Ensuring our and our horses' futures



February has been a busy month for our organization, but I would like to focus on the role of New York Thoroughbred Breeders in two critical new initiatives.

First, NYTB has joined forces with representatives from New York state's racing and agricultural industries to form a new advocacy group, the New York Horse Racing and Agriculture Industry Alliance. The mission of the alliance is to speak and act on behalf of our industry as the state Legislature works its way toward allowing full-scale commercial casinos.

NYTB and its alliance partners—including the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA), various Standardbred industry groups, and the New York Farm Bureau—are committed to making sure that the Legislature does not lose sight of the original dual purpose of the video lottery terminals legislation: fund education and support the job-generating horse racing industry.

There is no question that our alliance has a great case to make. The vast majority of the workforce in gaming and racing comes directly or indirectly from the equine industry—a bloc of tax-paying workers 40,000 strong who are employed from the breeding shed to the shedrow and everywhere in between. Without across-theboard cooperation, however, the case might not be heard. Forming a cross-industry alliance of horsemen and breeders is an absolutely vital step toward safeguarding the futures of all of us.



Through a new program called Career², we and our partners will begin by co-sponsoring Thoroughbred-only di-

visions for hunters and jumpers at two AA-rated horse shows to be held at Saratoga Race Course in the spring—the Skidmore College Saratoga Classic Horse Show and the Saratoga Springs Horse Show.

We want people to know that when Thoroughbreds have finished their careers at the racetrack, they have options other than just being turned out in a field at a farm. Two decades ago, Thoroughbreds were utilized much more in the hunter-jumper community. The hope is that the incentives of the Career² program will begin to turn back the clock in New York by creating fresh demand for Thoroughbreds on the show circuit. Obviously, no single approach can serve the needs of every horse looking for a future upon retirement, but we want to spread the news that for some Thoroughbreds, a second career as a show horse is just the right answer.

New York group looks to protect racing interests

A new industry alliance in New York hopes to ensure that if gambling is expanded in the state that any new players will continue to contribute to the state's horse racing and breeding.

The New York Horse Racing and Agriculture Industry Alliance said on February 7 in a release that its mission is to secure support and protection for racing and agriculture in any amendment to New York's constitution to allow for full-scale casinos. The group said it is the first time that horsemen, breeders, farmers, and agricultural industry representatives have been brought together in the state.

New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo has suggested that true table games, staffed with people, could be added in the state. Currently, racinos allow video lottery terminals and electronic table games.

Cuomo has nixed suggestions for a new casino at Belmont Park while touting plans for "the nation's largest convention center and a possible casino at Aqueduct."

Genting, the owners of Resorts World Casino And horse New York City at Aqueduct, said in late January that it needs a bigger piece of revenue to build a proposed 3.8-million-square-foot convention center at the racetrack.

Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct opened in October and has performed better than expected, with millions of dollars raised to boost purses at the track and awards for the state's breeder incentive programs.

Cuomo says his desire is to amend the state constitution to legalize non-Native American gambling in the Empire State. Genting has said it would expand the current racino if such a measure clears the Legislature and a public referendum. The expansion would make the Aqueduct racino a full-fledged casino, without sports gambling.

The new alliance was established to ensure the industry has a voice in whatever decisions are made. Its stated goal is to make

sure that, even with any changes, horse racing and breeding will continue to receive support because it is responsible for 40,000 jobs in the state.

"While we study new ways to stimulate the economy in our state, it is vitally important that we weigh each decision to make sure that we continue to preserve and protect industries that already support tens of thousands of jobs," said Dean Norton, president of New York Farm Bureau. "The equine industry that includes farmers and breeders is a perfect example. Any move toward full-scale casino gambling must include specific provisions that will continue the state's long-standing policy of using such revenues to support New York racing and agri-

culture. This is a case where it is very important to look closely before we leap."

Members of the alliance, an informal, informational alliance of existing groups and organizations with similar interests, goals, and messages, will request no dues, and the organization does not intend to expend independent funds.

"The first topic to come up in most discussions of the gaming and racing industry is jobs," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. "The fact is, the vast majority of the workforce in gaming and racing comes directly or indirectly from the equine industry. The associations joining forces in this alliance represent a bloc of tax-paying workers 40,000 strong, who are employed from the breeding shed, to the shedrow, and everywhere in between. We want to

make sure that legislators hear the message that New York needs to protect the futures of such a large group with so much to contribute to the economic health of our state."


Gus Schoenborn Jr., former owner of Contemporary Stallions in Coxsackie, New York, will own 25% of the property.

Congressionalhonor to Sandy Way Farm

Congressionalhonor, a half brother to 2005 Horse of the Year Saint Liam, will stand the 2012 breeding season at Sandy Way Farm in Coventry, New York, for owner Angelo Katrakazos.

An 11-year-old horse by Forestry, Congressionalhonor was bred in Kentucky by Edward P. Evans. Out of stakes winner Quiet Dance, by Quiet American, Congressionalhonor is a half brother to the late Saint Liam, 2005 Horse of the Year and sire of 2011



Horse of the Year Havre de Grace. Congressionalhonor, who raced for two seasons, won the Bay Meadows Derby (G3) on turf, won or placed in nine of 15 starts, and earned \$112,413.

Congressionalhonor entered stud in 2006, standing in Pennsylvania before

moving to Oklahoma Equine in Washington, Oklahoma, for the 2011 breeding season. He has 153 foals from five crops and his progeny have earned more than \$650,000.

Congressionalhonor's 2012 stud fee is \$2,500, live foal stands and nurses. A special consideration will be made for New Yorkfoaling mares.

Edition Farm hires Winters as farm manager

Edition Farm, twice voted New York breeder of the year, has hired Fred Winters as farm manager.

A graduate of Arizona State University, Winters has had a long career as a farm manager in Central Kentucky. He has run his own farm and managed Lazy Lane Farm in Kentucky and also worked with Ron Wallace at Farm Equine Management.

"Mrs. [Vivien] Malloy and I are very excited to have Fred managing Edition Farm," said Craig Bandoroff, whose Denali Stud recently established a strategic alliance with Edition Farm. "He brings a lifetime of experience in farm management in the Thoroughbred industry.'

Winters said he was thrilled by the opportunity.

"I am humbled to have been selected as farm manager for the twicehonored New York Thoroughbred breeder of the year," Winters said. "I am looking forward to working with both teams to develop the strategic alliance, to the benefit of all of our clients."

Cohen, owner of Hudson County, dead

Robert B. Cohen, founder of the Hudson News chain and a Thoroughbred owner, died on February 1 from progressive supranuclear palsy, a neurological disease. He was 86.

Cohen raced multiple Grade 3 winner Hudson County, who finished second to Cannonade in the 1974 Kentucky Derby (G1).

Cohen was the president of a major newspaper distributor owned by his father, the Hudson County News Co., when it took over a bankrupt newsstand at Newark International Airport in the 1970s.

Cohen saw the need to provide a better retail experience for passengers and aimed to create a more welcoming newsstand experience. In 1987, he launched a brightly lit, inviting newsstand at LaGuardia Airport that featured hundreds of magazines and led to a successful retail chain with approximately 600 stores across the country.





Big business

New York tracks generally offered high average purses in 2011

Racing horses in New York is a challenge, as owners know. It is a tough circuit, and to win a single race is a big accomplishment.

New York racing is tough because of many things—tradition, the trainers, the horses—but a lot of it has to do with the purses, which are very good. The New York Racing Association tracks—Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course—offer some of the best purses in North America, and the stakes races are especially rich.

In 2011, Saratoga offered the richest average purse per race in North America, \$67,415. Second nationally was Del Mar, the other premier summer meeting, at \$62,630. By comparison, the average purse in North America in 2011 was \$22,734. All the NYRA tracks offered average purses far in excess of that, while Finger Lakes near Canandaigua offered an average purse of \$11,481 for its 159 racing days in 2011.

Saratoga

The average purse for stakes races at Saratoga in 2011 was \$174,541, the highest in the nation, for 73 stakes in just 39 racing days. The stakes purses consumed 47.6% of the total money distributed at the meet, more than twice the North American average of 23.6% of total purses offered in stakes for the year. While stakes offered such lucrative purses, their average field size was 7.4, one of the lowest for any class of race at Saratoga. Maiden claiming races featured some of the largest fields on average, 9.0 starters per race.

The large total purse money distributed in stakes meant the average overnight purse was far less than the overall average for the meet. The largest average purse for a non-stakes race class was the \$54,982 offered for optional claiming races. Straight maiden races offered a similar \$51,540 per race.

Belmont Park

The 36-day Belmont fall meeting, noted for its championship races, had the second-highest average purse per race in the state,

\$53,014. Its average stakes featured a purse of \$149,860, while optional claiming races offered an average of \$49,870.

Claiming races at the Belmont fall meeting comprised 43.7% of all races but offered just 21.2% of all purses, for an average of \$25,734. While less than half the overall average purse for the meeting, it is still almost double the North American average of \$13,035 in 2011 for claiming races.

The spring-summer meeting at Belmont Park featured an average purse of \$48,985 for 526 races at the 55-day meeting. Claiming races featured an average purse of \$23,925, as 44.5% of all races and 21.7% of all purses were for claiming horses. Maiden claiming races featured the highest average number of starters, 8.3, about 8% fewer horses on average than for maiden claiming races at the Belmont fall meeting.

Aqueduct

The Aqueduct meetings, both the winter-spring and fall, are much closer to the North American averages in terms of overnight purses and stakes purses as percentage of money distributed. The winter-spring Aqueduct meeting offered 51 stakes in 73 days, with an average purse of \$100,604, accounting for 23.4% of all money distributed at the meet.

Claiming races comprised 59.7% of all races and distributed 36.2% of all purses, for an average purse of \$20,035. Many of the top horses are gone for the winter, thus the focus on claimers, with straight claiming races totaling 251 races and maiden claiming races totaling 145.

There was about one maiden race a day, with 70 maiden races in the 73 days, accounting for 10.6% of all races and distributing 12.9% of all purses.

The signature of the 37-day fall Aqueduct meeting is its Thanksgiving weekend stakes program, with the Cigar Mile Handicap (G1) and five other graded stakes, but the meet offered the lowest average stakes purse, \$91,459, of all the NYRA meetings.

Maiden races were especially abundant at the fall meeting,

comprising 18.3% of all races and 20.8% of all purses, with claiming races the largest category, with 48.6% of all races and 28.2% of all purses.

Finger Lakes


The main fare at Finger Lakes is its claiming races. Three out of every four races is for claimers, and those 75.6% of all races distributed 57.4% of all the track's purses. The average claiming purse was \$8,718, 33.1% less than the North American average for claiming races.

The largest group for any class of horses at the track was claiming races for less than \$5,000. Almost half (48% to be exact) of all races at Finger Lakes fell into that category. There were another 119 maiden-claiming races for less than \$5,000, adding another 8.4% of total races to that category, for a total of 803 races for horses starting for less than \$5,000 claiming.

Stakes were far and few between at Finger Lakes, with just four stakes, but they were worth a whopping average of \$170,500, distributing 4.2% of total purses from just 0.3% of total races.

A kiss for luck

Brilliant and thus far unbeatable, Agave Kiss was bred to fly

Tomorrow is a land of golden promise in the world of Thoroughbreds. Racing's human denizens bargain with God and fate, hoping to stick around long enough to see that upcoming crop hit the track ... then the one after that, and after that ... to witness the next good thing, the megastar we just know is waiting in the wings, that once-in-a-lifetime horse. Such was Carl Lizza Jr.'s dream in the early summer of 2011.

The master of Flying Zee Stable knew he had some promising two-year-olds in the pipeline, but his health was failing, and he knew that, too. In his race against time, Lizza lost, dying in his sleep on July 8. The juveniles he had so anticipated would include a future Grade 3 winner in Pure Gossip, a New York-bred restricted stakes winner in Night Maneuver, and a blaze-faced buzz saw named Agave Kiss.

The latter may well be the best of the bunch, possibly the best ever bred or raced in 30-plus years by Lizza's Flying Zee Stable, whose colors were once carried by Eclipse Award winner Wayward Lass and multiple Grade 1 winner Noble Nashua. As yet, Agave Kiss does not merit inclusion in such company—she has won twice in state-bred company, before galloping home in Aqueduct's Ruthless Stakes on January 14, all at six furlongs. But, oh, *how* she did it!

The red-coated filly is getting outsized attention these days, and deservedly so. One blogger referred to her as an "absolute monster" after she crushed all rivals in her first two starts, by 61/4 lengths in her debut and 101/2 lengths in an allowance race, by the easiest margins you will ever see. Another called her "a superstar in the making," while her trainer, Rudy Rodriguez, quietly understated: "She's a special one."

Terms like "mighty" and "utterly effortless" also have been bantered about, while official charts have raved in a way one seldom sees. "Outbroke field ... on cruise control ... drew off." "Rushed to lead ... under wraps through stretch, easily." "Urged to front, hand-ridden from quarter."

Was it blind luck that brought this potentially remarkable filly into existence, or was it somehow written in the cards? Certainly, the paths of her sire and dam—Lion Heart and Salty Romance—did seem to cross in curious ways through the years, and their common thread was Carl Lizza.

Once had Lion Heart

With partners, Lizza had purchased Lion Heart, a son of Tale of the Cat, for \$100,000 as a yearling in 2002, then offered him at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale of selected two-year-olds in training the next year to dissolve that partnership. Lion Heart flew a preview-fast eighth-mile in :10 and was generating a lot of buzz when Lizza began having second thoughts. As the colt circled the sales ring, the New York owner-breeder jumped into the fray—taking it all the way to \$1.35-million before deferring to Demi O' Byrne's \$1.4-million sale-topping bid on behalf of Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. Lizza was thereafter relegated to bystander status, watching with interest as Lion Heart became a standout juvenile, a Grade 1-winning, classic-placed three-year-old, and eventually one of America's outstanding young sires.

A month after losing Lion Heart, Lizza fell in love again—this time with a filly named Salty Romance at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. March selected two-year-olds in training sale. The

strong-willed, sometimes obstreperous daughter of Salt Lake had uncorked the fastest quarter-mile of the previews (:21) and looked the part of a good one. "She's strong and powerful ... with superior action," Lizza enthused, after signing a hefty \$320,000 sale ticket. "I thought she was the best filly in the sale."

Lizza turned Salty Romance over to trainer Patrick Biancone, who also happened to have Lion Heart under his shedrow—allowing Lizza to keep close tabs on the one that got away. At Hollywood Park on November 15, 2003, Biancone saddled Salty Romance for a 4½-length maiden victory, going six furlongs in a snappy 1:09.58. Ninety-three minutes later, he sent Lion Heart out for the sevenfurlong Jack Daniel's Hollywood Prevue Stakes (G3), which the colt won by six lengths in a scorching 1:20.63. Neither horse was headed that day, and both were heavy favorites.

Biancone kept Lion Heart in California where he would later glide to victory in the Hollywood Futurity (G1), while Salty Romance shipped to Delta Downs for a shot at males in the \$1-million Boyd Gaming's Delta Jackpot Stakes. When her \$28,440 in earnings proved inadequate to get her into the starting gate, Biancone entered her instead in the one-mile, \$250,000 Boyd Gaming's Delta Princess Stakes. She won by $5\frac{1}{4}$ lengths easily.


Together, Lion Heart and Salty Romance won five of six starts at two, including three stakes. Each possessed explosive early speed and each had the ability to stretch it out beyond sprint distances in good company. When the Experimental Free Handicap was published for 2003, Lion Heart ranked among the top five males of his generation, Salty Romance among the top 20 females. Both would be nominated for the 2004 Triple Crown—Salty Romance one of just ten fillies.

Good at three

The parallels were less distinct in 2004. Lion Heart went on to bigger and better things. He set a fleet pace in the Kentucky Derby (G1), then held on with grit to finish second behind Smarty Jones. He stumbled and ripped a shoe off at the start of the Long

Branch Breeders' Cup Stakes (G3), yet recovered to win; he broke like a rocket and led every step of the \$1-million Haskell Invitational Handicap (G1). "You haven't seen one like this in a long, long time," Biancone emphatically assured reporters along the way. "This may be the next Secretariat. He's unbelievable!"

On the flip side, Salty Romance's front-running ways would prove her undoing at three. She faded to second in the $1\frac{1}{16}$ -mile Santa Ysabel Stakes (G3), then backed up some 22 lengths in the final quarter-mile of the Santa Anita Oaks (G1) over the same distance. After spectacularly running out of gas in the sevenfurlong La Brea Stakes (G1), her career came to a close with three victories in eight starts and earnings of \$229,200.

It so happens that Lion Heart also was finished, though that had not been part of Biancone's grand plan for him. On August 28, 2004, he broke a bone in his foot as favorite in the Travers Stakes (G1), finishing last, and was summarily retired to Ashford Stud in Kentucky.

Date with destiny

A couple of years later, Lizza and his wife, Viane, formed a partnership called Nustar Breeding. Flying Zee Stable annually ranked among the most successful New York racing operations, but Lizza wanted more, perhaps another Wayward Lass, perhaps something even better. The plan for some time had been to improve Flying Zee's racing program by breeding better mares to better stallions—often to sires based in Kentucky—then return them to foal at his Highcliff Farm in New York. Salty Romance was among the Nustar mares sent to the Bluegrass early in 2008. Her date with destiny? Lion Heart.

The product of this mating arrived on March 10, 2009, in the form of a flashy, chrome-plated chestnut filly. Named for a decadent tequila- and chocolate-based cocktail, Agave Kiss inherited her coat color and jack-rabbit speed from her sire, and, for good measure, an extra dollop of front-running exuberance from her


dam. Despite those layers of speed on speed, she herself intriguingly possesses the dosage index (1.40) and center of distribution (0.33) indicative of a horse who will run longer distances.

Lion Heart—America's leading third-crop sire of 2010—was purchased that year by the Turkish Jockey Club and sent abroad. This past December, Salty Romance topped the breeding stock portion of the Flying Zee dispersal, at \$260,000, and now awaits the early April arrival of a foal by multiple Grade 3 winner Cosmonaut.

And Agave Kiss? Only questions remain. What next? How good? What if? Will the stars align and the fates be kind? Will she someday be the horse her late owner was looking for, the one to provide a joyous exclamation point to a long career in racing? Time will tell.

New York-breds heating up winter months

Mr. Vegas, Dayatthespa hit road to pick up graded stakes victories for New York connections

In the midst of an unseasonably warm New York winter, New York-breds were downright hot, both in and out of town.

Mr. Vegas won the first graded stakes race of his career when he captured the Colonel E. R. Bradley Handicap (G3) at Fair Grounds on January 21. It was the seventh victory from 21 lifetime starts for the five-year-old son of Freud, leading New York sire of stakes winners for the past four years.

Mr. Vegas has an enviable travel schedule: winter in New Orleans, fall in Chicago, spring and summer in New York. While in his home state, he runs for trainer Christophe Clement; out of town, he resides in the barn of trainer Richie Scherer. He has won four of his past nine starts, including his three most recent starts, was second in four others, and his success has put a planned vacation on hold.

"He's been really competitive and consistent," Scherer said recently from New Orleans. "We thought we'd run him once and then turn him out for the winter to get him ready for New York."

Mr. Vegas made his first start at Fair Grounds on November

26, and Scherer was not sure that the horse's running style and the configuration of the track would be a good match.

"He's a neat horse, but he's always been kind of difficult," Scherer said. "He's aggressive and wants to run off in the morning, and he does the same in the races, usually getting nailed late. I didn't think he'd love this long stretch because he gets caught late, but he won by a nose—although he did almost get nailed again.

"So when he won, we thought, 'Okay, we'll race him one more time,' and then he won again. At this point, he's running so well and he's sound, so I don't really know when we're going to stop. He's supposed to be resting right now, but I'm not going to tell him that."

Bred by Berkshire Stud, Mr. Vegas is owned by Paul and Gilmary Andrews, who purchased him at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred yearlings in 2008 for \$23,000.

"We've been calling audibles with him," Andrews said from

his home in Chicago. "He's been getting dramatically better over the past year and, every time I think of giving him a break, he comes out of the race better than when he went in; stronger and full of himself."

Although Mr. Vegas' campaign is still a bit up in the air, the Fair Grounds Handicap (G3) on February 25 is a possibility for his next start. Andrews is not sure whether the horse will be based in Chicago or in New York this summer, but the latter's state-bred stakes program is the summer target. If he does spend the dog days in New York, Mr. Vegas will return to Clement.

Andrews said that Mr. Vegas probably would get a break after the Fair Grounds Handicap before heading north for his New York campaign. Another win, however, and that long-delayed hiatus might just have to wait a little longer.

Another good Day

Mr. Vegas wasn't the only New York-bred to capture out-ofstate black type in January. On January 22 at Gulfstream Park, Chad Brown trainee Dayatthespa scored a decisive victory in the Sweetest Chant Stakes.

The City Zip filly out of M'Lady Doc captured her career debut last summer at Saratoga Race Course, then finished second in the Natalma Stakes (Can-G3) at Woodbine in September, finishing two lengths in front of eventual Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G2) winner Stephanie's Kitten. In that race, Dayatthespa finished ninth, and Brown attributed his filly's poor performance to her dislike of the surface, which was listed as good.

"She just didn't handle the turf very well," Brown said, "and it was obvious to all of us that that was the issue. We drew a line through it."

Dayatthespa wins Sweetest Chant Stakes at Gulfstream

Brown is looking at the Herecomesthebride Stakes (G3) on March 11 at Gulfstream Park as a potential next start, and probably will take her to Keeneland Race Course before coming back to New York later in the spring. Brown said he has not ruled out running her on a synthetic surface.

Dayatthespa is owned by Jerry Frankel, Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon, and Bradley Thoroughbreds. She was bred by Castellare DiCracchiolo Stable, Cracchiolo, and Goldsher and purchased for \$50,000 at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred yearlings.

Completing the exacta in the Sweetest Chant was New Yorkbred Wholelottashakin. Wholelottashakin is by Scat Daddy and out of Carr Shaker. She was bred by Mia Gallo and is owned by Parting Glass Stable.

Back in New York, three-year-old Agave Kiss kept her perfect record intact as she stepped into stakes company to capture the Ruthless Stakes on January 14 by 31/4 lengths. She has won her three starts by a combined 20 lengths.

Agave Kiss is owned by Flying Zee Stable and was bred by that stable's breeding operation, Nustar Breeding LLC. (See Pedigree Profile, page 18.)

The man at the helm of those operations, Carl Lizza, died in July, before he could see Agave Kiss race as she made her first start in October. Lizza's widow, Viane, dispersed much of the stable after his death, but Agave Kiss is one of the horses that she kept.

"Mr. Lizza didn't get to see her run," trainer Rudy Rodriguez said. "but I know he's watching."

Rodriguez said that Flying Zee "got a lot of offers for a lot of money" to sell Agave Kiss, but made the decision to keep her.


"Thank God they didn't sell her," he said. "I'm grateful for the opportunity to train her."

Agave Kiss will make her first start in a graded stakes race in the Cicada Stakes (G3) on March 10. The long-term goal is the Prioress Stakes (G1) at Belmont this summer, and Rodriguez will not look much beyond that.

"Hopefully," he said, "she'll take us where we want to go." Rodriguez began training in 2010 after a 20-year career as a jockey. Now, he rides Agave Kiss in the morning but says he is not tempted to get back in the saddle on race day.

"That would be a thrill," he said, "but no—but I have to talk myself out of it."

EXPLANATION OF INDEXES

Racing Index (RI)

RI is based on the average earnings per start for all runners in the U.S., Canada, England, Ireland, France, Italy, Germany, Puerto Rico, and United Arab Emirates. RI is determined by calculating the average earnings per start, divided into males and females, of all starters in each individual country, and the average for each individual year is by definition 1.00. Median RI, however, is much lower. Actual distribution of RI is detailed below.

Sire Index (SI)

The Sire Index (SI) is an average of the Racing Index (RI) of all foals by a sire that have started at least three times. For SI to be calculated, a sire must be represented by a minimum of three crops and 25 starters lifetime.

AUCTION INFORMATION

Auction information is for North American sales from 1980 to the present and includes the following:

• Subject horse (stakes winner): All auction activity—wean-

ling, yearling, two-year-olds in training, or horses of racing age sales—found after the winner's name under the first dam.

• Sire of stakes winner: The sire's lifetime and current year

yearling auction information is reported, with number of crops offered at yearling sales (lifetime), number of yearlings sold (lifetime), and average price (lifetime, including yearlings sold in current year), followed by information for the current year. (Current year information is reported beginning October 1; current year information from January 1 through September 30 is in the previous year's auction information.)

· Dam of stakes winner: most recent sale, either as weanling, yearling, or two-year-old in training. Also reported is most recent sale as broodmare (including covering sire) or broodmare prospect, plus any sale of the dam while subiect horse was in utero (including covering sire).

PEDIGREE SYMBOLS

Symbols preceding or following names of horses in pedigrees are used to identify horses that were imported into North America for racing or breeding, and to indicate country of birth. Equal signs preceding a horse's name indicate that a horse was foaled outside the U.S. or Canada and has never been imported to North America; a horse's country of birth appears in parentheses following its name. An asterisk preceding a horse's name indicates the horse was born outside the U.S. or Canada and was imported to North America prior to 1976 (no country codes are included for such horses). Names of horses imported since 1976 include a country code in parentheses following their name and are not preceded by equal signs. Horses that do not have a symbol preceding their name or a country code following their name were foaled in North America.



To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

Resident Mares: Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back required.

Non-Resident Mares: Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.
