mr. Prospector horse started off in Florida but spent his final 15 seasons (1990-2004) in New York, where he turned out 51 stakes horses—nearly 11% of starters. Most earned their black type in state-bred races, although he did get a graded winner in Dancin Renee. Distinctive Pro's New York-conceived daughters have produced several top performers, among them 2010 Triple Bend Handicap (G1) victor E. Z.'s Gentleman and 2005 Alabama Stakes (G1) winner Sweet Symphony.

Personal Flag (1983). A two-time Grade 1-winning millionaire for owner-breeder Ogden Phipps, Personal Flag was a year-older full brother to unbeaten Racing Hall of Famer Personal Ensign. He stood twice in New York—his first five seasons (1989-1993) and his final five (1999-2003). Those ten crops generated 20 stakes winners, including New York icon Say Florida Sandy. Personal Flag's New York daughters are responsible for 2011 stakes winners Inherit the Gold (G3), Kirkinchi (G3), and Mildly Offensive (at Santa Anita), and he is also the broodmare sire of Grade 2 winner It's No Joke, now a highly ranked second-crop sire in Florida.

Iron Constitution (1974). A contemporary of Cormorant's, this gray Iron Ruler colt battled that rival through the spring of 1977, narrowly defeating him in the Withers Stakes (G2) and outrunning him in the Preakness (finishing a close second to Seattle Slew). He spent his entire 11-season stud career in New York, getting 83% winners from starters and nine stakes winners. Far better as a broodmare sire, his maternal grand-offspring have included 2001 leading freshman sire Valid Expectations. In 2011, Iron Constitution also can be found in the fourth generation of 2011 Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (G1) winner Ultra Blend's family tree, as the maternal great-grandsire of her sire, Richly Rlended

Spectacular Bid (1976). Mentioned here primarily because of his status as one of racing's immortals, Spactacular Bid's impact on the New York breeding industry after 12 seasons there was not particularly striking—just two of his 44 stakes winners were begat there. However, the Hall of Fame champion could turn that around as a broodmare sire. His state-conceived daughters have thus far produced the likes of 2008 Indiana Derby (G2) winner Tin Cup Chalice and Grade 2 winner Spectacular Moon, and since many are still relatively young, their sire's record in this category is likely to improve.

Other stallions who contributed to building the New York breeding industry include A.P Jet, Carr de Naskra, Compliance, Double Negative, Dr. Blum, Flip Sal, Overskate, Thunder Puddles, Policeman (Fr), Proud Appeal, and What Luck ... as well as such living progenitors as Freud, Crusader Sword, and Raffie's Majesty.

Compliance Officer rebounds

La Marca Stable's Officer gelding bounces back with decisive Claiming Crown victory

Although the Breeders' Cup World Championships at the beginning of November marks for some horses the end of the season, competitive racing in both open and state-restricted company offered plenty of opportunities for New York-bred horses to pick up stakes victories during the last six weeks of 2011.

Buoyed by an impressive winning streak, trainer Bruce Brown and La Marca Stable's Tom La Marca sent multiple stakes winner Compliance Officer to Churchill Downs to compete in the TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1) following a dominant victory in the Bluegrass Cat Mohawk Stakes on October 22 on New York Showcase Day.

Brown claimed the five-year-old Officer gelding from Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence in May and conditioned him to five straight victories, including the restricted West Point Stakes in August at Saratoga Race Course and the Ashley T. Cole Stakes in September at Belmont Park.

Following the September win in the Ashley T. Cole, La Marca began to think beyond restricted races for Compliance Officer. Modest, open-company stakes races, however, were not what he had in mind.

"He was eligible for the Breeders' Cup," La Marca said. "I said, 'Bruce, you have to talk me into it.' And he didn't."

Following the five-length victory in the Mohawk Stakes, La Marca changed his mind. After consulting with Brown and jockey Alex Solis, he put up the money to supplement Compliance Officer in the Mile—the race that European star racemare Goldikova (Ire) would attempt to capture for an unprecedented fourth straight year.

Despite an 11th-place finish by Compliance Officer, La Marca was philosophical about his horse's performance, pointing to several factors he felt contributed to the poor showing.

"All racing luck went against him," he said. "He's a horse that needs to be covered up early to run well and, after breaking from post 12, he raced wide the whole trip.

"He was the third horse to get rapped in the Goldikova incident and, as Alex got dislodged a bit, all hope of even a piece [of the purse] was lost at that point. Maybe bringing him back again two weeks after the Mohawk was asking an awful lot."

La Marca, Brown, Solis, and Compliance Officer returned to the winner's circle and capped the season on a triumphant note as they came back on December 3 at Fair Grounds to take the Claiming Crown Emerald Stakes decisively as the odds-on favorite.

The victory boosted Compliance Officer's record to ten wins from 24 starts with 16 top-three finishes. He won six of his eight starts this season and earned a career-best \$305,050.

According to La Marca, the horse has earned a well-deserved rest in Ocala, where he will relax for several months before returning to racing next spring.

"We have great hopes for him," he said. "If all works well, my thought is to skip the Mohawk next year and aim for the Breeders' Cup."

Until then, however, expect to see La Marca and Compliance Officer in New York. Although La Marca has a farm in New Jersey, he uses it primarily for layups and wintering his horses. His mares foal in New York.

"I've got a very keen interest in New York-breds at the mo-

ment," he said. "When I'm looking at horses to claim, 'New York-bred' next to their names gives them more credit."

With purses scheduled to increase in New York beginning on January 1, La Marca is ready to take advantage with his current stable star. He has no plans at this point to run Compliance Officer in open company until the Breeders' Cup.

"I anticipate that New York-bred stakes races will be appreciably higher in terms of the pot," he said. "I'd be a fool not to take advantage of that."

Lovely Lil notches graded stakes win

Compliance Officer was not the only New York-bred to have made some noise in open company of late.

Barry K. Schwartz's homebred Lovely Lil captured her first graded stakes when she won the Go for Wand Handicap (G2) on November 25 at Aqueduct.

Trained by Mike Hushion, Lovely Lil competed in open company prior to the Go for Wand without much success, her best finish being a third in this year's Foxwoods Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) in September at Belmont. She won the restricted Union Avenue Stakes at Saratoga in August, then followed the Gallant Bloom with a second-place finish in the Friendly Island Iroquois Stakes on Showcase Day.

"We really wanted to win a graded stakes with Lovely Lil," Schwartz said. "Last year in the Test [Stakes (G1)], she had a horrible trip; she was taken up, knocked around ... She was doing so well going into that race, we thought we were going to win it."

Schwartz and Lovely Lil got that graded stakes triumph in the Go for Wand as she rewarded her connections' confidence with a 1½-length victory. Bettors, however, lacked similar confidence, sending her off at odds of 15.90-to-1.

"She ran the race of her life," Hushion said. "Hopefully, it will set her up to get some of the big money in January."

Hushion and Schwartz have not yet selected a race for Lovely Lil's next start, although the Barbara Fritchie Handicap (G2) at Laurel Park on February 18 is under consideration. Schwartz indicated that he intends to keep Lovely Lil racing in open company, although a state-bred prep this winter is a possibility.

Lovely Lil is by Tiznow out of the Pentelicus mare How About Now, whom Schwartz also campaigned. How About Now won the 1996 Schuylerville Stakes (G2) and resides at Schwartz's Stonewall Farm in Granite Springs, New York.

Stallion series

The New York Stallion Series for progeny of stallions based in the Empire State was run on November 13 at Aqueduct, and three of the four races were won by favorites.

Shane Roars roared indeed, hanging on to win by a neck after setting the pace throughout and paying \$185.50 to win in the six-furlong race. The Dominic Galluscio-trained two-year-old by Roaring Fever out of Ali Wee is a homebred of Dutchess Views Farms in Pine Plains, New York.

One of the big favorites to take a Stallion Series race was Inherit the Gold, back at his favorite track, Aqueduct, where he has won seven of 11 starts. Cutting back from the 1½ miles of the McMahon Adena Empire Classic Stakes, a race in which he finished seventh in October, Inherit the Gold steadily picked up horses down the stretch to prevail by a neck in the seven-furlong contest.

"Really, he's an incredible horse," trainer Jim Hooper said after the victory. "I thought he was so wide ... I didn't think he

EXPLANATION OF INDEXES

Racing Index (RI)

RI is based on the average earnings per start for all runners in the U.S., Canada, England, Ireland, France, Italy, Germany, Puerto Rico, and United Arab Emirates. RI is determined by calculating the average earnings per start, divided into males and females, of all starters in each individual country, and the average for each individual year is by definition 1.00. Median RI, however, is much lower. Actual distribution of RI is detailed below.

Sire Index (SI)

The Sire Index (SI) is an average of the Racing Index (RI) of all foals by a sire that have started at least three times. For SI to be calculated, a sire must be represented by a minimum of three crops and 25 starters lifetime.

AUCTION INFORMATION

Auction information is for North American sales from

1980 to the present and includes the following:

• Subject horse (stakes winner): All auction activity—weanling, yearling, two-year-olds in training, or horses of racing age sales—found after the winner's name under the first dam.

• Sire of stakes winner: The sire's lifetime and current year

yearling auction information is reported, with number of crops offered at yearling sales (lifetime), number of yearlings sold (lifetime), and average price (lifetime, including yearlings sold in current year), followed by information for the current year. (Current year information is reported beginning October 1; current year information from January 1 through September 30 is in the previous year's auction information.)

· Dam of stakes winner: most recent sale, either as weanling, yearling, or two-year-old in training. Also reported is most recent sale as broodmare (including covering sire) or broodmare prospect, plus any sale of the dam while subiect horse was in utero (including covering sire).

PEDIGREE SYMBOLS

Symbols preceding or following names of horses in pedigrees are used to identify horses that were imported into North America for racing or breeding, and to indicate country of birth. Equal signs preceding a horse's name indicate that a horse was foaled outside the U.S. or Canada and has never been imported to North America; a horse's country of birth appears in parentheses following its name. An asterisk preceding a horse's name indicates the horse was born outside the U.S. or Canada and was imported to North America prior to 1976 (no country codes are included for such horses). Names of horses imported since 1976 include a country code in parentheses following their name and are not preceded by equal signs. Horses that do not have a symbol preceding their name or a country code following their name were foaled in North America.

Breeding Rules

To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

Resident Mares: Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back required.

Non-Resident Mares: Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.

New York State Breeding and Development Fund NY-Breds Award Program

Breeder, owner, and stallion owner awards are based on purse money earned (first through third) while competing in pari-mutuel races run in New York state.

BREEDER AWARDS

Beginning in 2012, breeder awards for New York-breds sired by registered New York stallions will be increased to 30% for first-place finishes and 15% for second- and third-place finishes. Awards for non-New York-sired New York-breds will rise to 15% for first-place finishes and 7.5% for second- and third-place finishes. In addition, the cap on breeder awards for New York-sired New York-breds will be increased in 2012 by 300%, to \$40,000 per horse per race, and the cap on breeder awards for non-New York-sired New York-breds will be increased by 100%, to \$20,000 per horse per race.

STALLION OWNER AWARDS

Stallion owner awards are paid to owners of registered New York-based covering stallions (at time of conception) at up to 7% of earned purses from first through third positions. All stallion owner awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.


OPEN OWNER AWARDS

Owner awards for registered New York-breds sired by a registered New York-based stallion is up to 20% of purses earned from first through third positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward, with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% of purses earned from first through third positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

NEW YORK-BRED RACES

More than 45 stakes races exclusively for registered New York-breds are run at New York Racing Association racetracks (Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course) and Finger Lakes racetrack with total purses exceeding \$4-million. On average, there are more than 700 overnight races exclusively for registered New York-breds annually held at the four New York racetracks.
