

# Dealing with a temporary crisis

The closure of New York City Off-Track Betting Corp. on December 7 has, without question, created a crisis for the New York state racing and breeding industries.

A crisis calls for crisis management, and there is action on all fronts. The day after the New York state Senate failed to pass the New York City OTB reorganization legislation, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board met and approved emergency rules in the attempt to stem the migration of New York City OTB patrons to out-of-state wagering platforms. This includes permission for the New York Racing Association to sign up customers online for NYRA Rewards, its free account wagering service, and to offer double cash rewards for three months to new NYRA Rewards customers.

Meanwhile, NYRA is pulling out all the stops to get patrons to the racetrack and participate in its simulcast programs. Within the first week of the New York City OTB closure:

- NYRA expanded its free bus service to Aqueduct from select New York City OTB locations in all five boroughs and added new routes, with free programs and concession vouchers for patrons;
- The racing association launched full-card simulcasting of Aqueduct's live program seven days a week in the heated Belmont Café at Belmont Park, with free parking, admission, and program, and on-track prices on all payouts; and
- NYRA announced that Aqueduct would be open for dark-day simulcasting on Mondays and Tuesdays with free parking and admission, and it would remain open on other days through the conclusion of live West Coast racing.

Early indications are that these measures are generating in-

creased on-track attendance and handle, but we will all need to monitor the numbers closely in the weeks to come.

All those things notwithstanding, the New York City OTB closure cannot help but have an immediate negative impact on the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund. Historically, New York City OTB has accounted for 36% of the Fund's revenue. On the other hand, the Fund has been dealing for with New York City OTB delinquency for the past two years. In 2009, New York City OTB paid only roughly half of its statutory obligation to the Fund. In 2010, due to its policy of "deferred" payments, New York City OTB paid approximately only one-third of what was due to the Fund.

It is impossible to speculate right now on the bottom line of what the Fund will suffer due to New York City OTB closure. Nor can we tell to what extent this may be offset by increased on-track attendance and handle in the future, or even by video lottery terminal revenue once the Aqueduct casino comes on line. By the end of the first quarter, however, we should have a much better idea of how wagering has changed in the state and how these changes will affect the Fund.

In the months of December and January, I will be participating in several stakeholder meetings, including a meeting of the Fund board to assess the new situation, and a hearing in Albany called by Assemblyman J. Gary Pretlow to explore the possibility of merging the state's regional OTB corporations.

Things are moving very fast and, as usual, I will continue to use our website and eNewsletters to keep you apprised of all developments.

## New York City OTB shutdown puts racing industry in jeopardy

Track closures, fewer race days, and lower purses are possible following New York City Off-Track Betting Corp.'s shutdown, the state's chief racing regulator said on December 8.

New York City OTB closed at midnight on December 7 after the state Senate failed to approve legislation that would have kept the bankrupt organization open. New York City OTB was on track to handle \$750-million this year.

Trying to keep money from leaving New York, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board on December 8 took emergency measures that allowed people to register online for betting accounts with the New York Racing Association, Yonkers Raceway, and both Catskill and Nassau OTBs. Previously, bettors had to open accounts in person.

"There's a consequence to what happened yesterday," board Chairman John Sabini said. "We just put a gaping hole in the handle. The size of the hole, we don't know yet. But there will likely be less of a racing product. I think you'll see fewer race dates and you may even see a track or two close."

### NYTB directors re-elected

Five current New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. directors have been elected to new two-year terms on the 11-person board. Voting concluded on December 3, and results were announced on December 6.

Re-elected to the board of directors for terms ending December 31, 2012, were:

- Lois Engel of Lattingtown, owner of Pucker Ridge Farm in Warrensburg;
- Thomas J. Gallo III, founder and managing owner of Parting Glass Racing and Thomas J. Gallo III Sales Agency, and owner of Blue Stone Farm in Cambridge;
- Vivien Malloy, owner of Edition Farm in Waccabuc;
- John McMahon, owner and manager of Old Saratoga Thoroughbreds near Saratoga Springs; and
- Chris Purdy, D.D.S., owner of Ivy League Farm in Ithaca.

Six board members are serving the second year of their two-year terms in 2011. They are: Jerry Bilinski, D.V.M., owner of Waldorf Farm and Equine Medical Center; Chester Broman, owner of Chestertown Farm; Joanne T. Nielsen, owner of Sunnyfield Farm; Suzie O'Cain, co-manager of Highcliff Farm; Barry R. Ostrager, J.D., principal owner of Questroyal Stud; and breeder Shirl Penney, president and chief executive officer of Dynasty Financial Partners.

### TURN OUT THE LIGHTS

*After 39 years, New York City OTB was shuttered when it was unable to emerge from bankruptcy*

NYRA, Yonkers Raceway, and Monticello Raceway are the tracks that relied most heavily upon New York City's OTB's revenue stream. Monticello is the track most vulnerable to a potential closing, according to observers.

NYRA also met on December 8 and discussed repercussions about the New York City OTB closure, but has no definitive plans for altering race dates in 2011. Such action would require approval of a state Racing Franchise Oversight Board that monitors NYRA's business matters. The Racing and Wagering Board would not have to act.

"If anybody thinks there's not going to be considerable change to the racing product, they're kidding themselves," Sabini said. "Now, not only New York City OTB workers lose their jobs, but every segment of the racing industry—from feed store owners to horsemen to those who board the equine athletes—will feel negative consequences."

New York Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver's office confirmed that an 11 a.m. EST hearing was scheduled for December 15 in Albany to consider consolidation of the five remaining regional off-track betting organizations.

Gov. David Paterson, speaking on radio station WOR-AM on

# NYRA says Republican OTB plan could force another bankruptcy

The New York Racing Association said a Republican-backed plan to restructure all of the state's off-track betting companies would force NYRA into bankruptcy again.

But the Senate's Republican leadership said the same benefits and provisions given New York City OTB should be extended to the state's five other regional off-track betting firms as well—Nassau and Suffolk on Long Island; and Catskill, Capital, and Western in upstate New York.

"They've been doing the right thing; all they want is to be treated fairly," said Dean Skelos (R-Nassau County), who is slated to become the new majority leader on January 1. "Most of our members understand that this is the time for a global solution to the OTB problem, not just New York City."

However, NYRA said legislation sought by the other regional OTBs would reduce revenues to NYRA by more than \$11-million. Overall, NYRA would take a \$20-million hit because of money it would also lose under New York City OTB's proposed reorganization.

"NYRA cannot sustain a revenue reduction of \$20-million and continue to operate the three racetracks," NYRA President and Chief Executive Officer Charles Hayward said on December 7. "The consequence of the legislation being advocated by the regional OTBs is that NYRA would be forced to close.

"No regional OTB can survive long without the NYRA product," he added. "The net result of the legislation being sought by the regional OTBs would be the eventual closure of their own corporations and the elimination of Thoroughbred racing in New York state."—Paul Post

December 9, said there are no ongoing negotiations about New York City OTB, despite comments to the contrary from Senate Republicans, who voted against the bill that would have kept the bankrupt organization open.

New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. President Barry Ostrager, also a NYRA board member, said, "The failure of the state Senate to pass the governor's New York City OTB bill that was passed by the Assembly is a near death blow to the New York breeding industry and will cost the state an enormous number of jobs—not only lost DC 37 union [OTB] workers, but the jobs of people in the breeding industry. This action will adversely af-

fect the macro economy of the state. Our state senators have not done what their constituents elected them to do."

New York City OTB Chairman Larry Schwartz, speaking on a morning radio show, said, "This is going to have a tremendous impact on the racing industry. I believe upstate tracks will close. Horse farms will shut down, breeders will be moving out of state. Many small businesses that support racing will have to lay off people or shut down their operations. With a 9% unemployment rate in the state of New York, the Senate had a chance not to add to those figures by passing a restructuring plan that the Assembly approved."

The Senate's Republican leadership favored a bill that would have dealt with New York's five other regional OTBs, not just New York City alone. State Republican leader Dean Skelos (R-Nassau County) said New York City OTB could have remained open while negotiations continued.

But Schwartz said New York City OTB has no cash and could not cover rent payments the past few days before closing.

"New York City OTB is shut down," he said. "There is no plan to reopen it. This is not a light switch. You can't flick it on and off."—Paul Post

# Another sign of New York optimism

Vinery joins Adena in establishing a strong stallion presence in the Empire State

One unmistakable sign of optimism in a state's breeding program is when established, indigenous farms and operations announce plans to stand new stallions. Another sign—and perhaps just as important—occurs when large operations from other breeding regions decide to establish operations in the state.

Twice in two months, major commercial breeding operations have announced that they are setting up shop in New York. The first was Frank Stronach's Adena Springs, which formed Adena Springs New York and will stand five stallions at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds for 2011.

In mid-November, another major player in the commercial breeding industry, Vinery, announced plans to expand its presence in New York and to take over management of Empire Stud in Hudson.

The renamed operation will be known as Vinery New York. Jamie LaMonica, who served as Empire Stud's president, will be involved in the new venture.

For both Vinery and Adena Springs, the prospect of video lottery terminals boosting race purses and breeder awards played a significant role in the decisions to set up shop in New York. The first VLTs are expected to be in operation at Resorts World New York at Aqueduct in the spring.

Vinery took its first steps into New York last year, when the Kentucky-based commercial breeder and stallion manager relocated Posse and Repent to Empire Stud for the 2010 season. Joining them for the 2011 season will be Purge, who has stood at Vinery's Lexington farm since 2006, and Darley Stable's recently retired Justenuffhumor.

Remaining on the roster at Vinery New York will be Silver Wagon, Frost Giant, Maybry's Boy, and Midas Eyes.

## 'Lucrative market'

"We're excited about this expansion," Vinery President Tom Ludt said in announcing the changes. "Vinery stallions Posse and Repent were relocated to New York, and they have been very well received by the New York breeders. We have seen benefits from operating in a regional market, and with casinos boosting the New York program, we think that there will be a more lucrative market for New York-breds."

According to Jockey Club statistics, Posse was bred to 86 mares in 2010 and Repent was bred to 75. Ludt said all the stallions will be supported with Vinery-owned mares that will be shipped to New York to be bred, and they will foal in New York.

Through December 1, Posse was New York's top-ranked stallion by progeny earnings, and Repent was fourth. Posse will stand the 2011 season for \$10,000 live foal, and Repent will carry a \$5,000 fee.

Purge, who transfers to New York for the 2011 breeding season, is by the prominent sire Pulpit and out of Copelan's Bid Gal, by Copelan. A \$180,000 Keeneland September yearling, he collected three graded stakes victories for trainer Todd Pletcher

while racing for Starlight Stables, Paul Saylor, and Johns Martin.

He won his only start at two in 2003 and then scored in Belmont Park's Peter Pan Stakes (G2) and Saratoga Race Course's Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) at three. He concluded his racing career with a 3<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-length victory in the 2005 Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (G1).

Purge had more than \$2.1-million in 2010 progeny earnings, and his top horse overall is Macias, a three-time stakes winner at Santa Anita Park.

"We think Purge will be well received with New York breeders," Ludt said. "He's in the top of his crop in every category, is a son of emerging sire of sires Pulpit, and on top of that he's a very attractive individual."

Purge's 2011 fee is \$5,000 live foal.

## Justenuffhumor

Justenuffhumor, a two-time Grade 2 winner, brings to New York a highly desirable pedigree to complement his racing record. He is by Distorted Humor, who again was among the leading sires in 2010, and he is out of Justenuffheart, by Broad Brush.

Justenuffheart was the dam of 2006 champion two-year-old filly Dreaming of Anna and two-time Grade 2 winner Lewis Michael. Justenuffhumor's second dam is Kitten's First, by Lear Fan, who produced 2004 champion turf male Kitten's Joy, now a successful stallion in Kentucky, and three-time Grade 1 winner Precious Kitten.

Purchased for \$550,000 during the 2006 Keeneland September yearling sale, Justenuffhumor prospered in the silks of Godolphin Racing.

At Saratoga in 2009, he pulled off successive victories in the Fourstardave (G2) and Bernard Baruch (G2) Handicaps to cap a six-race winning streak. At Santa Anita Park that fall, he finished third to Goldikova (Ire) in the TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1).

"We think Justenuffhumor will be well received by New York breeders given his race record and world-class pedigree," said Charlie Boden, Darley's head of sales. "The New York breeding program is poised to become one of the most lucrative places in the country to raise a horse."

LaMonica noted that Justenuffhumor has attributes that will be attractive to New York breeders.

"He has a tremendous family, showed tremendous talent on the racetrack, and will provide New York breeders with a much sought-after sire line," LaMonica said. "He is an outstanding physical specimen, and we look forward to breeders coming to see him."

Justenuffhumor will stand his initial season at stud for \$5,000.

Adena Springs also established stud fees for its 2011 New York roster. Heading the list is veteran Touch Gold, who stands for \$10,000, and 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Alphabet Soup, who has a \$6,000 fee. Tiago and Silent Name (Jpn) each will stand for \$5,000, and Harlem Rocker will be at \$3,500.

## Marsh Side retired to Questroyal

Multiple Grade 1 winner Marsh Side, a career earner of \$2,360,853, will join the Questroyal Stud stallion roster for the 2011 breeding season. The son of influential sire Gone West will stand at Silvernails Farm in Pine Plains.

# The Forward influence of John Nerud

A Shin Forward traces to fifth dam Cequillo, a cornerstone of Tartan Farms' success

A Shin Forward became one of New York's all-time leading state-breds when he bravely turned back a late cavalry charge to win the Mile Championship (Jpn-G1) on November 21 at Kyoto Race Course.

Bred by Edition Farm, the five-year-old Forest Wildcat horse raised his career earnings to \$3,302,052, placing him right behind New York's Horse of the Decade, Funny Cide, who earned \$3,529,412.

To be sure, A Shin Forward toils in Japan, where the purses are just shy of astronomical. His victory in the Mile Championship earned him \$1,246,199, which is more than all but two Breeders' Cup races pay to their winners. Still, it is all too easy to dismiss his riches as merely the result of Japan's lofty purses.

Deep in his pedigree is an undistinguished racemare who helped to shape Florida's breeding industry. And behind her productivity is a name that often pops up in connection with the flowering of the Florida industry: Racing Hall of Fame trainer and New York breeder John Nerud.

Tartan Farms and its owner, William McKnight, certainly reaped the benefits of Nerud's horsemanship and the riches produced by Cequillo, a \*Princequillo mare out of Boldness, by \*Mahmoud.

She never finished better than third in a brief racing career and earned all of \$350, but she was pure gold as a broodmare.

Her first foal, Hot Dust, by Jet Action, was a multiple stakes winner for McKnight. And, the hits kept coming. Her second foal, Three Up, by Decathlon, was the granddam of several stakes winners.

Her third foal, Grand Splendor, by Correlation, was one of her

most productive offspring for Tartan Farms and Tartan Stable. Winner of a division of Atlantic City Race Course's 1965 Pageant Handicap, Grand Splendor was clearly a cut below her contemporary Gold Digger, a multiple stakes winner, although their genetic paths eventually would cross.

## Fappiano

Grand Splendor's daughter Killaloe, by Nerud-trained champion Dr. Fager, produced Fappiano, a colt by Gold Digger's son Mr. Prospector. A Grade 1 winner on the track, Nerud's Fappiano had an abbreviated stud career in which he sired champion Unbridled, who was himself a Tartan-bred.

Fappiano's half sister Jedina, by What a Pleasure, produced Clabber Girl, a Grade 1 winner in Nerud's silks. Grand Splendor was the dam of Gonfalon, who produced Ogygian, a multiple Grade 1 winner and sire.

In 1963 and 1964, Cequillo produced back-to-back stakes winners Tequillo, by Intentionally, and Ruffled Feathers, by Rough'n Tumble. Both were sires but did not have any lasting impact.

Cequillo's 1965 filly, Expectancy, was a modest winner on the racetrack but distinguished herself at stud. Her Dr. Fager colt Dr. Patches shared the champion sprinter title (with J. O.

Tobin) in 1978. Expectancy also produced Grade 1 winner and sire Who's for Dinner.

Quiet Charm, by Nearctic, launched another important branch of the Cequillo family. A winner at two in 1973, Quiet Charm produced Grade 2 winner Virilfy, by Minnesota Mac, and Grade 3-winning racemare Agacerie, by Exclusive Native.

Quiet Charm's daughter Partygoer, by Secretariat, produced Dare and Go, a two-time Grade 1 winner by Alydar who always will be best known for stopping two-time Horse of the Year Cigar's 16-race winning streak in the 1996 Pacific Classic Stakes (G1). His half brother Go Deputy, by Deputy Minister, also was a Grade 1 winner.

Quiet Charm's daughter Demure, by Dr. Fager, produced Tartan-bred Quiet American, by Fappiano, a Grade 1 winner and a prominent sire.

Her 1982 daughter, Charming Smile, by Mac Diarmida, did not race, but she produced stakes winner No Mecourtney, by Jelblar, and Grade 2-placed Good Morning Smile, by Morning Bob. Both racemares were durable, especially Good Morning Smile, who made 76 career starts over six racing seasons.

At stud, Good Morning Smile's best was Wake Up Kiss, who transformed a Florida family into a New York family. By six-time leading New York sire Cure the Blues, Wake Up Kiss was bred by John Hettinger and consigned by Hettinger's Akindale Farm to the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale of selected yearlings, where Equix Biomechanics bought her for \$150,000.

Raced by Rudlein Stable and William L. Clifton Jr., Wake Up Kiss was unraced at two and woke up after she was put on the grass in her three-year-old season. She won three consecutive starts and concluded that streak with a victory in the New York Stallion Perfect Arc Stakes.

At four, she finished fourth in three races for New York run-

ners. Wake Up Kiss returned at five to win her final two starts and went out with a 4½-length victory in the restricted Yaddo Handicap at Saratoga Race Course.

In foal to Forest Wildcat, Wake Up Kiss went into the 2004 Keeneland November breeding stock sale, where she caught the attention of Vivien and Harry Malloy, owners of Edition Farm, who bought her for \$380,000.

The resulting foal was A Shin Forward. Through agent Denali Stud, Edition consigned the colt to the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga preferred sale of New York-breds, and Rayzin the Bar Stable bought him for \$125,000. Pinhooked into the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale of selected two-year-olds in training the following March, A Shin Forward began his Japanese odyssey when purchased for \$290,000 by Hirotsugu Hirai.

He won his first two starts that fall and has matured into a high-quality miler. Early in 2010, he won his first group stakes, the Hankyu Hai (Jpn-G3), and then finished third in his first Group 1 race, the Takamatsumomiya Kinen, in which he was beaten only a neck.

He tailed off over the summer and finally put everything together for the Mile Championship. He went off at 51.40-to-1 in a field of 18 and always was well placed under jockey Yasunari Iwata, who kept him near the inside rail on the right-handed course.

A Shin Forward burst clear of the pack in the final 200 meters and then withstood a late charge by three horses outside him to win by a neck over 2.70-to-1 favorite Danon Yoyo. A Shin Forward ran the 1,600-meter (7.95-furlong) distance in a stakes record 1:31.80.

# Endless Circle breaks out

Former claimer takes Fall Highweight;  
Stormy's Majesty storms to Discovery victory

For a while this past spring, Endless Circle appeared to be trapped in a purgatory of lower-level claiming races. He was claimed for \$14,000 from a victory at Aqueduct in March, missed hitting the board in an optional claiming race, and then was claimed again for \$14,000 after winning on April 16 at Aqueduct.

The pattern of win, claim, defeat did not continue, however. In the hands of trainer Rudy R. Rodriguez, the New York-bred son of Precise End rose steadily to higher circles of New York racing through the remainder of the year and capped his six-year-old season with a two-length victory in the \$100,000 Fall Highweight Handicap (G3) on November 25 at the Jamaica, New York, track.

Endless Circle's first graded stakes victory in his first shot at that level wrapped up another outstanding month for New York-breds in a year of racetrack milestones.

After three New York-breds won Grade 1 races at New York Racing Association tracks in 2010, a fourth, A Shin Forward, broke through at the highest level in Japan on November 21. (See pedigree profile on page 14.)

Also collecting a graded stakes victory during the month was Stormy's Majesty, who came back from an uncharacteristically poor effort in the Empire Classic Stakes to win the Discovery Handicap (G3) on November 20.

Rodriguez, a former jockey, claimed Endless Circle for owners Vincent S. Scuderi and James Riccio and found a regimen that fit the horse. Prior to the 2010 season, Endless Circle had made only 12 career starts during three racing seasons, although he did not start at three.

## ***Capping an outstanding year for New York-breds, Endless Circle and Stormy's Majesty collect Grade 3 victories at Aqueduct to complement A Shin Forward's score in a Japanese Group 1 race***

Bred by Sez You Thoroughbreds out of the Pentelicus mare Inside Circle, Endless Circle had won the Aspirant Stakes for New York-breds at two, but most of his starts had been in claiming and optional claiming races.

The Fall Highweight was Endless Circle's 13th start of 2010, and eight of them had been for his new barn.

"He's a horse who has been very good to us," Rodriguez said.

Endless Circle began to be very good for his new owners immediately. Paired with jockey Edgar Prado, he won two Belmont Park optional claiming race, finished second in a third, and then conquered the John Morrissey Stakes by four lengths on August 5 at Saratoga Race Course.

Back at Belmont, he won the restricted Easy N' Dirty Stakes and was favored at 11-to-10 to take the Hudson Stakes on the New York Showcase Day program on October 23. He finished a

listless sixth in that race, however, beaten almost ten lengths by General Maximus.

"He came out of the Hudson with a little infection," Rodriguez said. "We got that cleared up."

The six-furlong Fall Highweight attracted a field of eight, with plenty of speed and no standout. Wildcat Frankie, the 3.10-to-1 favorite, went to the lead immediately and set a blistering pace—the first quarter-mile in :21.80 and the half in :44.80—with 3.40-to-1 second choice Go Go Shoot in pursuit.

Prado steered 4.80-to-1 fourth betting choice Endless Circle to the rail immediately and then tipped him out on the final turn. He picked off horses on the turn and rallied three wide into the stretch. Repole Stable's Go Go Shoot, preparing to overtake Wildcat Frankie, stumbled near the three-sixteenths pole, unseating jockey John Velazquez, and Prado checked Endless Circle sharply to avoid the fallen horse and rider.

That could have been the end of Endless Circle's run, but he quickly found his stride again and closed past Wildcat Frankie and Jack On the Rocks inside the furlong pole to win in 1:09.79 on a fast track.

Jack On the Rocks finished second, three-quarters of a length ahead of Wildcat Frankie in third. Neither Go Go Shoot nor Velazquez sustained serious injury in the fall.

"The race set up beautifully, a lot of speed in the race," Prado said. "He was behind and worked his way between horses and finished well."

The Fall Highweight was also the first graded stakes victory for Rodriguez. Endless Circle, who now has won 11 of his 25 career starts, increased his earnings to \$437,768, with \$212,850 of that total since the latest claim.

## Stormy's Discovery

Like Endless Circle, Stormy's Majesty had a stormy outing on New York Showcase Day. Bumped at the start of the Empire Classic, the Majesty Stud homebred was done after six furlongs and finished tenth, 18 lengths behind winner Friend Or Foe.

Prado, the three-year-old Stormy Atlantic colt's regular rider, was available for the Discovery, and he and trainer Dominic Galluscio plotted a different strategy.

"Edgar and I decided to let him run a little bit," Galluscio said. "In the Empire Classic, he got behind and didn't seem to catch his stride or breathe as well."

Stormy's Majesty went off as the 3.55-to-1 second betting choice for the 1½-mile Discovery behind 2.65-to-1 Golden Moka, and Prado broke him sharply from the second starting stall in a field of seven.

The two favorites alternated on the lead, with Stormy's Majesty leading through a quarter-mile in :23.77 and Golden Moka on top by a head through a half in :47.93.

Stormy's Majesty challenged for the lead entering the final turn and led by a length after six furlongs in 1:12.19. Golden Moka began to tire, and Stormy's Majesty opened 2½ lengths at the furlong pole. He won by two lengths over Not Abroad in 1:50.02 on a fast track.

"I was a little surprised he was on the lead [after the first quarter-mile] because it looked like there were horses with more speed," Galluscio said. "But I was very comfortable when they showed the fractions and saw the way Edgar was sitting."

Prado said he also was comfortable with the effort.

"He broke sharp and was in good position," Prado said. "On the backside, I let him go a notch, and he responded well. I was pretty confident most of the way because he was doing every-

thing so easily. He finished well. I think he's back to his old self."

Stormy's Majesty raised his career record to five wins from eight starts with earnings of \$213,732. Out of the Raffie's Majesty mare Raffie's Dream, he won his first two starts in December 2009 and made his 2010 debut with a win in a Belmont optional claiming race in June. He was outrun in Saratoga's Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) but returned to win the Albany Stakes by a neck over Ibboyee on August 25. He finished second in the open Star of Cozzene Stakes before the Empire Classic.

### EXPLANATION OF INDEXES

#### Racing Index (RI)

RI is based on the average earnings per start for all runners in the United States, Canada, England, Ireland, France, Italy, Germany, Puerto Rico, and United Arab Emirates. RI is determined by calculating the average earnings per start, divided into males and females, of all starters in each individual country, and the average for each individual year is by definition 1.00. Median RI, however, is much lower. Actual distribution of RI is detailed below.

#### Sire Index (SI)

The Sire Index (SI) is an average of the Racing Index (RI) of all foals by a sire that have started at least three times. For SI to be calculated, a sire must be represented by a minimum of three crops and 25 starters lifetime.

#### AUCTION INFORMATION

Auction information is for North American sales from 1980 to the present and includes the following:

- Subject horse (stakes winner): All auction activity—yearling, yearling, two-year-olds in training, or horses of racing age sales—found after the winner's name under the first dam.

- Sire of stakes winner: The sire's lifetime and current year yearling auction information is reported, with number of crops offered at yearling sales (lifetime), number of yearlings sold

(lifetime), and average price (lifetime, including yearlings sold in current year), followed by information for the current year. (Current year information is reported beginning October 1; current year information from January 1 through September 30 is in the previous year's auction information.)

- Dam of stakes winner: most recent sale, either as weanling, yearling, or two-year-old in training. Also reported is most recent sale as broodmare (including covering sire) or broodmare prospect, plus any sale of the dam while subject horse was in utero (including covering sire).

#### PEDIGREE SYMBOLS

Symbols preceding or following names of horses in pedigrees are used to identify horses that were imported into North America for racing or breeding, and to indicate country of birth. Equal signs preceding a horse's name indicate that a horse was foaled outside the U.S. or Canada and has never been imported to North America; a horse's country of birth appears in parentheses following its name. An asterisk preceding a horse's name indicates the horse was born outside the U.S. or Canada and was imported to North America prior to 1976 (no country codes are included for such horses). Names of horses imported since 1976 include a country code in parentheses following their name and are not preceded by equal signs. Horses that do not have a symbol preceding their name or a country code following their name were foaled in North America.

Following the sire information is the name of the winner's dam. The name of the

winner is in light face capital letters (bold face capital letters if the win came in a stakes race), followed by the winner's sex, age, name of racetrack, and date of race.

The class of the race in which the victory took place immediately follows. Abbreviations used for class of race are similar to those used by Equibase: Alw—allowance; Hcp—overnight handicap; names of stakes races are spelled out, with the grade of the race, when applicable, in parentheses. Class of race is followed by the distance of the race, expressed in furlongs and fractions of furlongs, followed by first-place money earned by the winner.



## Breeding Rules

To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

**Resident Mares:** Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back required.

**Non-Resident Mares:** Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.

# New York State Breeding and Development Fund NY-Breds Award Program

**Breeder, owner, and stallion owner awards are based on purse money earned (1st through 3rd) while competing in pari-mutuel races run in New York state.**

## **BREEDER AWARDS**

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$6,300,452 to breeders of registered New York-breds. A breeder is the owner of the mare at the time the mare foals in the state of New York. Breeder awards are determined by covering stallion. If the New York-bred is by a registered New York-based stallion, the award is up to 20% of the purse earned for a first-place finish and up to 10% for a second- or third-place finish.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% for a first-place finish and up to 5% for a second- or third-place finish. All breeder awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

## **STALLION OWNER AWARDS**

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund distributed \$2,370,035 in stallion owner awards. Stallion owner awards are paid to owners of registered New York-based covering stallions (at time of conception) at up to 7% of earned purses from 1st through 3rd positions. All stallion owner awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

## **OPEN OWNER AWARDS**

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$1,107,667 to owners of registered New York-breds who earned purse money in open-company races. Owner awards for registered New York-breds sired by a registered New York-based stallion is up to 20% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward, with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

## **NEW YORK-BRED RACES**

More than 52 stakes races exclusively for registered New York-breds are run at New York Racing Association racetracks (Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course) and Finger Lakes racetrack with total purses worth nearly \$5-million. In 2009, more than 900 overnight races exclusively for registered New York-breds were held at the four New York racetracks.
