

The year ahead

Dear Breeders,

Little by little, the days are starting to get longer here in wintry Saratoga Springs, nature's expression of what I believe is going on with our industry here in New York: It will be a while until spring and summer, but our darkest days are behind us.

On the racing front, the New York Racing Association is holding its own in the post-New York City Off-Track Betting Corp. era. A good number of New York City OTB patrons are going to Aqueduct for live racing or to the upgraded Belmont Café.

Participation in the NYRA Rewards program and NYRA's phone betting system both have increased dramatically. NYRA also is now streaming races live from Aqueduct. Numbers are fluid due to the

winter break at Aqueduct between Christmas and New Year, but NYRA officials are guardedly optimistic. You should remember that the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund's share of the on-track handle is proportionately greater than its share of what it received from New York City OTB handle.

Probably most important to you in the short term is great news about the Fund's payment of 2010 awards. The numbers are still

being crunched, but it is clear that breeders will be receiving much more in 2010 holdback money than anyone—including me—imagined possible after the vicissitudes of last year. The Fund and I will provide full details very soon.


We already are hard at work on our 2011 legislative agenda and mapping out Lobby Days. We will be seeking whatever can be salvaged for the Fund from the bankruptcy of New York City OTB and supporting any proposal to investigate the impact on breeders of accepting out-of-state advance deposit wagering in the state.

Another area of interest will be looking at potential agricultural tax benefits/relief for Thoroughbred farm owners and breeders. As we did last year, we will be working to update and stream-

line Fund statute.

Finally, as you already know, I am participating in discussions with the Fund and representatives from the racetracks about the future shape of racing in New York in the post-video lottery terminals era. I soon will be distributing a survey to solicit breeders' input on important issues involving the past and future structure of the award system.

Best wishes for the brighter days to come.

NYRA moves quickly to stem OTB losses

After shutdown, quick action on NYRA Rewards, buses, Belmont Cafe, and television

New York City Off-Track Betting Corp.'s shutdown at midnight on December 7 was not the result that the New York Racing Association had sought or wanted. Indeed, NYRA had supported its reorganization plan as a member of the bankruptcy creditors' committee and in the New York Assembly.

But New York's ingrained brinkmanship politics always is unpredictable, and NYRA's management had a game plan in hand in case the shutdown occurred, which happened when the state Senate failed to approve the reorganization plan earlier on December 7

NYRA's game plan had several components, and within hours of the shutdown some pieces were already being put in place. The major components were:

- Easy access to NYRA Rewards, the racing organization's online wagering system;
- Launching full-card simulcast wagering at Belmont Park's Belmont Café;
- Moving former New York City OTB patrons to the tracks through charter bus services; and
- Restoring television access to NYRA races through the city's cable system and live video streaming.

The goal ultimately is to build a combination of convenience wagering and television signals to penetrate the five New York City boroughs and to reach beyond the immediate metropolitan area—the largest in the U.S.—and extend throughout the state.

The need to act quickly was compelling. New York City OTB channeled \$243-million in wagers to NYRA each year, slightly more than 10% of its \$2.3-billion annual handle.

NYTB schedules online season auction

New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. will conduct its annual stallion-season auction February 3-7.

The Thursday-through-Monday auction will be held online using the Starquine bidding platform at *www.starquine.com* and will feature a rich mix of seasons to Kentucky, New York, and other regional stallions.

The annual auction supports the New York Thoroughbred Breeders and its political action committee in promoting the welfare of New York's Thoroughbred industry and ensuring that the state's breeders are heard in discussions and debates affecting the breeding and racing industry.

Because NYRA received a relatively small slice of the OTB wagering, roughly 2.5%, NYRA officials calculated that they needed to capture 35% of the OTB traffic to regain revenues from that share of the market. Bets on-track and through NYRA Rewards provide approximately 10% each to purses and the track operation.

The effort still is in its first 100 days, and it is too early to measure its success. But track officials said more than 1,500 bettors have signed up for NYRA Rewards since the push began in early December.

The first steps taken by NYRA were to make NYRA Rewards more accessible through instant sign-ups, either at the track or online, and permitting immediate deposits into the accounts. Simultaneously, NYRA opened Belmont to full-card simulcasting at the Café.

Those changes required action by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, which quickly moved to grant approvals. The Belmont Café opened on December 12, and the instant signups for NYRA Rewards started three days later.

To attract new NYRA Rewards members, double rebates were offered for the first three months of 2011 to new sign-ups, ranging from a minimum of 2.5% on monthly wagers exceeding \$2,000 up to 9% on exotic wagers for those betting more than \$500,000 in a month.

On January 1, NYRA rolled out a promotion for new sign-ups under which \$100 or more in wagers in January would result in a one-time, \$100 cash payment to the member's NYRA Rewards account.

Opening Belmont Café also yielded immediate benefit. Crowds were sufficiently large that the simulcast area was expanded, increasing capacity from 350 bettors to 500.

"With the typically strong racing expected from Santa Anita [Park] and Gulfstream [Park] this winter, we're pleased to offer an expansion and a number of improvements to our new simulcast area," NYRA President Charles Hayward said. Among the improvements were 18 flat-screen television monitors.

Getting former New York City OTB bettors to the track or to Belmont Café also was a priority. Not only would the bus service move betting dollars to the track but also provide NYRA with an opportunity to sign up new NYRA Rewards members and offer instruction on how to use the betting service by phone or online.

Service from all boroughs began shortly after the OTB shutdown, but the schedule was revised in January to discontinue

service to Staten Island. Service to the Bronx was eliminated, as was one of four Queens routes. Beginning in early January, NYRA began service from the Queens Village stop on the Long Island Rail Road to Belmont Café.

In late December, NYRA fully implemented the video portion of its strategy. Live video streaming of NYRA's races to the NYRA Rewards website began on December 29. Eight days earlier, the Racing and Wagering Board had approved live streaming for NYRA and regional OTBs for one year.

NYRA also completed a deal with New York City in late December to provide racing content for two channels, 71 and 73, on Time Warner and Cablevision basic cable services. Those channels previously had carried New York City OTB's racing signal.

"We would like to thank the city of New York for working with us to return racing content," Hayward said. "The restoration of these channels is a positive step for the New York racing industry, and we are pleased to be able to provide customers in the city with television racing coverage."

The channels will carry NYRA races and commentary as well as simulcast signals. They will operate from 11 a.m. EST until the conclusion of the West Coast racing programs.—Don Clippinger

Report expected on future of off-track betting

The head of New York's Assembly racing committee will submit a report about the future of off-track betting to new Gov. Andrew Cuomo within the next several weeks.

New York City Off-Track Betting Corp., which had handled \$750-million in wagers annually, closed in December when the state Senate refused to approve legislation that would have kept it open.

Shortly after, the Assembly Committee on Racing, Gaming, and Wagering obtained testimony from off-track betting, race-



track, and other industry officials at a hearing in Albany, the state capital.

"I've always said we don't need six OTBs in the state," committee Chairman J. Gary Pretlow (D-Yonkers) said on January 7. "They've really outlived their usefulness.

Yes, we need OTB, but do we need six OTBs fighting each other? It leads to a lot of inconsistencies."

Five separate regional OTB groups remain in New York—two on Long Island (Nassau and Suffolk) and three upstate (Catskill, Capital, and Western). Pretlow said the competition between them—and New York's racetracks—became painfully evident during New York City OTB's final hours.

"The other OTBs killed New York [City] OTB," he said. "They lobbied against legislation that would have kept it open."

The other firms argued that they should get the same benefits, such as statutory reductions in payments to racing and government, as New York City OTB.

"But this was a bankruptcy proceeding," Pretlow said. "This wasn't about getting them benefits. Because [New York City] OTB closed, the state acquired another \$600-million in debt, 1,000 people lost jobs, and OTB retirees lost their health benefits."

One month later, the jury is still out on whether New York City OTB's closure is more or less serious than expected. The New York Racing Association's account wagering business, NYRA Rewards, has gone up significantly and attendance has risen noticeably at Aqueduct—for live racing and simulcasting—and at Belmont Park's Belmont Café, a simulcast facility.

Both Nassau and Suffolk OTBs have seen increased wagering as well.—*Paul Post*

"During 2010 NYTB made significant progress in addressing the most challenging issues NYTB has ever confronted," Ostrager said. "I'm pleased that all of our officers will continue to serve in the positions they held in 2010."

Looking forward to the year ahead, Ostrager added: "My hope is that with the very able assistance of our executive director, Jeff Cannizzo, we will be able to finally put the New York breeding program on a footing that will give New York breeders the incentives and opportunities we have all been working so hard to secure."

New York newcomer Posse earns general and juvenile sire titles in first year at Vinery New York

Posse collars a championship

Vinery New York's newcomer in 2010 reigns as champion general, juvenile sire

Posse, a newcomer to the New York breeding industry in 2010, rounded up two titles in his initial year at Vinery New York, reigning as champion general sire and champion juvenile sire.

The Silver Deputy horse, now 11, took down the general sire title with more than \$4.27-million in progeny earnings and finished the year roughly \$300,000 ahead of Freud, the Sequel Stallions stalwart who ruled as the leading New York sire in 2008 and 2009.

With Grade 1 winner Franny Freud, Freud was the runaway leader of sires of New York-breds.

Posse's first New York-breds will arrive this year and will reach the racetrack in 2013. He was well received by New York breeders, with 86 mares bred to him reported to the Jockey Club through the end of the year. Among New York stallions, that total was second only to Freud's 110 mares bred.

Posse picked up his first champion in 2007, when Kodiak Kowboy was voted Canada's champion two-year-old male after victories in the Saratoga Special (G2) and Victoria Stakes and a

third-place finish in the Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1). In 2009, he was voted an Eclipse Award as champion male sprinter after winning the Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (G1), the Vosburgh Stakes (G1), and the Carter Handicap (G1).

Although Kodiak Kowboy was retired after his Eclipse-winning season, the hits kept coming for Posse in 2010. His leading earner was Comedero, who put together a five-race string of dominant victories to open the year.

Peter Redekop's gelding out of the Sir Richard Lewis mare Pawnee Patti started the year at Oaklawn Park, where he won the Mountain Valley and Rainbow Stakes. Based at Delaware Park with trainer Michael Stidham, Comedero ventured to Charles Town Races to win the Blue and Gold Stakes and then scored in the Chick Lang Stakes Presented by Apple Ford (G3) at Pimlico Race Course on the Preakness Stakes (G1) undercard.

He returned to Charles Town for his richest payday of the year,

an easy 2½-length victory in the \$400,000 Red Legend Stakes. He subsequently finished fifth in the Smarty Jones Stakes and fourth in the Gallant Bob Stakes, both at Parx Racing, the former Philadelphia Park. From eight starts, Comedero had five victories and earned \$467,600 during his three-year-old season.

Also among Posse's six 2010 stakes winners was Richard Santulli's Check Point, who won Monmouth Park's \$70,000 Honey Bee Stakes in November. Trained by Alan Goldberg, the now-five-year-old mare out of Turning Point, by Rahy, earned \$126,180 last year.

Right behind her in 2010 earnings was Posse's top two-year-old, Caleb's Posse. Owned by McNeill Stables and trained by Donnie Von Hemel, the colt out of the Slewacide mare Abbey's Missy won his maiden victory at Arlington Park and then finished third in the Arlington-Washington Futurity (G3), beaten a length.

He managed a narrow victory on Keeneland Race Course's Polytrack in an allowance race and then won the \$100,000 Clever Trevor Stakes at Remington Park. From six starts, Caleb's Posse won three races and earned \$122,470.

Also among Posse's 16 two-year-old winners (from 39 starters) were Interrogate, second in the Presque Isle Debutante Stakes at Presque Isle Downs, and Captain Chris, second in the Fan's Cup Stakes at Fort Erie racetrack. Posse claimed the juvenile title with 2010 two-year-old earnings of nearly \$600,000.

Posse was a graded stakes winner at two and three. He won the 2002 Kentucky Breeders' Cup Stakes (G3) at age two, and at three he scored in the Riva Ridge Breeders' Cup Stakes (G2) and the Lafayette Stakes (G3). He is beginning his second season at Vinery New York for a \$10,000 live-foal fee.

Freud's season

While Sequel's Freud was toppled from atop the New York sire standings, he did not relinquish the crown to Posse without a fight. A full brother to top sire Giant's Causeway, Freud had another productive season, especially with New York-breds.

The Storm Cat horse, now 13, had 81 winners from 141 starters in 2010, with earnings just under \$4-million. Franny Freud was one of his nine stakes winners, all of whom were bred in New York. The native New Yorkers accounted for \$3.7-million of his 2010 progeny earnings.

Franny Freud again was the highlight of his year. At two, in 2009, the filly out of the D'Accord mare Frankly Fran was the New York-bred champion juvenile filly after winning the Ontario Debutante Stakes and two restricted stakes races.

That season was just a warm-up for the filly bred by Anthony Grey and owned by Paul Pompa Jr., Stephen Yarbrough, and Grey's Winter Park Partners. Trained by John Terranova II, the Freud filly went on the road and finished second in Santa Anita Park's Santa Ynez Stakes (G2) before winning Keeneland Race Course's Beaumont Stakes (G2). After dominating her competition in two New York Stallion Stakes races, she stepped up to Grade 1 competition in Belmont's Prioress Stakes on July 4.

During a holiday weekend in which New York-breds swept

three graded races, Franny Freud went off as the Prioress' 7-to-10 favorite and powered to a 1³/₄-length victory in the six-furlong race. She was injured while preparing for the Test Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course and retired with career earnings of \$686,029. She was sold at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky selected fall mixed sale for \$560,000.

Freud had strong support from several other members of his 2007 crop.

General Maximus won the Hudson Stakes and the New York Stallion Times Square Stakes; Lubash won three stakes, including the New York Stallion Cab Calloway Stakes; and In Te Domine took the New York Stallion Statue of Liberty Stakes. His older stakes winners included Uncle T Seven, winner of the Ashley T. Cole Stakes, and Yaddo Stakes winner Meriwether Jessica.

Freud also gave Posse a battle in the juvenile category. He had 13 winners from 23 two-year-old starters and earnings of more than \$540,000, which placed him about \$55,000 behind Posse. Freud's top juvenile was Sentimental Lass, who triumphed in the Maid of the Mist Stakes.

One sure measure of Freud's popularity among New York breeders is the 110 mares to which he was bred last year, and his 2011 stud fee increased \$2,000 to \$8,500 live foal.

Golden Missile

Also recording an excellent 2010 season was Golden Missile, the veteran A.P. Indy stallion based at Milfer Farm in Unadilla. His leading earner was Japanese-bred Meteorologist, winner of the Santa Claus Stakes at Hanshin Race Course on December 18. His 2010 earnings totaled \$533,623.

Golden Missile's leading North American runner was Golden Moka, who scored in the Prince of Wales Stakes, the second leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, and earned \$307,560 last year. In all, Golden Missile had 86 individual winners in 2010 and progeny earnings exceeding \$3.1-million. He had 40 mares reported

as bred to him, and his 2011 fee is \$7,500.

Congaree arrived at Highcliff Farm for the 2010 breeding season, and he rose to fourth place in the New York sire rankings with more than \$3.1-million in purse earnings for the year. His top earner was B. J. Wright's Jeranimo, who won the Strub Stakes (G2) on Santa Anita's former synthetic surface and then moved to the turf for a lateseason win in the San Gabriel Stakes (G2) on December 27.

Now five, Jeranimo was one of five stakes winners for the Arazi stallion, a multiple Grade 1 winner who took the Cigar Mile Handicap in 2002 and 2003. Owned by Janice and Robert McNair, who raced him, Congaree was bred to a

reported 45 mares in 2010. He stands the current season for \$7,500 live foal at Highcliff in Delanson.

With Posse, Vinery transferred Repent to New York for the 2010 season, and the Louis Quatorze stallion also had a successful season, ranking fifth with \$3-million in progeny earn-

ings. His leading earner was Diva Delite, winner of the Florida Oaks (G3) and \$222,780 last year. Another three-year-old filly stakes winner was Come Sunday, who won Penn National Race Course's \$75,000 Femme Fatale Stakes. Her 2010 earnings totaled \$172,300.

Other stakes winners for the 2002 Louisiana Derby (G2) winner were Sweet Repent, who took the Sunshine Millions Distaff Stakes; Sincero, winner of The Vid Stakes at Calder Race Course; and Double Shuffle, a four-time stakes winner at central Canada tracks.

Also like Posse, Repent attracted strong support from breeders. The Jockey Club reported that he was

bred to 75 mares in 2010, the third-highest total among New York stallions.

Greeley's Galaxy tops freshman sires

Greeley's Galaxy, who stands at Sugar Maple Farm in Poughquag, topped the freshman sire category in 2010 with six winners and earnings of more than \$160,000. That total placed him seventh on the juvenile sire list among stallions who stood in New York last year.

From 40 registered foals in his first crop, the Mr. Greeley horse out of Ascot Starre, by Ascot Knight, sent 23 juveniles to the races. His leading earner was Big Fearless, who drew away to a 12-length victory in an Aqueduct maiden special weight race on December 4. The colt out of the Tiznow mare Tiz Paula was bred by Anstu Farm and is raced by Anstu Stables. Todd Pletcher trains Big Fearless, who won in his third career start.

Nice Stuff, a filly owned by Our Sugar Bear Stable, won a Belmont Park maiden special weight race on October 28. Four days earlier, Sugar Maple-bred Verbosity, a colt, won a similar race at Belmont. Nice Stuff's earnings totaled \$29,668 from five starts, and Verbosity has earned \$28,900 from three starts.

Greeley's Galaxy was bred in Kentucky by Catesby Clay, his Runnymede Farm, and Joseph and Wendy Clay. Unraced at two, he was a contender in the 2005 Triple Crown after winning the Illinois Derby (G2) by 91/2

A Rightly good pedigree

Rightly So, with roots in Midwest racing and breeding, blossoms in New York

by Don Clippinger

One good racehorse certainly can make a pedigree, and Rightly So appears to be an example of that phenomenon. Certainly, one good runner can pay off in the auction ring.

During the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky selected fall mixed sale, New York-bred Grade 1 winner Rightly So sold for \$600,000 to Patinack Farm. Her dam, unraced Fit Right In, sold for \$1.05-million across town at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale to Japanese interests.

To be sure, Rightly So was a good racing prospect and commanded \$220,000 when she was sold to Ahmed Zayat at the 2008 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. February sale of selected two-year-olds in training. She never finished out of the money, and she capped her 2010 season with a victory in the Ballerina Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course for Zayat Stables.

Before Rightly So came along, the family had trouble reaching into five figures, much less six or seven. Fit Right In had sold for \$3,000 in foal to leading New York sire Freud in 2006, the year Rightly So was born.

The path to the family's high prices began in the Midwest, and the pedigree certainly benefited from its relocation to New York by the Sequel Stallions operation, which bred Rightly So.

Rightly So's pedigree contains a smattering of black type, and its roots extend to Florida-bred Crim Potatoes, by Hilarious, whose family prospered in Illinois and Ohio. Major Luck, a What Luck colt out of Crim Potatoes, won the restricted Illinois Cavalier Stakes and finished second in the Hawthorne Juvenile Stakes, both in 1984.

Turquoise Gal

Before that, Crim Potatoes had been based in Ohio and foaled Turquoise Gal, by Navajo, in 1980. Bred by Dennis B. Swartz and Stephen P. Cronenwett, Turquoise Gal was not much on the racetrack, with a single win at River Downs from 33 starts, but

she proved to be a relatively good broodmare for Swartz and his wife. Gave.

Her best runner was Gallant Step, an Ohio-bred who was bred by Dennis Swartz and won 18 of 72 starts and \$355,867. Sold for \$24,000 as a yearling, Gallant Step was based on the East Coast with trainers Eddie Lehman and John Forbes, and he had enough speed and quality to place in graded stakes. As opportunities arose, the Go Step colt made successful forays into Ohio for state-bred races.

For Lehman, he won the 1991 Quick Step Handicap at Thistledown, and he secured the first of two victories in the Best of Ohio Sprint Championship Stakes later that year for Forbes. Gallant Step

> subsequently won the 1991 Ocean County Stakes at the Meadowlands and finished third in the Sport Page (G3) and Gravesend (G3) Handicaps at Aqueduct that fall.

In 1992, Gallant Step came back to finish third in the Toboggan Handicap (G3), and the following year secured his second victory in the Best of Ohio Sprint. He was claimed in November of his seven-year-old season and completed his racing career at age ten in Ohio.

His full sister, Be Precise, placed in Ohiobred stakes, and his half brother Islamabad, by Red Ransom, also raced in New York and finished third in the 1994 Pilgrim Stakes (G3).

Turquoise Gal's 1989 filly by Irish Tower, Gaye's Valentine (born on Valentine's Day), placed in an Ohio-bred stakes and produced a three-quarter sister to Islamabad, Cupids Revenge. The Red Ransom filly won the 1997 Old Hat Stakes by 8½ lengths at Gulfstream Park and also scored in the following year's

Life At the Top Handicap at Gulfstream. At stud, Cupids Revenge produced the stakes-placed colt B G Suavecito, by Suave.

Gaye's Blossom, Turquoise Gal's 1994 filly by Thirty Six Red, carried the family into New York. Bred and raced by Dennis Swartz, Gaye's Blossom had only a maiden victory at two and ended her career in claiming races at Ellis Park, Turfway Park, and Hoosier Downs in 1997.

In foal to Out of Place, she was consigned to the 2002 Keeneland January horses of all ages sale and was bought in the name of Lakland for \$29,000. Lakland North then was the

partnership of Becky Thomas and Lewis Lakin, which later was renamed Sequel Stallions when Dennis Narlinger bought out Lakin's interest in 2006.

Blossoms in New York

Gaye's Blossom truly began to blossom when bred to the Lakland-Sequel stallions. Lakin and Thomas bred her 2005 filly by Hook and Ladder, Under Serviced, who won the 2008 Schenectady Handicap and New York Stallion Staten Island Stakes and earned \$230,872. A filly by Freud, Don't Mind Me, finished second in the 2007 New York Stallion Statue of Liberty Stakes and earned \$93,874.

The foal Gaye's Blossom was carrying when purchased by Lakland was Fit Right In. She never raced, but she certainly fit right in as a New York-bred broodmare. Rightly So was her first foal, and Sequel sold her to Zayat during the 2008 OBS sale.

Trained throughout her career by Anthony Dutrow, Rightly So

did not race at two. At three in 2009, she won two restricted stakes races—the Iroquois Stakes at Belmont Park and the Love Is Eternal Stakes at Aqueduct. Last year, she stepped up to finish second in the Vagrancy Handicap (G2) before winning Belmont's Bed o' Roses Handicap (G3) and the Ballerina by four lengths at Saratoga.

Regarded as the year's leading female sprinter going into the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1), she was scratched on the morning of the November 5 race by the Breeders' Cup Veterinary Panel. Dutrow said the veterinarians were not satisfied that she was moving well enough to race.

Lakland North sold Fit Right In to JMJ Racing at the New York Breeders Sales Co. auction in October 2006, when she was carrying a Freud colt subsequently named Conflicted. He won one of 12 starts last year and earned \$49,145.

Her Closing Argument filly, now two, sold for \$155,000 at the Keeneland September yearling sale.

Fit Right In was returned to New York and bred to Read the Footnotes in 2009. She produced a full sister to Rightly So last year and was in foal to Curlin when purchased by Katsumi Yoshida in November.

While hardly in the top tier, the family of Turquoise Gal certainly was solid and respectable. When one of her granddaughters was matched up with Sequel's New York stallions, the result was Rightly So, who added Grade 1 glitter to a workmanlike pedigree.

Final Mesa kicks off the new season

Three-year-old filly collects her first graded stakes victory in Gulfstream Park's Old Hat

The new year was not even a week old before New York-bred Final Mesa collected her first graded stakes victory in the \$100,000 Old Hat Stakes (G3) on January 5 at Gulfstream Park.

The three-year-old Sky Mesa filly took command leaving Gulf-stream's far turn, turned back a challenge by longshot Pomeroys Pistol in the stretch, and won by $1\frac{3}{4}$ lengths as the 2.80-to-1 third betting choice.

Owned and trained by Wesley Ward, Final Mesa ran the Old Hat's six furlongs in 1:09.75 on a fast track.

"She quickened really well and ran hard through the stretch," said jockey Joel Rosario. "I never really panicked in the stretch because my filly was running hard the whole way."

Bred by Carmine Telesca and John Guerrera, the filly out of Final Style, by Smart Style, won her fourth race, and third stakes, from five

starts. Ward bought her for \$72,000 at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga preferred sale of New York-breds from Rhapsody Farm/Hidden Lake Farm as agents.

She won her maiden start at Keeneland Race Course in April and then collected her first stakes victory in Delaware Park's \$51,050 Polly Drummond Stakes on May 15. Ward considered sending her to England for the Royal Ascot meet but instead shipped to Woodbine for a 7³/₄-length victory in the \$154,500 My Dear Stakes.

Final Mesa went for her first graded victory in Del Mar's Sorrento Stakes (G3), but she faded in the stretch to finish sixth as the 9-to-5 favorite.

"She might not have liked the track at Del Mar," Ward said.

The owner-trainer put her away for the remainder of the year and brought her back with a steady diet of workouts at Gulfstream. Final Mesa's victory on the track's opening-day program raised her career earnings to \$202,377. Ward indicated that she probably would make her next start at Gulfstream in February.

Icabad Crane's Robb

To the north, New York-bred stakes races were featured in the closing days of 2010 and the first day of the new year, and those races provided breakthroughs for three youngsters and veteran Icabad Crane.

provided breakthroughs for three youngsters and veteran Icabad Crane.

Earle Mack's Icabad Crane had not won since March, when he took the King's Point Handicap, but he had been inching his way back toward the winner's circle. The Jump Start gelding had finished third in the West Point Stakes at Saratoga Race Course and then was second to Friend Or Foe in the Empire Classic Stakes at Belmont Park on October 23.

At Aqueduct, he had just failed to catch Ruffino in the Tinchen's Prince Stakes on November 25, when he finished second by a nose. His final opportunity for a second 2010 victory came on the final day of the year in the \$65,000 Alex M. Robb Stakes for New York-breds at $1\frac{1}{16}$ miles on Aqueduct's inner track.

Bettors on New York Racing Association races concluded that Icabad Crane's time for another victory had arrived and sent him to the starting gate as the 1.45-to-1 favorite in a field of six that contained four other stakes winners, including Tina Marie Bond's Ruffino.

Ridden by Rajiv Maragh, Icabad Crane came away last and was last by 6½ lengths through a quarter-mile as Anstu Stables' Manteca set a relatively leisurely pace with Ruffino right behind him.

Icabad Crane moved up to within four lengths of the leaders through a half-mile in :48.87 and was fourth by three lengths on the final turn. He kicked into gear at the top of the stretch,

disposed of a tiring Ruffino, and drew within one length of Manteca at the furlong pole.

He took the lead near the sixteenth pole, and Maragh kept him busy to the finish line to keep him from pulling himself up. On his last day as a five-year-old, Icabad Crane won by a half-length in 1:44.48 on a fast track.

Manteca, with David Cohen riding for trainer Todd Pletcher, finished second, 2³/₄ lengths ahead of Mary and Chester Broman's Mine Over Matter, who also had finished third in the Tinchen's Prince Stakes.

Adrian Rolls, assistant to trainer Graham Motion, noted that Icabad Crane tends to wait on horses once he makes the lead, "so timing is the thing. He's been so consistent for so long."

Although no target is on the schedule, Rolls said Icabad Crane probably will race next at Aqueduct.

Maragh, who took over the mount for the Empire Classic, said Manteca's strong effort helped Icabad Crane.

"He's definitely more effective running at horses, so it was good that [Manteca] was giving him a little fight today. It made him more aggressive."

Bred by Gallagher's Stud, Icabad Crane won for the fifth time in 22 starts and raised his career earnings to \$450,895.

East View upset

Garcia, who finished second to national leader Ramon Dominguez in the 2010 NYRA jockey standings, had a big day on December 5, when he rode the longshot winners of two New York-bred stakes races for two-year-olds.

Owner-trainer Richard Violette Jr. put him aboard Queen's Harbor in the \$65,000 East View Stakes, and the Mizzen Mast filly set all the pace before drawing away to a 4½-length victory. Later in the afternoon, Garcia rode Beau de Beaupre to a half-length score in the Damon Runyon Stakes for trainer Jimmy Jerkens.

Bred by Michael T. Martin, Queen's Harbor went off at 26.50-to-1 after finishing sixth in the Swirlaway Stakes on November 17, when she was beaten 9³/₄ lengths by Miss Valentine, the East View's 9-to-10 favorite under Dominguez.

But Garcia was convinced that the move to the inner track for the East View at one mile and 70 yards would benefit Violette's

filly.

"She loved two turns. I told everyone after her last race she would be better around two turns, and she was," Garcia said.

Queen's Harbor won in 1:44.11 on a fast track. Her previous victory had been in a \$50,000 maiden claiming race at Saratoga in her career debut on August 2.

Beau de Beaupre, bred and owned by Nassau CC Stables, had taken five tries to win his maiden victory, but he had won by eight lengths in a mile race at Aqueduct on November 17. For the \$65,000 Damon Runyon at a mile and 70 yards, he went off at 10.50-to-1, with Dogwood Stable's unbeaten Restrainor Stakes winner Sky Music favored at 9-to-10 in the field of seven.

Beau de Beaupre tracked the early pace of Never Right Joey, battled through the stretch with 18-to-1 Artie Luvsto Party, and prevailed by a half-length. Finishing third, another 1½ lengths back, was Preachintothedevil. Sky Music, bumped on the clubhouse turn, finished fourth, a neck farther back. The winner, a Holy Bull colt, ran the distance in 1:45.33.

Even with the victory, both Jerkens and Garcia conceded that Beau de Beaupre was green and still had plenty to learn.

"I told Alan he shies away when a horse comes to his outside, so I said to be ready, and he was," Jerkens said.

Beau de Beaupre's tendency to shy from horses placed him in trouble on January 1 in the \$60,000 Champagne-forashley Stakes at a mile and 70 yards, which also attracted Sky Music, Artie Luvsto Party, and Preachintothedevil. Nearing the stretch, he shied as Majestic Raffy angled out and then bumped with Sky Music in early stretch.

Getting a clean trip in the Champagneforashley was Crossed Sabres Farm's Preachintothedevil, ridden by Junior Alvarado. Always well placed, the Pulpit colt ran down pacesetter Eminent Tale in early stretch and won by $3\frac{1}{4}$ lengths.

Eminent Tale, owned by Winter Park Partners, Sequel Racing, and Dennis Narlinger, held tough for second, a neck in front of Sky Music in third. Beau de Beaupre finished seventh, and Artie Luvsto Party was last of nine starters.

Bred by Jeffrey Tucker, Preachintothedevil ran the distance in 1:43.48 on a fast track. Trainer Gary Contessa said he probably would keep the three-year-old in New York for the winter racing season.

EXPLANATION OF INDEXES

Racing Index (RI)

RI is based on the average earnings per start for all runners in the United States, Canada, England, Ireland, France, Italy, Germany, Puerto Rico, and United Arab Emirates. RI is determined by calculating the average earnings per start, divided into males and females, of all starters in each individual country, and the average for each individual year is by definition 1.00. Median RI, however, is much lower. Actual distribution of RI is detailed below.

Sire Index (SI)

The Sire Index (SI) is an average of the Racing Index (RI) of all foals by a sire that have started at least three times. For SI to be calculated, a sire must be represented by a minimum of three crops and 25 starters lifetime.



Breeding Rules

To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

Resident Mares: Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back

Non-Resident Mares: Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.

New York State Breeding and Development Fund NY-Breds Award Program

Breeder, owner, and stallion owner awards are based on purse money earned (1st through 3rd) while competing in pari-mutuel races run in New York state.

BREEDER AWARDS

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$6,300,452 to breeders of registered New York-breds. A breeder is the owner of the mare at the time the mare foals in the state of New York. Breeder awards are determined by covering stallion. If the New York-bred is by a registered New York-based stallion, the award is up to 20% of the purse earned for a first-place finish and up to 10% for a second- or third-place finish.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% for a first-place finish and up to 5% for a second- or third-place finish. All breeder awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

STALLION OWNER AWARDS

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund distributed \$2,370,035 in stallion owner awards. Stallion owner awards are paid to owners of registered New York-based covering stallions (at time of conception) at up to 7% of earned purses from 1st through 3rd positions. All stallion owner awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

OPEN OWNER AWARDS

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$1,107,667 to owners of registered New York-breds who earned purse money in open-company races. Owner awards for registered New York-breds sired by a registered New York-based stallion is up to 20% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward, with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

NEW YORK-BRED RACES

More than 52 stakes races exclusively for registered New York-breds are run at New York Racing Association race-tracks (Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course) and Finger Lakes racetrack with total purses worth nearly \$5-million. In 2009, more than 900 overnight races exclusively for registered New York-breds were held at the four New York racetracks.
