

Good news, finally

I can't tell you how happy I am to be able to use this space (finally!) to talk about great news and exciting prospects.

In the past three years, I have come to know firsthand what an enormous toll the difficulties and challenges of the past decade have taken on your businesses and lives. Now, a single piece of news has completely changed the game for the state's struggling breeding and racing industries—news that will make a positive difference for everyone. Moreover, I firmly believe that a prosperous future will, with time, be able to completely eclipse an extremely difficult past.

After so many disappointments and frustrations, the full legislative approval of the New York State Division of Lottery's recommendation of Genting New York to operate the Aqueduct casino of video lottery terminals (VLTs) seemed almost unreal. Now that reality is sinking in, you, I, and every stakeholder in the New York breeding and racing industries must take stock of the ramifications of this new reality and think seriously about the shape of the future.

First, let me share some attention-grabbing numbers on

the projected payments from the VLT vendor to the racing and breeding industries. Conservative projections (based on the performance of VLTs at Yonkers) estimate that each of the 4,500 VLT machines will generate revenues of \$350 per day. In the first year (at the stipulated level of 1%), this will translate into \$5,748,750 in additional revenue for the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, or, roughly speaking, a 50% increase in fund revenue. The following year, the fund's share will increase to 1.25% and, the year after that (and thereafter), the percentage will be 1.5%.

On the racing side, VLT revenue is projected to generate \$37,366,875 in purse support for New York Racing Association tracks in their first full year of operation. The initial level of

6.5% for purse support will increase to 7% the following year and 7.5% the year after that (and thereafter). To put it simply, we can absolutely look forward to an enhanced purse structure and enhanced award structure that have the potential to put the New York racing and breeding programs back on top, where they belong.

The focus of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders annual membership meeting, which took place in Saratoga Springs on August 15 at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion, was, in effect, "New York breeding and racing in the post-VLT era." A diverse group participated. Joining me and the NYTB board were State Sen. Eric Adams, New York State Racing and Wagering Board and Fund Chairman John Sabini, New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association President Rick Violette Jr., NYRA President Charles Hayward, and NYRA Vice President of Racing P. J. Campo.

Every speaker contributed insights about ways to best shape the future of New York breeding and racing, and the question-and-answer session with members at the end of the meeting produced a valuable exchange of ideas and concerns. All of the central issues were addressed: How to attract first-rate stallions to the state. How to enhance the value of the horses bred in the state. How best to provide strong incentives for breeding, owning, and racing better-quality New York-breds. How to ensure that the purse structure and stakes program serve these common goals.

Those who attended the meeting took away a lot. I am only sorry that more members did not choose to benefit from hearing such a well-informed group of decision-makers at such an important crossroads for our sport in the state.

It has been a long time since the state's breeding and racing industries have had the opportunity to do more than merely fight for survival. We have a bright future now and must be thinking of tomorrow.

Please take me up on my invitation to contribute your thoughts and insights at a time of active collaboration on decisions that will shape what can be a magnificent future.

Genting tabbed for Aqueduct VLTs

Approval of attorney general and state comptroller required before first-phase construction begins

As expected, the New York State Division of Lottery recommended on August 3 that Genting New York, the U.S. subsidiary of a Malaysian gaming company, be approved as the operator for 4,500 video lottery terminals (VLTs) at Aqueduct.

Genting, which already conducts New York gaming operations as co-owner of Monticello Casino and Raceway near Port Jervis, offered to pay a \$380-million upfront fee for the 30-year Aqueduct franchise and promised to have some betting machines in operation at the Queens track within six months of a final contract.

Still, some potential roadblocks remain in a selection process that has dragged on for nearly nine years. While Gov. David Paterson pledged to abide by the Lottery's choice, leaders of the New York Assembly and Senate had to evaluate the deal and sign off on it.

Genting cleared significant hurdles on August 10 and 11 when Senate Majority Conference Leader John L. Sampson (D-Brooklyn) and then Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver (D-Manhattan) accepted Lottery Director Gordon Medenica's recommendation. "Nothing is more important than creating jobs. The acceptance of Genting puts New York on the fast track to rebuild our local and state economy through sound economic development and immediate and long-term job creation," Sampson said.

Also adding his endorsement was Sen. Joseph Addabbo, whose Queens district includes Aqueduct.

"Throughout its application, Genting demonstrated the financial resources to bring real economic stability and good-paying jobs to the local community," he said. "Genting submitted a robust job creation plan, including a focused effort to engage local community involvement and minority- and women-owned businesses. Their commitment to buying from local suppliers and donating 1% of their total annual income to the community proves Genting will be a good partner to the local community and the state."

In his recommendation letter to Paterson, Medenica praised the Genting proposal, which was the only bidder to agree to all

of the Lottery's specifications in the memorandum of agreement. Two other bidders, Penn National Gaming Inc. and a consortium led by SL Green Realty Corp., were disqualified in July because they attempted to renegotiate terms of the memorandum.

"Genting's proposal was far superior, in concept, scope, detail, and execution, to any we have seen in previous rounds of evaluation," Medenica said in the letter. "It is well known that other bidders, and potential bidders, found the state's requirements too demanding to accept. They made the fatal assumption that the process was still open to maneuvering and negotiation."

"We acknowledge that the process was tough and the expectations were rigorous, but our requirements were crystal clear. For Genting to emerge from such a grueling process as a strong winner is a testament to the effort, skill, and intelligence of their team. Every aspect of their proposal demonstrated the highest standards of professionalism and respect."

The contract next will be reviewed by the attorney general and state comptroller. If approved, the Genting proposal offers a ray of hope for New York breeders; the New York Racing Association, which will be advanced operating funds until the machines begin generating funds for the track operator; and the deficit-ridden state budget.

"The community surrounding Aqueduct has expressed support for Genting's plans," said NYRA Chief Executive Officer Charles Hayward.

Officials of New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. and individual horsemen also were cautiously optimistic after the Lottery's recommendation of Genting was announced.

"The recommendation by the Lottery was a first step for us to move forward," said NYTBA Executive Director Jeffrey A. Cannizzo. "Right now the industry is in dire straits, so any good news is a positive reflection. Everyone should be looking to the future."

Purses in New York, already among the country's best, would

increase dramatically with expanded gaming, and earning potential has a significant effect on the value of New York-breds in the commercial marketplace.

Cannizzo described the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale on August 7-8 as a vital part of the state's breeding program. "Horses that move through that sale as yearlings, they're the upper echelon of the New York-bred yearlings, and it's highly important to have a commercial market for them," Cannizzo said.

"As they get closer to making the VLT decision, it gives people up here a lot of optimism," said Bayne Welker, Fasig-Tipton's vice president of sales. "VLTs will be very good news for New York breeders and racing in New York as a whole. Horses that come out of sales this year hopefully have a little more incentive attached to them than in the past."

While the quality of the preferred sale has increased significantly over the last decade, entries for the 2010 sale were down by more than one-quarter, which partly reflected the decline in the state's foal crop due to the Thoroughbred economy's recession and the long delays in new revenue from Aqueduct's VLTs.

After peaking at 2,209 in 2004, New York's foal crop dropped to 1,788 in 2009. Cannizzo projects another 25% to 30% drop in 2010. "Our growth was directly related to the 2001 legislation that authorized VLTs at Aqueduct. That being delayed year over year has had a direct negative effect on breeding in New York," he said.

Additionally, New York City Off-Track Betting Corp., which filed for bankruptcy protection last year, has not paid almost \$3-

million in owners and breeders awards. "Absolutely, that has had a negative effect on the integrity of the New York industry," Cannizzo said. "Every month that goes by, they owe the breeders a little over \$200,000, so we look forward to getting that resolved."

"But the real message is that there's more optimism now than there's ever been given the economic climate that New York state and the racing industry have been experiencing."

Consignors to the Saratoga sale voiced guarded optimism. "It's great that we finally got the announcement, but what I've told my clients was that we've had announcements like this before and nothing came from them," said New York-based consignor Harry Landry.

"After nine years of butting your head against the wall, you're not jumping up and down because someone says this. But I have attended most every rally, carried signs, and done the whole thing, so I'll be tickled to death if this is for real. ... I think by fall if they are moving forward and breaking ground, I think you'll see a whole new market for New York-breds."

Sue Vitro, manager of Stonebridge Farm in Schuylerville, said signs are positive that the latest push to get VLTs could be the real deal. "I think Genting is a good company who has proven they know what they're doing," Vitro said. "It's good they're not nitpicking over things. They're not worrying about a casino at Belmont [Park] or on Long Island. VLTs at Aqueduct is what we can do now, and they're trying to figure it out."

"It will make a big difference if it happens. The quality of racing will go up, and hopefully we won't be running \$10,000 claimers at Saratoga next year."—*Don Clippinger and Pete Denk*

Franny Freud retired after injury detected

New York-bred champion and Prioress Stakes (G1) winner Franny Freud was retired on August 5 due to a ligament injury.

The injury was discovered after a routine gallop that morning as she prepared to run in the Test Stakes (G1) two days later. The three-year-old Freud filly had been tabbed as the Test's 5-to-2 favorite.

"It's kind of shocking, but I'm glad we caught it before it could have developed into something worse," trainer John Terranova II said. "She galloped beautifully this morning, as usual. She never has anything wrong, but she had a slight amount of filling on the outside of her ankle. We took an ultrasound, and we saw she had damage to the [sesamoidean] ligaments."

Commonly known as the XYZ ligaments, the sesamoidean ligaments originate at the base of the sesamoids and attach to either the long or short pasterns. Injuries to them often are career-ending because they heal slowly and are prone to reinjury.

Bred in New York by Anthony Grey, Franny Freud was voted the 2009 New York-bred champion two-year-old filly and was among the leading performers in her division nationally. She won four of six starts last year, including three stakes. She won four of five starts this season, including the Beaumont

Stakes (G2) at Keeneland in April and Belmont's Prioress on July 4.

Racing for Paul Pompa Jr., Stephen Yarbrough, and Grey's Winter Park Partners, Franny Freud posted eight wins, including seven stakes wins, and two seconds from 11 career starts and earnings of \$686,029 in two seasons. She is out of the D'Accord mare Frankly Fran.

Migliore honored with equine advocate award

Richard Migliore was in second place aboard Honest Wildcat during a race on January 23 at Aqueduct when the four-year-old broke down in the stretch, throwing the veteran jockey. It was a spill that eventually would end Migliore's riding career.

Stunned and groggy from the fall, Migliore still had the presence of mind to look after his mount.

"When I came to, I saw that Honest Wildcat was trying to get up, and I could see that he was badly hurt," Migliore said. "I knew he'd try to get up and run down the track."

Crawling to Honest Wildcat, the veteran New York-based rider cradled the horse's head in his arms.

"I knew he couldn't stand if he couldn't get his head up, so I made sure to keep it down," he said.

Migliore's humane act was reported locally, and 3,000 miles away, Bo Derek took note.

Derek serves on the California Horse Racing Board and campaigns against horse slaughter. Equine Advocates honored her with the organization's Safe Home Equine Protection Award at its July 29 dinner in Saratoga Springs. Equine Advocates is a national not-for-profit equine protection organization based in Chatham, New York.

In agreeing to accept the award, Derek asked that Equine Advocates also honor a jockey, and she chose Migliore as the first recipient of a special commendation.

"Riders should get more credit and encouragement for doing the right thing with horses," Derek said. "I know that their actions have saved horses. They're on the horses every day, and they can feel when a horse isn't right."

"Jockeys deserve to be recognized for taking care of the horses."

Susan Wagner, president and founder of Equine Advocates, was immediately receptive.

"Richard Migliore is a kind, compassionate guy," she said. "He's in a class by himself, and it's a shame that his wonderful career was cut short."

Migliore was recognized for his "long and illustrious career as a jockey" and for his "concern and attention to the safety and humane treatment of the horses" he rode.

Migliore downplayed his actions.

"It was instinct," he said months after the incident. "I didn't do anything special."

Migliore retired this year when unable to return from his injuries. He won 4,450 races from 30,111 mounts who earned \$160,205,725 in purses. His 178 graded stakes victories include 25 Grade 1 wins.—Teresa Genaro

Median rises at Fasig-Tipton sale

With smaller catalog, buy-backs decline sharply; Tale of the Cat colt sells for \$140,000

Despite concerns over the national economy and the state of the Thoroughbred industry in New York and nationally, the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale ended on August 8 with a higher median price and a lower buy-back rate.

Fasig-Tipton reported 94 horses as sold from 142 offered during the two-night auction for total sales of \$3,676,000, a 15.6% decline in receipts from last year, when 198 horses went through the ring but only 107 sold. The median price rose 11.1% to \$30,000, while this year's buy-back rate of 33.8% was a significant improvement from 46% a year ago and the lowest for the New York-bred sale since 2002.

Average price declined 3.9% to \$39,106, and the number of horses that sold for six figures declined from ten last year to four this year.

"I don't think the game is easy, but this was by and large a better sale than it was a year ago," Fasig-Tipton Chairman Walt Robertson said. "A higher percentage of horses sold, the median was up, and the average was very similar. And similar is good in these days and times. People wanted horses these last two days."

Repole Stable was the leading buyer with six purchases for \$322,000, including \$140,000 for the sale-topping Tale of the Cat colt. Bred by Berkshire Stud, the sale topper is out of the unraced Fusaichi Pegasus mare Regard.

Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud, agent, consigned the colt and organized the pinhooking partnership that bought him for \$60,000 at the 2009 Keeneland November breeding stock sale.

The colt's half brother Highest Regards, by Anabaa, was an impressive debut winner at Belmont Park on June 24, and that boosted the sale topper's value at auction. Bloodstock agent and pinhooker J. J. Crupi signed the ticket for the colt on behalf of Repole.

"He is a grand, good-looking horse that had everything in the right place, and he looked like a runner," Crupi said. "We liked the Tale of the Cat horse to start with, but I do business with Todd Pletcher, and he has the two-year-old Highest Regards, and Todd said he could really run, so that turned us onto this horse."

The Tale of the Cat colt will go to Repole's racing stable. Crupi also signed for the sale's top-priced filly, going to \$105,000 for an Afleet Alex filly out of Try N Sue, by Sir Harry Lewis. Avandelle Farm, agent, consigned the filly.

Crupi said he will point her for the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale of selected two-year-olds in training.

"She just was a gorgeous, gorgeous filly," Crupi said. "Afleet Alex, I think, is on the move right now and is going to be a good stallion, and she just fit my program."

Speightstown was the leading sire by average price (minimum two sold) with two sold for an average of \$79,500. Scat Daddy led the first-crop sires with two yearlings sold for an average of \$73,500.

Speightstown was the sire of a filly out of Shot Gun Favorite, by Eltish, who sold for \$100,000. Paramount Sales, which sold the filly as agent, was the leading consignor by total sales with 19 sold from 21 offered for \$792,000.

Although the second session had a higher buy-back rate than

the Saturday-evening opener, 42.6% compared with 25.7% on August 7, it also had the higher average, \$45,333 for 39 yearlings reported as sold from 68 offered, and a \$35,000 median. The Saturday session averaged \$34,691 for 55 yearlings sold and a \$27,000 median.

Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, representing West Point Thoroughbreds, bought the first session's highest-priced yearling when he went to \$100,000 for a colt from the first crop of Half Ours.

"That's the first Half Ours that resembled his father that I've seen. He actually had a little more to him than his father," said Chace, who bought Half Ours for \$625,000 at the 2004 Keeneland September yearling sale on behalf of Barry Schwartz and Aaron and Marie Jones.

Thorndale Farm, agent, consigned the Half Ours colt, whom it co-bred out of Dixie Lyrics, by Dixie Union. "It might look expensive tonight, but I think in the long run it's going to look like a good buy," said Thorndale's Jonathan Thorne, who foaled and raised the colt at his Millbrook farm.

Destined to be a lobbyist

From a prominent political family, Chris Del Giudice accumulated experience on Assembly staff

By birth, by temperament, and by experience, Christopher J. Del Giudice was all but destined to be a lobbyist. He is the son of a powerful Democratic political operative, caught the political bug early, and spent 15 years working in the New York Assembly.

Now five years into his career as a lobbyist, Del Giudice has become the point person for New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. in the halls of the state Capitol in Albany. The committees for which he worked while on the Assembly's central staff are key venues for New York breeders, as well.

The Dutchess County resident began his duties for the NYTB in April, in the midst of the crisis over the New York City Off-Track Betting Corp., and he has been involved in both the effort to install video lottery terminals (VLTs) at Aqueduct and with legislation to improve the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund.

To say that Del Giudice was born into politics is something of an understatement. His father is Michael Del Giudice, who served as secretary to Gov. Mario M. Cuomo after being deputy secretary to Gov. Hugh L. Carey. He left government service after the Cuomo administration for the public sector, becoming general partner of Lazard Freres & Co. and holding other positions in the financial world. He was a founder of Rockland Capital Management and serves as its chairman. The elder Del Giudice also has been a senior adviser to Andrew Cuomo, the Democratic candidate for governor.

Chris Del Giudice, 42, grew up in Manhasset on Long Island and caught the political bug while in school. After completing college, he went to work for the Assembly, where he provided staff services to the Environmental Conservation, Transportation, Small Business, and Tourism, Arts, and Sports Development Committees.

Several of those committees have a direct impact on New York breeders, and just as important are the contacts that Del Giudice made during his years on the Assembly staff.

"People that I started working with in their 20s are now in positions in the governor's office and the Assembly," he said.

Indeed, access to governmental leaders is the keystone of any lobbyist's success, and Del Giudice has been making the case for New York breeders in the Capitol, located across State Street from the offices of his current employer, Davidoff Malito & Hutcher.

Despite his strong Democratic roots, Del Giudice emphasized that the combination law and lobbying firm is by no means a one-party pony.

"It is a bipartisan firm," he said. "We have good ties to both Republicans and Democrats." The bipartisanship is especially important in the closely divided Senate.

Del Giudice is able to offer decidedly nonpartisan positions in support of the New York Thoroughbred breeding industry. His strongest argument is that the breeding industry preserves valu-

able open space and thus is a priceless environmental asset.

He also stresses the connection between the breeders and New York's racetracks.

"We're the lifeblood of the racing industry," he said. Other points of emphasis are tax revenues and employment that the breeding industry provide.

The connection between New York's breeders and the racing industry is especially important now that the state Division of Lottery has recommended Genting New York to operate 4,500 VLTs at Aqueduct. Getting the VLTs up and running would have immediate benefits for both breeders and the New York Racing Association.

"It would help NYRA pretty quickly," Del Giudice said.

Moving quickly also is a priority because of NYRA's precarious finances, even after the state advanced the racing franchise a \$25-million line of credit.

"We don't want Belmont [Park], Saratoga [Race Course], and Aqueduct not to have their meets," he said. "We are concerned for the long-term viability of NYRA."

Del Giudice also said he is keeping a close watch on the New York City OTB situation.

After Meyer "Sandy" Frucher's resignation as chairman of the bankrupt OTB operation in early June, Gov. David Paterson appointed his secretary, Lawrence S. Schwartz, to fill the chairmanship. Del Giudice said he was uncertain whether moving New York City OTB into the governor's office would be helpful in resolving the many issues surrounding the state-run entity, which has continued operations while in Chapter 9 bankruptcy proceedings.

On August 18, the Legislature sent a bill that would protect payments to the Breeding and Development Fund to be signed by Paterson, who has ten days to review the bill and sign it.

The NYTB sent comments to the governor's office in support of the bill, which would authorize the Breeding and Development Fund to raise the maximum percentage of revenues allotted to breeder awards to 65% from 50%.

The legislation, which received overwhelming support in both the Senate and Assembly, requires that revenues mandated for the Breeding and Development Fund must be forwarded to it on a quarterly basis. The fund receives 0.5% of straight, multiple-horse, and exotic wagers and 3% of super-exotics.

That portion of the legislation was partly a response to New York City OTB's decision to withhold mandated payments and to renege on a pledge to make timely payments to all creditors, including the breeding fund.

"It's all technical," Del Giudice said of the legislation, "and we hope it works out."

Dual purpose

New York farm owner, consignor Shelli expands despite nationwide economic woes

To hear Chris Shelli tell it, his story is no different from those of thousands of others who make their living in the Thoroughbred industry.

Growing up in Latham, Shelli had an uncle with a farm outside Saratoga Springs and spent untold hours there, watching some of the nation's best Thoroughbreds racing at nearby Saratoga Race Course.

Despite an intense passion for the equine athletes, he set out after high school for the University of Denver to pursue a degree in finance. In college, he began breaking and training polo horses and before long took up playing competitively, which rekindled his desire to build a career around working with horses.

"I absolutely fell in love with the industry when I was young," said Shelli, now 33 and owner of Fort Christopher's Thoroughbreds LLC in Fort Edward, approximately 18 miles from Saratoga Springs. "But when I left for Denver, I knew I was going to be a finance major and come back and work on Wall Street. It's funny how things turn out."

Degree in hand, Shelli headed back east in 2001 but did not end up in Manhattan's financial district. His father, Ronald, had been diagnosed with leukemia, a cancer of the blood or bone marrow for which there are treatments but no cure, and Shelli was not sure what to do with his future.

"I was in shock at first because the first exposure I had to anything like leukemia was through my father," he said. "I didn't know whether I should head back to New York to be with my father because of his health problems or try to go ahead and pursue my own career. That was the internal challenge."

Shelli did not go back to New York and landed instead in Central Kentucky, where he began to get his feet wet in the industry, working at some of the Keeneland sales and for a brief period at Lane's End before moving back to New York and starting Fort Christopher's Thoroughbreds in 2003.

"I leased a small farm and began boarding broodmares, foaling mares, and prepping yearlings for the sales," he said. "It wasn't a large operation, but it was a great transition because several of the people I met in Lexington sent broodmares up and helped support us from the very beginning."

"We started to specialize in Kentucky-sired New York-breds

and started to build a little bit of momentum that way with people wanting to participate in the New York breeder award programs."

His father's constant battle with the disease remained in the forefront of his mind as the business continued to prosper. In 2009, despite a crippling economic downturn that saw many farms close their doors, Shelli purchased 70 acres and built a brand-new facility, expanding his business to include bloodstock consultation, buying and consigning at sales, and managing racing and pinhooking partnerships.

"It just evolved over time, which I think was important because we didn't try to do too much too soon," he said.

"The current state of the Thoroughbred industry is real and unfortunately not what anyone wants. The economy negatively impacted us, to be certain, but we managed through the rough times to build a new state-of-the-art facility and maintain our current position, which is more

than we could have hoped for."

Ian Mulholland of First Class Thoroughbreds has been a Fort Christopher's client for about four years and said he continues to be impressed by Shelli's drive and work ethic.

"He pays so much attention to detail and is very professional," Mulholland said.


Shelli also is using his ties in the industry and the Saratoga Springs racing community to help raise money for cancer research as he promotes awareness of the disease.

"We plan to have several events before the end of the year, a few sponsored polo matches and some other opportunities that we hope will bring out people and sponsors that want to make a difference," he said.

"As you grow older, you realize what is important and that it's not all about money or success. I hope this is a way I can honor my father while at the same time doing what I can do to help fight the disease. Cancer has affected a lot of people and we want those people to come out, have some fun, and realize there are others who know exactly what they have been through and are here to help however we can."

Getting very Serious on the turf

Get Serious takes Oceanport;
champions Canadian Ballet and Ibboeye score stakes wins

Get Serious' long-running love affair with Monmouth Park is well documented. The New York-bred City Zip gelding debuted there as a three-year-old in 2007, and he scored his first victory at the New Jersey track in his second career start that summer.

Take him away from the northern Jersey shore, and the gelding is not quite so fearsome. Show him Monmouth's main track and especially the turf course, however, and he is gangbusters. He is out there winging it on the lead and playing "catch me if you can." Often, his opponents cannot get past him.

"He just loves the track and loves to win," said John H. Forbes, the veteran Monmouth horseman who trains him.

Get Serious extended his mastery of the Oceanport track's turf course with his second straight victory in the \$200,000 Oceanport Stakes (G3) on August 1. It was his seventh stakes victory, and six of them have been at Monmouth. (The other was at the Meadowlands.) He has three graded stakes wins, and all but one of them have been on Monmouth's turf course. (The 2009 Oceanport was moved from turf to the sloppy main track.)

His preference for Monmouth is so strong that Forbes finds little reason to run him anywhere else. Get Serious won four stakes races there last year, and he began his 2010 season with a front-running neck victory in an optional claiming race on May 31. The six-year-old out of Java Gal, by Java Gold, followed with a 1¼-length victory in the \$255,000 Monmouth Stakes (G3) on June 12.

Get Serious appears to be at his best between a mile and 1½ miles, the distance of the Monmouth, but Forbes took a chance by starting him in the 1⅜-mile United Nations Stakes (G1) on July 3. He almost pulled it off, leading by a half-length at the furlong pole before tiring to finish fifth, beaten 3¼ lengths.

Forbes backed him up to 1⅙ miles for the Oceanport, and Get Serious was able to survive constant pressure to win by a neck.

The keys to Get Serious' victory were his tenacity and a savvy ride by Pablo Fragoso, his regular jockey for 16 consecutive starts over the previous two years.

Get Serious has serious front-end speed, but he also is capable of going along at a somnolent canter. The even-money favorite in the Oceanport, Get Serious lulled his six opponents with a :25.28 first quarter-mile while pressed by Roman Tiger, who had finished second behind him in the Monmouth Stakes.

The pacesetter then accomplished a rarity: He ran each quarter-mile in successively faster times, with the final sixteenth roughly equal to the pace of the final quarter. Get Serious and Fragoso kept the half-mile split well under control with a :24.35 quarter,

while Roman Tiger and Joe Bravo were only a head behind them. Meanwhile, Bernard Weill's Violon Sacre was rank as he was restrained off the sluggish pace.

Get Serious turned up the heat in the third quarter-mile, completing it in :22.86 for six furlongs in 1:12.49. Roman Tiger still was lapped on the leader but would back up as the field entered the stretch.

Violon Sacre and jockey Jose Lezcano then launched a serious attack and drew even with Get Serious before the furlong pole, but Get Serious dug in and maintained a neck advantage to the finish line. After a :22.73 fourth quarter-mile and a :05.71 final sixteenth, Get Serious won in 1:40.93. "In the stretch, I was probably as nervous as I've ever been with this horse, but he just digs in," Forbes said.

Bred by Morgan's Ford Farm, Get Serious was foaled at Galagher's Stud. He is owned by James M. Dinan, Jacques J. Moore, and Forbes' Phantom House Farm. The Oceanport was his 12th victory from 29 starts and raised his career earnings to \$880,691.

Canadian Ballet rebounds

Obviously NY Stable's Canadian Ballet obviously is back.

Last year, the City Zip mare won three New York-bred titles, but the current season had been less than spectacular until trainer Linda Rice shipped her to Penn National Race Course for the \$100,000 Jenny Wade Handicap on July 30.

Favored at 11-to-10 against six fillies and mares in the five-furlong sprint on Penn National's firm turf course, Canadian Ballet fired out of the outside post position and blasted through the first quarter-mile in :21.60. Ridden by Stewart Elliott, she entered the stretch with a clear lead and led Out Post by a half-length at the furlong pole, after a half-mile in :43.46.

Out Post, ridden by Chuckie Lopez, steadily cut into the margin, but Canadian Ballet held on to win by a neck in :55.64.

Bred by Gus Schoenborn Jr., the five-year-old mare out of Canadian Flagship, by Northern Flagship, collected her eighth victory in 20 starts and increased her career earnings to \$575,702.

Her three stakes victories last year included the \$200,000 Turf Amazon Handicap at Philadelphia Park, and she ran a respectable fifth, beaten four lengths by California Flag, in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Santa Anita Park. At year end, she was voted New York-bred championships as older female, turf female, and female sprinter.

Ibboeye takes Derby

Ibboeye's rampage through the New York-bred ranks suffered a modest setback on June 20 when he finished third to Friend Or Foe in Belmont Park's Mike Lee Stakes, in which he was the 11-to-10 favorite. But last year's New York champion two-year-old male bounced back with a solid half-length victory in the New York Derby at Finger Lakes racetrack on July 17.

Anstu Stables' Medallist colt has never been beaten at the west-

ern New York track—he won two stakes, the Aspirant Stakes and the New York Breeders' Futurity, there last year—and bettors made him the 3-to-5 favorite in a field of six for the second leg of the series for New York-bred three-year-olds.

Ibboeye was the only member of the Mike Lee field to start in the New York Derby, and he picked up a new jockey, Mike Luzzi, who consulted with regular rider John Velazquez before making the trip to Finger Lakes for trainer Todd Pletcher. Francis J. Paolangel's Johannesburg Smile set a comfortable early pace, while Ibboeye stalked under Luzzi.

Ibboeye attacked the two leaders, Johannesburg Smile and Shrewd One, from the outside in the stretch and wore them down inside the furlong pole. Flying Zee Stable's Shrewd One took the second spot, three lengths clear of Johannesburg Smile.

Bred by Patricia S. Purdy, D.D.S., out of the stakes-producing Pentelicus mare Expect Excellence, Ibboeye has won six of 12 starts and \$595,258. Anstu purchased him for \$120,000 from the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale.

race are similar to those used by Equibase: Alw—allowance; Hcp—overnight handicap; names of stakes races are spelled out, with the grade of the race, when applicable, in parentheses. Class of race is followed by the distance of the race, expressed in furlongs and fractions of furlongs, followed by first-place money earned by the winner.

Sires represented by their first foals to race in 2010 are preceded by the symbol ♦.

Breeding Rules

To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

Resident Mares: Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back required.

Non-Resident Mares: Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.

New York State Breeding and Development Fund NY-Breds Award Program

Breeder, owner, and stallion owner awards are based on purse money earned (1st through 3rd) while competing in pari-mutuel races run in New York state.

BREEDER AWARDS

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$6,300,452 to breeders of registered New York-breds. A breeder is the owner of the mare at the time the mare foals in the state of New York. Breeder awards are determined by covering stallion. If the New York-bred is by a registered New York-based stallion, the award is up to 20% of the purse earned for a first-place finish and up to 10% for a second- or third-place finish.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% for a first-place finish and up to 5% for a second- or third-place finish. All breeder awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

STALLION OWNER AWARDS

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund distributed \$2,370,035 in stallion owner awards. Stallion owner awards are paid to owners of registered New York-based covering stallions (at time of conception) at up to 7% of earned purses from 1st through 3rd positions. All stallion owner awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

OPEN OWNER AWARDS

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$1,107,667 to owners of registered New York-breds who earned purse money in open-company races. Owner awards for registered New York-breds sired by a registered New York-based stallion is up to 20% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward, with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

NEW YORK-BRED RACES

More than 52 stakes races exclusively for registered New York-breds are run at New York Racing Association racetracks (Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course) and Finger Lakes racetrack with total purses worth nearly \$5-million. In 2009, more than 900 overnight races exclusively for registered New York-breds were held at the four New York racetracks.
